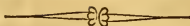

The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Is a voluntary Association embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the Churches.

Their meeting is held in Boston, on the last Wednesday in May, annually, at 5 o'clock, P. M. and the following day. After transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent Widows of Congregational clergymen.

The Officers of the Convention are—

Rev. N. Adams, of Boston, Scribe of the Convention.

Rev. Samuel K. Lothrop, of Boston, Treasurer.

Rev. Parsons Cooke, of Lynn, 1st Preacher.

Rev. Ezra S. Gannett, D. D., of Boston, 2d Preacher.

For the purpose of investigating cases of necessity, and of application for the charity of the Convention, there are two standing Committees; a Central Committee, chosen centrally, and a Reporting Committee, whose members reside in different parts of the State. The Reporting Committee are required, each year, to investigate the circumstances of the objects of this charity, whether already on the list, or needing, or applying the first time for aid, and make a particular statement, to the Central Committee, directed to the Scribe of the Convention, at least one week before the meeting of the Convention. Should any member neglect so to do for two successive years, his place in the Reporting Committee shall be vacated. The Central Committee receive from the members of the Reporting Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of subjects of the charity of the Convention, and, having considered the same, are to judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the first day of their meeting, annually.

The statements of the members of the Reporting Committee are expected to contain answers to the following questions—

1. What is her age?
2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of their children?
3. What is a fair estimate of her property?
4. What is her ability to help herself?

5. What connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?

6. What is her income?

7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable that she should have aid this year?

MASSACHUSETTS MILITIA.

[Corrected at Office of Adjutant General, to December 1, 1846.]

The Militia of Massachusetts is divided into two classes, the Active and Enrolled—the latter consists of all “able bodied white male citizens, of the age of eighteen years, and under that of forty-five, excepting persons enlisted into volunteer companies, and persons exempted by law, or incapacitated by physical and other causes.” (See Sec. 5, Militia Law.) The whole number enrolled in 1846, as appears from the Returns of the Assessors of cities and towns, (whose duty it is to make such returns,) is 90,349.

The Active Militia consists of Volunteers, who are paid a per diem allowance when on duty, (amounting, in the whole, to \$6 per annum, each man.) They consist, by the Brigade Returns of 1846, of 5,490 men. These are organized into three Divisions, and six Brigades, embracing two Divisionary Corps of Cadets, one troop of Cavalry, five Regiments, and three “annexed” Companies of Artillery, and nine Regiments of Light Infantry.

In *Maine*, at Portland, 1st of May and 1st of Oct.

SECOND CIRCUIT.

In *Connecticut*, at New Haven, on the 4th Tuesday in April ; and at Hartford, on the 3d Tuesday in September.

In *Vermont*, at Windsor, on the 21st day of May ; and at Rutland, on the 3d of October.

In *New York*, last Monday in February, 1st Monday in April, and 3d Monday in October ; in Albany, 3d Tuesday in October, and 3d Tuesday in May ; in Canandaigua, Tuesday next after 3d Monday in June.

DISTRICT COURTS.

In *Maine*, at Portland, the 1st Tuesday in February and December ; and at Wiscasset, 1st Tuesday of September ; and at Bangor, 4th Tuesday in June.

In *New Hampshire*, at Portsmouth, 3d Tues. in March and September ; and at Exeter, 3d in June and Dec.

In *Vermont*, at Rutland, 6th of October ; and at Windsor, 24th of May.

In *Massachusetts*, at Boston, 3d Tuesday in March, and 4th of June, 2d in September, and 1st in December.

In *Rhode Island*, at Newport, 2d Tues. in May, and 3d in Oct. ; at Providence, 1st Tues. in Aug. and Feb.

In *Connecticut*, at New Haven, 4th Tues. in Feb. and Aug. ; at Hartford, 4th Tuesday in May and Nov.

AN ACT

Reducing the Duty on Imports, and for other Purposes.

ALPHABETICALLY ARRANGED IN PARAGRAPHS.

Passed July 30th, 1846.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That from and after the first day of December next, in lieu of the duties heretofore imposed by law on the articles hereinafter mentioned, and on such as may now be exempt from duty, there shall be levied, collected and paid on the goods, wares and merchandise herein enumerated and provided for, imported from foreign countries, the following rates of duty—that is to say,

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule A, a duty of 100 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule B, a duty of 40 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule C, a duty of 30 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule D, a duty of 25 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule E, a duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule F, a duty of 15 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule G, a duty of 10 per cent. ad valorem.

On goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule H, a duty of 5 per cent. ad valorem.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That from and after the first day of December next, the goods, wares and merchandise mentioned in Schedule I, shall be exempt from duty.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted,* That from and after the first day of December next, there shall be levied, collected and paid on all goods, wares and merchandise imported from foreign countries, and not specially provided for in this act, a duty of twenty per centum ad valorem.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted,* That in all cases in which the invoice or entry shall not contain the weight or quantity or measure of goods, wares or merchandise now weighed or measured, or gauged, the same shall be weighed, gauged, or measured, at the expense of the owner, agent or consignee.

SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted,* That from and after the first day of December next, in lieu of the bounty heretofore authorized by law, to be paid on the exportation of pickled fish of the fisheries of the United States, there shall be allowed, on the exportation thereof, if cured with foreign salt, a draw-back equal in amount to the duty paid on the salt, and no more, to be ascertained under such regulations as may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury.

SEC. 6. *And be it further enacted*, That all goods, wares and merchandise imported after the passage of this act, and which may be in the public stores on the second day of December next, shall be subject to no other duty upon the entry thereof, than if the same were imported respectively after that day.

SEC. 7. *And be it further enacted*, That the twelfth section of the act, entitled "An Act to provide revenue from imports, and to change and modify existing laws imposing duties on imports, and for other purposes," approved August 30, 1842. shall be, and the same is hereby, so far modified, that all goods imported from this side the Cape of Good Hope or Cape Horn, may remain in the public stores for the space of one year, instead of the term of sixty days, prescribed in the said section; and that all goods imported from beyond the Cape of Good Hope or Cape Horn, may remain in the public stores one year, instead of the term of ninety days, prescribed in the said section.

SEC. 8. *And be it further enacted*, That it shall be lawful for the owner consignee or agent, of imports which have been actually purchased, on entry of the same, to make such addition in the entry to the cost or value given in the invoice, as in his opinion may raise the same to the true market value of such imports in the principal markets of the country whence the importation shall have been made, or in which the goods imported shall have been originally manufactured or produced, as the case may be; and to add thereto all costs and charges which, under existing laws, would form part of the true value at the port where the same may be entered, upon which the duties should be assessed. And it shall be the duty of the collector, within whose district the same may be imported or entered, to cause the dutiable value of such imports to be appraised, estimated and ascertained, in accordance with the provisions of existing laws; and if the appraised value thereof shall exceed by ten per centum or more, the value so declared on the entry, then, in addition to the duties imposed by law on the same, there shall be levied, collected and paid, a duty of 20 per centum ad valorem, on such appraised value: provided, nevertheless, that under no circumstances shall the duty be assessed upon an amount less than the invoice value, any law of Congress to the contrary, notwithstanding.

SEC. 9. *And be it further enacted*, That the deputies of any collector, naval officer or surveyor, and the clerks employed by any collector, naval officer, surveyor, or appraiser, who are not by existing laws required to be sworn, shall, before entering upon their respective duties, or, if already employed, before continuing in the discharge thereof, take and subscribe an oath or affirmation faithfully and diligently to perform such duties, and to use their best endeavors to prevent and detect frauds upon the revenue of the United States, which oath or affirmation shall be administered by the collector of the port or district where the said deputies or clerks may be employed, and shall be of a form to be prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury.

SEC. 10. *And be it further enacted*, That no officer or other person connected with the navy of the United States, shall, under any pretence, import in any ship or vessel of the United States, any goods, wares or merchandise, liable to the payment of any duty.

SEC. 11. *And be it further enacted*, That all acts and part of acts repugnant to the provisions of this act be, and the same is hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE A.—(100 PER CENT.)

Brandy and other spirits distilled from grain, or other materials.

Cordials, absynthe, arrack, curacoa, kirschenwasser, liqueurs, marchino, ratafia, and all other spirituous beverages of a similar character.

SCHEDULE B.—(40 PER CENT.)

Alabaster and spar ornaments. almonds. anchovies, Sardines, and all other fish preserved in oil. camphor refined. cassia. cloves. composition tops for tables. or other articles of furniture. comfits. currants.

Dates.

Figs.

Ginger root, dried or green. glass cut.

Mace. manufactures of cedar wood, granadilla, ebony, mahogany, rosewood, and satin wood.

Nutmegs.

Pimento. prepared vegetables meats, poultry and game, sealed or enclosed in cans, or otherwise prunes.

Raisins.

Sweetmeats, or fruits preserved in sugar, brandy or molasses. scagliola tops for tables, or other articles of furniture. segars, snuff, paper segars, and all other manufactures of tobacco.

Wines. Bergundy, champaigne, claret, Madeira, port, sherry, and all other wines and imitations of wines.

SCHEDULE C.—(30 PER CENT.)

Ale, beer and porter, in casks or bottles. argentine, alabatta, or German silver, manufactured or unmanufactured. articles emproidered with gold, silver or other metal. articles worn by men, women, or children, of whatever material composed, made up, or made wholly or in part, by hand. asses' skins.

Balsams, cosmetics, essences, extracts, pastes, perfumes, and tinctures, used either for the toilet or for medicinal purposes. baskets, and all other articles composed of

grass, osier, palm-leaf, straw, whale-bone, or willow, not otherwise provided for. bay rum. beads of amber, composition or wax, and all other beads. benzoates. Bologna sausages. bracelets, braids, chains, curls or ringlets, composed of hair, or of which hair is a component part. braces, suspenders, webbing, or other fabrics, composed wholly or in part of India rubber, not otherwise provided for. brooms and brushes of all kinds.

Cameons, real and imitation, and mosaics, real and imitation, when set in gold, silver or other metal. canes and sticks for walking, finished or unfinished. capers, pickles and sauces of all kinds, not otherwise provided for. caps, hats, muffs and tippets of fur, and all other manufactures of fur, or of which fur shall be a component material. caps, gloves, leggins, mits, socks, stockings, wove shirts and drawers and all similar articles made on frames, worn by men, women or children, and not otherwise provided for. card cases, pocket books, shell boxes, souvenirs, and all similar articles, of whatever material composed. carpets, carpeting, hearth rugs, bedsides, and other portions of carpeting, being either Aubusson, Brussels, ingrain, Saxony, Turkey, Venetian, Wilton, or any other similar fabric. carriages, and parts of carriages. cayenne pepper. cheese. cinnamon. clocks and parts of clocks. clothing, ready made, and wearing apparel of every description, of whatever material composed, made up or manufactured wholly or in part by the tailor, sempstress, or manufacturer. coach and harness furniture of all kinds. coal, coke and culm of coal. combs of all kinds. compositions of glass or paste, when set. confectionary of all kinds not otherwise provided for. coral, cut or manufactured. corks. cotton cords, gimps and galloons. court plaster. crayons of all kinds. cutlery of all kinds.

Diamonds, gems, pearls, rubies, and other precious stones, and imitations of precious stones, when set in gold, silver, or other metal. dolls, and toys of all kinds.

Earthen, China and stoneware, and all other wares composed of earthy or mineral substances not otherwise provided for. epaulets, galloons, laces, knots, stars, tassels, tresses, and wings of gold, silver or other metal.

Fans and fire screens of every description, of whatever material composed. feathers and flowers, artificial or ornamental, and parts thereof, of whatever material composed. fire crackers. flats, braids, plaits, sparterre, and willow squares, used for making hats or bonnets. frames and sticks for umbrellas, parasols and sunshades, finished or unfinished, furniture, cabinet and household.

Ginger, ground. glass, coloured, stained or painted. glass crystals for watches. glasses or pebbles for spectacles. glass tumblers, plain, moulded or pressed, not cut or printed. paintings on glass. porcelain glass grapes. gum benzoin, or Benjamin.

Household effects, old and in use, of persons or families from foreign countries, if used abroad by them, and not intended for any other person or persons, or for sale.

Models of inventions and other improvements in the arts; provided, That no article or articles shall be deemed a model or improvement which can be fitted for use.

Oakum, oil, spermacetti, whale, and other fish, of American fisheries, and all other articles the produce of such fisheries.

Paintings and statuary, the production of American artists residing abroad, and all other paintings and statuary; provided, The same be imported in good faith as objects of taste, and not of merchandise. personal and household effects (not merchandise) of citizens of the United States dying abroad. plaster of Paris, unground. platina, unmanufactured.

Sheathing copper, but no copper to be considered such, and admitted free, except in sheets forty-eight inches long and fourteen inches wide, and weighing from fourteen to thirty-four ounces the square foot. sheathing metal. specimens of natural history, mineralogy or botany.

Trees, shrubs, bulbs, plants, and roots, not otherwise provided for.

Wearing apparel in actual use, and other personal effects not merchandise, professional books, implements, instruments, and tools of trade, occupation or employment of persons arriving in the United States; provided, that this exemption shall not be construed to include machinery or other articles imported for use in any manufacturing establishment, or for sale.

The Tariff passed the House of Representatives on the 3d of July, by a vote of 114 to 95, and on the 23th it passed the Senate, by a vote of 28 to 27.

EXTRACT FROM THE SUB-TREASURY LAW.

Be it further enacted, That on the first day of January, in the year 1847, and thereafter, all duties, taxes, sales of public lands, debts, and sums of money accruing or becoming due to the United States, and also all sums due for postages, or otherwise, to the General Post Office Department, shall be paid in gold and silver coin only.

And be it further enacted, That on the first day of April, 1847, and thereafter, every officer or agent engaged in making disbursements on account of the United States, or of the General Post Office, shall make all payments in gold

and silver coin only ; and any receiving or disbursing officer or agent who shall neglect, evade, or violate the provisions of this and the last preceding section of this act, shall, by the Secretary of the Treasury, be immediately reported to the President of the United States, with the facts of such neglect, evasion, or violation ; and also to Congress if in session : and if not in session, at the commencement of its session next after the violation takes place.

WAREHOUSE SYSTEM.

Duties are to be paid in cash. If they are not paid within the time allowed by law, or if the goods are entered for warehousing, the goods may then be deposited in the public stores, or in stores agreed upon by the collector and importer, the stores to be secured as required by the act of April 20, 1818;—to lie there at the owner's risk, and subject at all times to his order, on the payment of duties and expenses, and to be secured by bond with surety for double the amount of duties. The goods shall not be withdrawn in less quantity than an entire package, cask, bale, or box, or if in bulk, not less than one ton. They may be re-shipped without payment of duties, if good security, as now required in the case of drawback, be given that they shall be landed out of the United States. Goods remaining in store more than one year shall be appraised and sold at public auction, and the proceeds, after deducting duties, expenses, &c., shall be paid to the owner, or placed in the Treasury, subject to his order.

Goods of a perishable nature, gunpowder, fire crackers, and explosive substances, shall not be warehoused. Warehoused goods may be withdrawn and sent to another port of entry, due security being given, under the restrictions of the act of March 2, 1799 ; but the original term of one year allowed for warehousing goods shall in no way be extended. If any such goods are fraudulently concealed or removed from the warehouses, they shall be forfeited to the United States, and persons guilty of the act shall be punished as for smuggling ; if the owner fraudulently gain access to them, except in presence of the proper officer, he shall be fined \$1,000; any one altering the marks on the goods shall be fined \$500. The collectors shall make quarterly returns of the kind and amount of goods warehoused, which the Secretary of the Treasury shall publish in the Washington papers.—*Am. Alm.*

THE OREGON TREATY.

The Convention between the United States of America and Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, (concluded at Washington the 15th of June, 1846.)

ART. 1.—From the point on the 49th parallel of North latitude, where the boundary laid down in existing treaties and conventions between Great Britain and the United States terminates, the line of boundary between the territories of Her British Majesty and those of the United States shall be continued Westward along the 49th parallel of North latitude to the middle of the channel which separates the Continent from Vancouver's Island, and thence Southerly through the middle of the said channel, and of Fuca Straits, to the Pacific Ocean; provided, however, that the navigation of the said channel and straits, south of the 49th parallel of North latitude, remain free and open to both parties.

ART. 2.—From the point at which the 49th parallel of North latitude shall be found to intersect the great Northern branch of the Columbia river, the navigation of the said branch shall be free and open to the Hudson's Bay Company, and to all British subjects trading with the same, to the point where the said branch meets the main stream of the Columbia, and thence down the said main stream to the ocean, with free access into and through the said river or rivers, it being understood that all the usual portages along the line thus described, shall in like manner be free and open. In navigating the said river or rivers, British subjects, with their goods and produce, shall be treated on the same footing as citizens of the United States; it being, however, always understood that nothing in this article shall be construed as preventing, or intended to prevent, the Government of the United States from making any regulations respecting the navigation of the said river or rivers, not inconsistent with the present treaty.

ART. 3.—In the future appropriations of the territory south of the 49th parallel of North latitude, as provided in the first Article of this Treaty, the possessory rights of the Hudson's Bay Company, and of all British subjects who may be already in the occupation of land or other property lawfully acquired within the said Territory shall be respected.

ART. 4.—The farms, lands, and other property of every description, belonging to the Puget's Sound Agricultural Company on the north side of the Columbia river, shall be confirmed to the said Company. In case, however, the situation of those farms and lands should be considered by the United States to be of public and political importance, and the United States Government should signify a desire to obtain possession of the whole or of any part thereof, the property so required shall be transferred to the said Government at a proper valuation to be agreed upon between the parties.

END OF SLAVERY IN MASSACHUSETTS.

In 1781 a bill was found against a white man for assaulting a black. It was tried before the Supreme Court in 1783. The defence was that the black was a slave. The Court and Jury held that under the Clause in the Declaration of Rights, that "all men are born free and equal," &c., there could be no legal slavery in Massachusetts. The master was convicted and fined forty shillings, and thus ended slavery in Massachusetts.

MEXICAN REVOLUTIONS.

The Spanish General, Fernando Cortez, discovered Mexico in 1519, when he landed and founded the city of Vera Cruz, after which he penetrated into the interior, and in 1521, after the death of Montezuma, the whole country fell into the hands of the Spaniards. Cortez governed the country as Captain General until 1535, when a Viceroy was appointed in his place. Mexico continued a Spanish Colony for nearly three centuries. In 1810 an insurrection broke out, which resulted in its independence in 1813, and was governed by Viceroys until 1821, when

Iturbide was proclaimed Emperor. Being opposed, he abdicated and departed for Europe. In 1824, he returned and was shot as soon as he landed. The form of government changed, and

Gen. Victoria, the first President, was elected in 1824, with *Gen. Bravo* as Vice President, who denounced *Victoria*, but was beaten, surrendered and banished.

Gen. Pedraza was elected April, 1828, over his opponent, *Gen. Guerrero*, who used violence to displace him; he was aided by a force with *Santa Anna* at its head, who was defeated, and made his escape. In 1828, a mob headed by ex-Marquis *Cadena* seized the government, *Pedraza* fled, and

Guerrero was declared elected, with *Bustamente* for Vice President. Soon after that, *Bustamente* revolted, civil war ensued, which ended in the execution of *Guerrero* in February, 1831, at *Oajaca*, leaving

Bustamente in the President's chair. In 1832 *Santa Anna* marched from *Vera Cruz*, to the capital, made *Bustamente* resign in favor of *Pedraza*, then in exile in *Philadelphia*, who returned and served out the remainder of his time of the 1828 election: and then

Santa Anna was elected in May, 1833—taken prisoner at the battle of *San Jacinto* in 1836; *Bustamente* was then in exile in *France*, but returned on hearing of the capture of *Santa Anna*; and

Bustamente was elected. *Santa Anna* on obtaining his liberty, was in retirement some time on his estate, then took the field against *Bustamente* in 1841, and drove him from power; and

Santa Anna again became President in 1841 ; and being deposed by

Gen. Herrera, who sent him to Havana in exile, and then *Herrera* was deposed by

Parades, who usurped the Presidency.

In August, 1846, *Santa Anna* was permitted to return to Mexico, and was at once proclaimed General and Commander-in-Chief. *Parades* being deposed, took leave for parts unknown.

RATES OF ENGLISH POSTAGE, &c.

Inland Letters.—From and to any place in the United Kingdom, on any letter not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. 1d; above $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. and not exceeding 1 oz. 2d; and 2d for each oz. up to 16 oz., above which, no packet can be forwarded through the Post Office.

To and from the United States and Canada. By Mail Packets.—On letters not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 1s; above $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. and not exceeding 1 oz. 2s; and 2s for every oz. or part of an oz. above.

To and from Canada.—On letters to and from Canada, the postage is computed as above, but at 1s 2d, instead of 1s.

By Merchant Ships.—On letters by merchant ships, the postage is computed as above, but at 8d instead of 1s.

On newspapers, in all vessels, 2d each.

Pamphlets, and all printed documents other than newspaper, are charged the same as letters, but these are seldom taken from the post office,

The foreign rate is the same to or from any part of the United Kingdom.

Merchant ships are allowed to put up bags at their port of departure, for the receipt of letters and parcels, without the intervention of the post office.

Directions.—Letters and orders should be written upon thin paper, without superfluous blank sheets, and should be made into as few parcels as possible, so as to occasion the smallest number of parts of ounces. For instance, three sheets of thin paper will weigh under half an ounce, and in one parcel will be charged but 1s or 8d, each.

LONG POND.

Cochituate Water will probably be introduced into the city of Boston, by the 20th of August, 1848. In March of the present year, 5000 tons of pipe will be laid, affording a fine opportunity for politicians to make the most of *pipe-laying*. The distributing reservoir on Mount Vernon street, will contain 2,000,000 of gallons, and will be 22 feet above the highest point of Mount Vernon st. The receiving reservoir will be in Brookline, and the water will be brought to the city in two large pipes, 30 inches in diameter, one of which will be carried under the Tremont road to Beacon hill without tapping, the other will run by the side of the first till it reaches the city, when it will be reduced to 24 inches, giving off pipes in all directions until it reaches Bowdoin square. The series of pipes will be connected with a main pipe of 30 inches, from the Beacon hill reservoir. The lateral supplies will be furnished by tapping these main pipes. The northern part of the city will be supplied by the Beacon hill reservoir, and the southern from the Brookline reservoir. See Water Commissioners, Engineers, &c. p. 162.
