## INTRODUCTION.

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Nearly 20 years ago, while on a visit to the home of my ancestors in Massachusetts, I became interested in genealogy. My first efforts were directed to the tracing of my line of descent from John White of Wenham, 1639, an extended genealogy of whose descendants has recently been completed by Miss Minnie L. White of Haverhill, Mass.

While assisting in this work, I became deeply interested in the various families from which I am descended through both my parents, and found that in some cases genealogies had already been published. On my mother's side, I found two apparently unrelated Barber families. The American ancestor of one of these was Thomas Barber of Windsor, Conn., (born about 1614), and the earliest American ancestor of the other family, of whom positive record has been obtained, was John Barber of Worcester, Mass., probably born in Boston in 1714.

Of neither of these families had a genealogy been published, though I learned through correspondence that several descendants of Thomas Barber of Windsor, Conn., had done more or less work in tracing their direct lineages. Among these were the late Peter J. Barber of Santa Barbara, Cal., and the late Levi A. Barber of Duluth, Minn., who, some years ago, published a small pamphlet containing in brief form, the records of his direct line. Mr. George H. Barbour of Detroit, Mich., had employed Mr. Fred Carlisle to prepare and publish a very small volume of Barber records, but devoted mainly to Mr. Barbour's direct line of ancestry. Also, the late Mr. Oliver E. Wilson of Norwalk, Conn., had made a small collection of records, which his son kindly furnished for use in the present compilation.

Mrs. Minnie Ward Kellogg, of Syracuse, N. Y., had collected some records of the branch of the Barber family from which she



is descended, and which in the fourth generation from Thomas of Windsor settled in New York State.

Through correspondence with Mr. Edmund D. Barbour of Boston, Mass., I learned that while collecting records for a genealogy of the descendants of George Barber of Medway, he had secured a large amount of data regarding the descendants of John Barber of Worcester, supposing at the time, that this John Barber was a descendant of George of Medway. Failing to establish this connection, however, Mr. Barbour kindly entered into an arrangement for turning over to me this collection of records.

The original intention was to publish in one volume, not only the records of the two Barber families already referred to, but also the records of the descendants of Thomas Gleason of W Watertown, Mass.

I finally employed Miss Lillian May Wilson to edit the proposed volume, to establish certain missing links in the genealogical chain and to make such further compilation as could be done in a limited time.

In the few months allotted for the work, Miss Wilson gathered so much additional matter, that it was found that the Barber records alone, would make a large volume, and it was therefore decided to publish them in one volume, and to publish a separate Gleason Genealogy, which has been done.

The Barber Genealogy is composed of two sections, as follows:

- Section I. A Genealogy of the descendants of Thomas Barber of Windsor, Conn., compiled by Miss Wilson.
- Section II. A Genealogy of the descendants of John Barber of Worcester, Mass., the records for which were furnished, as already explained, by Mr. Edmund D. Barbour of Boston, Mass.

Much credit is due Miss Wilson, without whose careful and thorough preparation and distinguished ability for this kind of work, this volume would not have attained its present proportions, nor would it so soon have been published.

## EDITOR'S PREFACE.

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In compiling the "Genealogy of the Descendants of Thomas Barber, of Windsor," the records of the towns in which the early generations of the family settled, have been searched. Where these records have not been printed, transcripts have been obtained from the originals in the offices of the Town Clerks.

A great deal of material has also been obtained from the following authorities :

Owing to the numerous marriages between the Barber and Phelps families, this last mentioned genealogy in particular, has furnished a large amount of data for the present work.

The arrangement of Section I of this volume is similar to that used by genealogists generally, and therefore needs but little explanation.

The records are arranged according to generations, the emigrant ancestor being the first generation, his children the second, his grandchildren the third, and so on.

All descendants are numbered consecutively, the emigrant ancestor being No. 1, his children being numbered 2, 3, 4 etc. Those whose records are extended into the succeeding generation are designated by having the character  $\frac{1}{2}$  placed before the name and number in each case.

The task of compiling a genealogy is an exceedingly indefinite one, as to magnitude. It may be confined within very narrow bounds, or it may be extended indefinitely.

The scope of the present work has been limited to as complete an history and record of the early generations of the descendants of Thomas Barber, of Windsor, as could be obtained, together with such later records, as could, at the same time, and without delay, be collected. The work of extending a genealogy to include a very large number of descendants in the present generation, is one requiring the work of years instead of months, since all later information must be secured through correspondence.

The aim of the publisher of this volume, has been, therefore, not to produce a complete genealogy of the descendants of Thomas Barber of Windsor, but to furnish a foundation upon which future family historians may build.

As such, the book is now presented, and if it shall tend to foster in the many descendants, a true pride of family, a pride in clean, right living, a pride in an ancestry which has borne well its part, not only in the material development, but also in the intellectual and spiritual upbuilding and uplifting of every community where its lot has been cast, an ennobling pride which shall make more worthy, the sons and daughters of this brave, hardy, pioneering race, it shall well have served its purpose.

## BARBER.

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Thomas Barber of Windsor, Conn., a partial record of whose descendants is contained in this volume, was the first of that name to emigrate from England to America. Others, however, soon followed. The records of Medway and Dedham show that a Richard Barber was located at the latter place in 1638, and George and Edward in 1640 and 1644. A James Barber was in Dorchester in 1637, Jeremy in Cambridge in 1641, and John in Salem about the same time that Thomas arrived in Windsor. Numerous others of the name came at later dates.

These early emigrants may or may not have been of the same family. Probably they were but remotely, if at all, related, and it is also likely that they came from different parts of England. There is a tradition to the effect that two brothers of Thomas of Windsor came to America shortly after his arrival here, but no proof of this has yet been found.

No attempt has been made at tracing the English ancestry of Thomas Barber. The frequent occurrence of the name in so many parts of England, together with the absolute uncertainty as to the birthplace of the Emigrant Thomas, makes the quest for his English ancestry one which would require months and perhaps years for its completion and the task is left to future historians.

The origin of the name is a question upon which there is some difference of opinion. All agree, however, that Normandy was its original European home, and that it came into England at the time of the Norman Conquest in the 11th century, and the claim has been made that it came into Normandy indirectly from Persia.

The greater number of those who have made a study of family names, ascribe its derivation to the trade of hair cutting and hair dressing. The fashion of elaborate hair dressing and of fastidi-





ous care of the beard was brought into England by the Normans, and so popular did it become at Court, that skillful hair dressers were much sought after.

Among the royalty, nobility and wealthy gentry, the barber's position was an important one in the household. He was a close confidant of his employer and only men of fidelity and high standing were chosen for the position. The barbers were also skilled in surgery and in the use of drugs and not the least of their duties, was that of physician to the household. Among the titled barons, it became the custom to bestow upon their barbers their own titles, calling them "Baron Barbers," a practice which the London records show to have prevailed until comparatively recent times.

A no less authority, however, than the late Dr. Henry Barber of London, whose study of this particular name would naturally be most thorough and complete, claims that the theory of its derivation from the hair dressing trade, is extremely doubtful. He states that the more probable origin "is from St. Barbe sur Gaillon, a local name in Normandy, where was the celebrated Abbey of St. Barbara," whence comes the name of "Barber or Barbour, a hamlet in Dumbartonshire," and he cites in support of this theory, the personal names, "Bernard Barb de Barbes, tenant in the Domesday book; St. Barbe on the Roll of Battel Abbey; William de St. Barbara, Bishop of Durham, A.D., 1143; Le Barbier, Court of Husting, London, 1258." Dr. Barber also gives the various French forms of the name as Barbe, Barbier, Barbare, Barberie and Barbry; the German form as Barber.

Either theory of origin accounts for the prevalence of the name in nearly all parts of England and Scotland, and also for the great number of unrelated families bearing the name. Like many other colonial names, that of Barber appears in this country under various forms, as Barbar, Barbur, Barbor, Barbary, Barberie and particularly among families of Scottish origin as Barbour.

There are numerous distinguished old families in England and Scotland bearing this name, and the Armories contain record of some nine or ten coats of arms of the Barber families.

Bedfordshire, about 40 miles north of London has been by many of his descendants, believed to be the birthplace of Thomas the Emigrant. A reference to the name in Nichols' "Bedford-



shire" seems, therefore, of sufficient interest to be quoted here. In the chapter entitled, "Description of the Church and Memorial Stones of Linton Parish," occurs the following paragraph:

"A stone inlaid with (a man, a child, both now missing) a woman. Under is writ:

"Of your charity pray for the soules of John Barbar and Agnes his wyff; the which John deceased in the yere of o<sup>r</sup> Lord God M<sup>c</sup>CCCCXV, on whose soules I hu have mercy. Amen."



## FIRST GENERATION

1. THOMAS BARBER, whose name appears in the early Colonial Records of Windsor, Conn. was born probably in the County of Bedfordshire, England, about 1614.

He came to Windsor in 1635 with the party fitted out by Sir Richard Saltonstall, under Francis Stiles, a master carpenter of London. He was then 21 years of age, and was the first of the Barber name in New England.

The following is a copy of a portion of the London Passenger Register for the ship "*Christian*" in which the Saltonstall party sailed for America.

"16 Marcij 1634

"Theis underwritten names are to be transported to New England imbarqued in ye "*Christian*" de Lo: (from London) Job. White Mr bound thither, the men having taken ye oath of Allegiance & Supremacie.

The ancient Jewish year which opened with the 25th of March continued long to have a legal position in Christian countries. In England, it was not until 1752 that the 1st of January became the initial day of the legal year, as it had long been of the popular year.

The "*Christian*," therefore, sailed on the 16th of March 1635 instead of March 1634, as the London Custom House Record states.

According to the Windsor records, in 1635 Thomas Barber was granted "a lot ten rods west of Humphrey Hyde's Mill Road, 8 acres and 22 rods wide, bounded south by Mill Brook, extending as stated 2 rods wide, to accommodate Barber and Alvord, and also a way for Mr. Wareham, Minister, to go to his lot north of Barber's and Alvord's and ended in the Poquonnock Road."



It is evident from the records, that Francis Stiles failed to fulfill his contract with Thomas Barber and the other young men of his party, for on Mch. 28, 1647 the following order was made by the Court of Hartford: Ord. "That Mr. Francis Stiles shall teach Geo. Chapple, Thos. Cooper and Thos. Barber, his servants (apprentices) in the trade of a carpenter, according to his promise for their services for their term, behind 4 days a week only to saw and slitt their own work that they are to frame themselves with their own hands, together with himself or some other master workman; the time to begin for the performance of this order 14 days hence without fail."

Thomas Barber's residence, it is stated, was located "upon an ancient road which running about southwesterly from the rivulet (near where the present road from Palisade Green comes in) intersected the Poquonnock road above the old mill." On the north side of this road were the residences of Thos. Barber, Humphrey Hyde and Alex Alvord, and on the south side that of Jonathan Gillett.

Thomas Barber was a soldier with the rank of Sergeant, in the Pequot War; he distinguished himself by his bravery in a number of fights with the Pequots, and particularly in the taking of a fort which the Indians considered impregnable. After describing the march and the plan of the attack, Capt. Mason gives the following account of the exploit.

"We called up our forces with all expedition, gave fire thro' the Pallisade upon them; the Indians being in a dead, indeed their last sleep. Then we wheeled off and fell upon the main entrance, which was blocked up with bushes about breast high, over which the Captain passed, intending to make good the entrance, encouraging the rest to follow. Lieut. Seeley endeavored to enter, but being somewhat encumbered stepped back and pulled out the bushes, and so entered, and with him about 16 men. We had formerly concluded to destroy them by the sword and save the plunder.

Whereupon, Capt. Mason, seeing no Indians, entered a wigwam, where he was beset with many Indians waiting all opportunities to lay hands on him, but could not prevail. At length Wm. Heydon espying the breach in the wigwam, supposing some Englishman might be there, entered: but in his entrance fell over a dead Indian, but speedily recovering himself, the





Indians some fled, others crept under their beds. The Captain going out of the wigwam saw many Indians in the lane or street; he making towards them they fled, were pursued to the end of the lane, where they were met by Edward Partison, Thomas Barber, with some others, where seven of them were slain."

This occurred probably in June 1637.

While returning from this memorable fight Thomas Barber engaged with Lieut. Cook in a discussion on religious and church matters, and becoming incensed at some remark made by the latter, struck him, for which offense the Court adjudged that he should forfeit his military rank, and pay a fine of five pounds.

In 1641 the lands in the locality called by the Indian name Massaco, were apportioned among the Colonists. Thomas Barber was granted about 600 acres of these lands.

The records of Northampton, Mass., contain the following regarding Thomas Barber :

"A Towne Meeting 24th of 4 mon. 1651.

"The day and year abovesaid it was voted and agreed— Thomas Barber of Windsor may bee an inhabitant of this Towne and grant him a home lott and alsoe liberty to looke out a platt of ground to the quantity of 20 acres, and if it doe encourage him to come they grant it (to him) upon this condition; that he come and inhabit and make improveunte of it within a yere, after the date of—"

This proposition from the town of Northampton, seems not to have been considered, as Thomas died the following year at his home in Windsor.

From all that can be learned of the character of Thomas Barber, it is evident that he was a man of strong convictions, but very liberal in his views, especially so for the times in which he lived. It was his contention that the Church had no right to interfere in temporal matters, which caused the trouble between him and Lieut. Cook. He was, to a marked degree, impulsive and energetic and possessed of great shrewdness in business matters, but with an uprightness of character which won for him the confidence and respect of the Colonists. Brave, fearless and resourceful in times of peril, he was a prominent figure in the defense of the colony, and an Indian fighter of whom the savages stood in awe.



The Hartford Probate Records contain the following regarding the settlement of Thomas Barber's estate.

Barber, Thomas, Windsor, Invt. £132-14-00; taken 20, Oct. 1662, by Benj. Newberry and John Moore.

Court Record, Page 187—4 Feb., 1662-3, Invt. approved. Samuel was placed with his brother Thomas Barber to learn a trade; Mercy (Mary) Barber was placed with Lt. Walter Tyler and his wife until 18 years of age, unless she marries before, with her Master's and Dame's and eldest brother's approbation; Josias Barber was placed with Dea. John Moore until 21 years of age to learn a trade; Thomas Barber doth engage to take Samuel Barber's portion and after two years from the present to allow 6% simple interest per annum. John Barber took Josias' portion upon the same terms.

On Oct. 7, 1649, Thomas Barber married Jane or Joan \_\_\_\_\_ (surname not known). She is supposed by some to have been a daughter of one of the Dutch settlers, and another authority states that she was the first white woman to land in Connecticut.

He died on Sept. 11th, and his wife Joan on Sept. 10th, 1662

In the Hartford Probate records it will be observed that the name of the fifth child of Thomas and Joan Barber is given as Mercy instead of Mary, as shown above. Also some records



seem to indicate that she married a Hale, but the Gillett family records furnish conclusive evidence of her marriage to John Gillett.

It is possible that in the records showing the name of Hale, her marriage was confused with that of her sister Sarah's to Timothy Hall, as a confusion of the names Hale and Hall is quite common.



## SECOND GENERATION.

2. JOHN BARBER,<sup>2</sup> (Thomas<sup>1</sup>) bp. July 24, 1642. He m. 1st in Springfield, Conn., Sept. 2, 1663, Bathsbeba Coggin, (sometimes given Coggen or Cousens) who d. in 1688; he m. 2nd May 1, 1689, Hannah, widow of Thomas Brauncroft, and probably dau. of Samuel Gardner, of Hadley.

The records seem to indicate that as a very young man, he spent some time in Springfield, and was married there, but settled first in Windsor. In 1664 his father's place in Windsor was made over to him, but in 1671, he transferred it to his brother Samuel, and removed to Springfield. Burt's History of Springfield states that he had two children born prior to his removal to that place. His other children were born in Springfield. The same authority states that he served for eight years as one of the selectmen of Springfield, and he is referred to, in the early records, as Deacon John Barber.

In 1684 he removed from Springfield to Suffield. Here, according to some records, he was a deacon and also a selectman. But the records, both of Springfield and Suffield, are much confused regarding this John Barber and his family.

This has presented one of the difficult problems of the present work, and after a careful consideration of all the information obtainable on the subject, the conclusion seems inevitable that among the early settlers, both of Springfield and Suffield, there were other Barber families, descended probably from one of the Massachusetts emigrants, but certainly not descended from Thomas, of Windsor.

For instance, a John Barber, Sr., and a John Barber, Jr., took the oath of allegiance in Springfield, Jan. 1, 1678. These persons could not have been John (son of Thomas, of Windsor) and his son John, as the latter would have been but nine years old on that date.

Again, the records of Springfield contain a list of claimants to lands granted to deceased soldiers of King Philip's War. In this list there appears the name of "John Barber, son of John, of Springfield." This list bears date of June 1736, and as the mor-





uary records seem to give positive evidence that John.<sup>3</sup> John,<sup>2</sup> Thomas, of Windsor,<sup>1</sup> died in 1693, this appears to confirm the theory that there were other families in Springfield descended from one of the other Barber emigrants.

The frequent occurrence of the names Thomas and John in these families renders the problem still more difficult, and the records here given of John Barber (son of Thomas, of Windsor) and of his family, are all that research to this date, has been able to establish with any degree of certainty. It is to be hoped that some future historian may be more successful.

Deacon John Barber died Jan. 17, 1712. His will was proven in February of the same year, and it is stated that the surname very soon thereafter disappears from the records of Springfield. As will be seen by the records of the sons of this family (third generation) it is not improbable that the surname became extinct in this particular line with that generation.

3. THOMAS BARBER,<sup>2</sup> (Thomas,<sup>1</sup>) b. July 14, 1644; m. Dec. 17, 1663, Mary Phelps, who was b. Mch. 2, 1644. She was the dau. of William Phelps, Sr., known as "Ould Mr. Phelps," and his second wife, Mary (Dover) Phelps.

The old Windsor records show that in 1664, Thomas Barber<sup>2</sup> bought land in Windsor "whereon he builded, the lot of Samuel Pond, except about 1 1/2 acres next to Silver Street on which Pond's house stood, and which doubtless faced the Hollow Fall Road."

Other records show that Thomas and his brothers John and Samuel were among the original grantees of Simsbury, having received a portion of the "Meadow Lands" lying along the River Massaco, under an order of the General Court of Hartford, of December, 1666, which stipulated that "within two years the



person to whom granted should improve them by plowing, mowing, building, fencing, etc."

In 1669 Massaco was set off from Windsor and made a separate township under the name of Simsbury, to which Thomas and his brother Samuel, with their families, removed in 1670 or 1671, and began improving the lands at that place which they had inherited from their father Thomas.<sup>1</sup>

Thomas Barber<sup>2</sup> was lieutenant of the first military company of Simsbury, and was known as Lieut. Thomas. He built the first saw-mill and grist-mill in Simsbury, also the first church, regarding the location of which there was some contention among the settlers, which was finally decided by lot, and the location fixed in the southern end of Terry's Plains.

Thomas Barber died in Simsbury, May 10, 1713. His estate was valued at £488 18s 3d.

The name of the husband of Sarah Barber, third child in the above family, is given in some records as "Roe," and it has been claimed that he was an ancestor of the Rev. A. S. Roe. The name, however, is given "Robe" in the Simsbury records, and in his will Thomas Barber mentions his daughter Sarah, wife of Andrew Robe. The evidence is also fairly conclusive that there was no issue.

William Phelps, the father of Mary, wife of Thomas Barber,<sup>2</sup> was born in Tewksbury, County Gloucester, England, 1599. He removed to Somerset or Dorsetshire, England. His first wife was Elizabeth — (surname not known). He came to Dorchester, Mass., in 1630, and in 1636 removed to Windsor, Conn. He applied to be made freeman, Oct. 19, 1630. He was a member of the jury impaneled for the trial of Walter Palmer for the murder



of Austin Botsford, being the first trial jury of New England. That he was a highly respected and active citizen, is evidenced by the various positions of trust which he occupied. He was member in 1636 of the first court held in Connecticut, and of the court which in 1637 declared war against the Pequots. Was magistrate from 1638 to 1642, and again in 1658; was foreman of the first Grand Jury in 1643, and deputy to the General Court from 1645 to 1649, and from 1651 to 1655; was magistrate again from 1658 to 1662, and in 1641 was appointed member of a committee *on lying*. His 2nd wife, Mary Dover, is said to have been a fellow passenger from England with him. They were married in Windsor.

His Windsor residence is about three quarters of a mile northwest of Broad Street, on the road to Poquonnock. As late as 1859 it was owned by Dea. Roger Phelps.

William Phelps, Sr., died July 14, 1692. His wife died Nov. 27, 1675.

4. SARAH BARBER,<sup>2</sup> (Thomas,<sup>1</sup>) bp. July 19, 1646; m. Nov. 26, 1663, Timothy Hall. They settled on a part of her father's land in Windsor, but afterwards (1679) removed to Suffield, where the name frequently occurs, especially in the older records as "Hale."

John Drake, the father of Ruth, was descended from the illustrious English family of that name, which had its seat at Ashe. In England the name has long been borne by many distinguished as navigators, clergymen, martyrs, and authors. Among the foremost of these English families is that which has its seat at Ashe, Co. Devon and from it descended the greater portion of the Drakes of Massachusetts and Connecticut. The line of ancestry of the Windsor (Conn.) Drakes may be thus summarized:

JOHN of Exmouth, Eng. 1360; m. Christian, dau. of John Billet; he acquired the estate of Ashe. His widow m. 2nd, Richard Francheyney.

JOHN, m. Christian, dau. of John Antage, and settled at Otterton; founded the Otterton family of Drake, through his son. He was unlawfully excluded from Ashe by his half brother Christopher Francheyney (son of his mother by her 2nd marriage).

JOHN inherited Otterton; m. a Cruwys of Cruwys Morchand.

JOHN of Otterton; m. Agnes, dau. of John Killoway.

JOHN settled first at Axmouth, and by a suit-at-law recovered Ashe. He m. Margaret, dau. of John Cole of Rill.

JOHN inherited Ashe; m. Anne, dau. of Roger Greenville; his son Bernard inherited Ashe.

ROBERT settled at Wiscomb, Parish of South Leigh, Co. Devon.

WILLIAM of Wiscomb, Co. Devon.

JOHN, b. at Wiscomb, Co. Devon about 1590 or 1600; m. Elizabeth Rogers. He came to Boston about 1639; he d. from the result of an injury, Aug. 17, 1659. His widow d. Oct. 7, 1651, it is stated, "at 100th year of age." If so, she must have been several years older than her husband, or else, which is more probable, he was b. at a considerably earlier date than stated above.

The dates of birth of the children of this family, as given by the best authorities, are greatly at variance with the clear and unmistakable evidence contained in the father's will.

Stiles' "Ancient Windsor" gives the birth of a son John, but places him as the son of the first wife.

In Samuel Barber's will, dated Feb. 21, 1708-9, it will be observed that he makes provision for his son John *when he shall come to the age of 21 years*. Now, if this son John had been born in 1676, he would have been at least 32 years old at the time the father's will was written, whereas it is evident from that document that he was the youngest son. Further, John Barber, the son of Samuel, was married in 1717, at which date, had he been born in 1676 he would have been 41 years old, and his wife, Jane Alvord, born in 1698, would have been 21 years younger than he; all of which is, to be sure, a possible situation, but hardly a probable one, in those days of early marriages.

The New England Gen. & Hist. Reg. Vol. V, page 64, makes mention of *John Drake Barber*, son of Samuel and Ruth, b. Jan. 25, 1676. This is the only record found of John Drake Barber.



From all this evidence, the conclusion seems inevitable that if there was an older son John, he must have died young and as to the confusion regarding the date of his birth, it is not improbable that he was the son of the first wife. At all events, the son John who was living at the time of the father's death was a younger child, and in all probabilities the youngest son, born presumably about 1694.

The dates given above as the dates of birth of Elizabeth and Sarah are undoubtedly incorrect, as in his will, their father Samuel provides that they and their sister Mindwell shall be paid £25 each when they shall be 18 years of age, so that they must have been under 18 years of age when the father's will was made, and hence born after 1690.

Stiles' "Ancient Windsor" gives Sept. 25, 1704, as the date of birth of the daughter Mary, but in the record of the Brown family, the same authority states that she married Peter Brown in 1696, or eight years before the date of her birth. In the Appendix of the volume mentioned, Dr. Stiles calls attention to this discrepancy. It will be seen, by reference to the wills heretofore mentioned that there was a daughter Mary belonging to this family; that she was married prior to the making of her father's will, in Feb., 1708-9, and in her sister Mindwell's will she is specifically mentioned as the wife of Peter Brown. Hence she was evidently one of the older children.

In Samuel Barber's will he makes unconditional bequests to his son Benjamin, which would indicate that he was of age at the time the will was made, and hence must have been born prior to 1690, as given in the above record.

#### WILL OF SAMUEL BARBER, SR.

I Samuel Barber, Sr. of Windsor, doe make & ordain this, my last Will & Testament. I give unto my wife Ruth 2 acres of meadow land in Great Meadow, which I had with her to be at her own dispose; also the use and improvement of my dwelling house and barn and out houses with the lands adjoining thereunto, and with other lands adjoining which I bought of John



Saxton, John Barber & Andrew Hillier, and 14 acres of Benj. Gardiner & John Gillett, until my son John come to the age of 21 years.

ITEM. I give unto my grandson William Barber, son of my son William Barber (deceased) besides what I have already made over to him, 8 acres of swamp land. (Here follows boundary of the land and conditions under which the bequest is made).

ITEM. I give unto my son David the land I purchased of Mr. Buckingham, at Hebron; also 2 acres of land at Windsor, being 2 acres of the 4 I received in the legacy given to my wife.

I give to my son Joseph at Scotland, 20 rods in breadth lying on the north side of the land given to my son Sanael. (Here follows description of sundry other tracts of land bequeathed to son Joseph) "he to pay my wife 20s. yearly in current pay during her life."

ITEM. I give unto my son Benjamin the remainder of my lott at the field called Wheat Field, the other part being given to my son Joseph. Also I give to my son Benjamin 3 acres in Palmer's Swamp, next to Joseph's land, running the same length.

ITEM. I give to my son *John when he shall be 21 years of age*, half my housing and half the land given to my wife (except 2 1/2 acres of meadow) and the other half after my wife's decease; also I give to my son *John when he comes to be of age*, about 1 acre of land, which is called Fitch Waters bottom.

ITEM. I declare it to be my will that my three daughters, Elizabeth, Mindwell and Sarah, shall have 25£ apiece paid to each of them when they shall be 18 years of age, to make them equal with their two sisters who are married.

And I give to my five daughters (both those that are married and those that are not) the remainder of my estate which is yet undisposed of, both personal and real, to be equally divided between my 5 daughters, Mary, Ruth, Elizabeth, Mindwell and Sarah, to them and their heirs forever. I appoint my wife Ruth, and my son-in-law William Phelps to be executors.

Will proven Apr. 4, 1709.

I, Ruth Barber, of Windsor, thought it best to make this my last Will & Testament; After my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, my will is that what is wanting of my son Benjamin and John Barber's portion, and also of Sarah Barber's portion according to their father Samuel Barber's last Will, shall be made up to each of them out of my estate.

I freely release my son Joseph Barber from the 20 shillings per annum that he was to pay unto me by his father Samuel Barber's Will. I fully discharge my son Benjamin Barber from paying for his dyet while he has been with me, providing he demand nothing from my executors for what work he has done for me, nor for the corn and meat I have had of him.



I give to my son John Barber my mare, a steer and all my right in the oxen the sd. Joseph Barber bo't of Josiah Barber, and also hay to keep them this winter.

I give to my daughter Sarah my best bed and furniture; also a pig and 4 bushels of corn and two of rye. I give to my son-in-law Samuel Barber 20 shillings in money besides what he owes me.

I give to my grandson William Barber 5 shillings in money.

Lastly my will is that the remainder of my whole estate be divided to and among my children hereafter named in equal shares, viz; Mary Brown; Ruth Phelps; Elizabeth Loomis and Sarah Barbour (Barber).

I make my son Joseph Barber sole executor.

Will proven Dec. 1731.

John Gillett, the husband of Mary Barber, was the son of Jonathan Gillett, the Emigrant, who with his brother Nathan came to Dorchester, Mass., with the Rev. Mr. Wareham. An interesting relic in the possession of a descendant of the Gillett family is a bible brought from England by Jonathan Gillett.

This bible is of the Geneva edition of 1599, which is known as the "Breeches Bible" for the reason that the fig leaf garment worn by our first parents is translated "breeches" instead of "apron" as in the King James version.



In the Gillett family this particular copy is known as the "Bear Bible" from the fact of its once having been used to prop open a window, and a bear in trying to effect an entrance through the opening, clawed the leaves, making marks which still remain.

I, Josiah Barbour, of Windsor, wheelwright, do make this my last Will and Testament; I give unto Sarah my wife for her to have and enjoy  $\frac{1}{3}$  part of my lands, some portions that I purchased of Ebenezer Gilbert and Ebenezer Spencer, and also of Ebenezer Williams, land that belonged to Mark Kelsey, and  $\frac{1}{3}$  part of the land I purchased of Josiah Cooke and Joanna, his wife. I also give unto my wife for her to have and enjoy only for and during ye time she shall happen to live and remain my



widow; my parson; or lower room of my dwelling house, also 1/2 part of the west side of my barn. Also, I give her a feather bed, a mare and a cow, to be her owne for ever, and one year's provisions. The reason I have not given unto my wife any more of my moveable estate is because that I had none of her estate left her by her former husband, for she disposed of the same unbeknown to me, and she may dispose of my estate (if given) as she did her former husband's, and so leave herself destitute.

I give to Nathaniel Barbour, my eldest son, besides what I have already given him by deed of gift, all my land in the lower field on the west side of the road to Windsor, 1/3 part of the land I purchased of Ebenezer Williams, that belonged to Mark Kelsey 1/3 part of the land I purchased of Josiah Cook, and Joanna his wife, and also 1/3 part of the land I purchased of Ebenezer Gilbert and Ebenezer Spencer; also 1/3 part of my undivided land that shall be laid out by virtue of any right belonging to me.

I also give unto my son Nathaniel Barbour £20 in money, to be paid him by his brother Aaron Barbour.

I give unto my son Jonathan Barbour, besides what I have already given him by deed of gift, 2/3 part of the land purchased of Ebenezer Williams that belonged to Mark Kelsey, 2/3 part of the land I purchased of Ebenezer Gilbert and Ebenezer Spencer, also 1/2 part of all undivided lands. I give him £20 as money to be paid him by his brother Aaron Barbour.

I give my son Aaron Barbour my home lott, dwelling house, barn and all edifices erected on same, with other lands. Also I give him my "wheelwright" Tools. I give to my two daughters, Abigail Brown and Rebecca Drake, to each of them £80 in current pay or 2/3 money. I give unto my daughter Abigail £5 more. I give to my grandchildren, to Elizabeth Drake if she continues to live at my house till she comes of age, the sum of £20 in currency pay or 2/3 money; and to Hannah Drake £15 as money. I make my sons Nathaniel Barbour, Jonathan Barbour, and Aaron Barbour Executors.

A codicil dated December 9-1729: I, the sd. Josiah Barbour by this present codicil, do ratify and confirm my last Will and Testament, and do give to my wife Sarah 10 bushels of Indian Corne 6 bushels of rie, and 20 pounds of flax, and a barrel of sider, and all the pork, butter and suit in the house, to be paid to her, my sd wife Sarah, immediately after my decease. And whereas I have ordered a legacy to be pd. Hannah Drake, my will is that Elizabeth Drake shall have one of the feather beds and one of the blankets my wife made since we married, and Hannah Drake the other feather bed and two blankets which she made since she came here, and the middle brass kettle, as part of their legacies, to be valued at Inventory price; but my wife Sarah shall have the use of them during her natural life.

The vagueness and inaccuracy of the records as noted, with reference to John Barber,<sup>2</sup> are still more apparent in the third generation.

All records seem to agree that Joanna was the name of the wife of John Barber,<sup>3</sup> and Bart's History of Springfield gives her name and date of birth as above.

The records of Suffield give the births of the following Barber children.

It has been assumed by some historians that these are the children of John and Joanna, but since John Barber was b. in 1669, the first two children mentioned above were scarcely 13 and 14 years younger than he, and he is less than 18 years older than the third child. He may have been the father of the fourth child, or it is barely possible (though very improbable) that he was also the father of the third child.

He d. Oct. 21, 1690, at the age of 21, and as neither the Probate nor other records make mention of his heirs, it seems far more probable that he d. without issue.

There is no record or evidence that Thomas Barber left any children. After his death his widow Sarah married 2nd, John White, of Hatfield. She d. Nov. 3, 1744, aged 59 years.

Sarah Ball's mother was the widow of Nicholas Worthington, and 2nd wife of Jonathan Ball.

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After the death of John Barber,<sup>5</sup> his widow, Mary, m. 2nd, Ephraim Buel, by whom she had two children, Mindwell Buel, b. 1715, and Ephraim Buel, Jr., b. 1718. The Simsbury records contain the following regarding Ephraim Buel's death and that of his stepson John Barber, second child of the above family:

"Ephraim Buel departed this life the Sixteenth day of January, 1718.

"John Barber, son of John Barber, of Simsbury, departed this life the 16th day of January 1718. The above said Ephraim Buel and John Barber, his son-in-law (step son) went out into ye west mountains to hunt horses on the 14th day of the above said month, and died in the woods and was found on the 17th day and brought home, it being a stormy time and the snow being deep and cold weather."

The Hartford Probate Records contain the following regarding the settlement of the estate of John Barber of Simsbury:

"Barber, John, Simsbury; d. 1st Mch., 1711-12. Invt. £161-19-10. Taken 2 Apr., 1712, by Andrew Kobe, Thomas Holcomb and John Slater, Sr. Legatees of deceased, Mary, his wife, Mercy, his oldest dau., 9 years old, John, 7, William, in his 5th year, Mary born 4 Jan., 1708-9, and Isaac, b. May 2, 1711."

By the terms of the will the entire estate was left to his wife, with power to dispose of same to best interests of herself and children.

Court Record (page 65-7) 7 Apr., 1712, Mary Barber, relict of the deceased, exhibited the last Will and Testament of John Barber now in this Court. This Court do see cause to defer the matter until the 1st Monday in June.

"The pretended will of John Barber, of Simsbury, deceased, was exhibited in Court, and was disallowed and disapproved."

Barbour, Samuel—Simsbury—d. Dec. 1725; Invt. £306-06-07. Taken by John Case and Jonathan Westover; Will dated Dec. 7-1725.

"I, Samuel Barber of Simsbury do make this my last Will and Testament; Inprimis; I give unto my well beloved wife Sarah 1/3 of all my improved lands during life; 1/3 of my moveable estate, with £10 more to be levied out of my moveable estate forever.



I give unto my son Samuel 50 acres of land on the West Rider, commonly called Cherrile's Land, with £30 of my undivided land to him and his heirs forever.

ITEM. I give to my son Thomas  $1/2$  of my last division with  $1/2$  of my lott called Rowley lott, to him and his heirs forever.

ITEM. I give unto my son Jonathan  $1/2$  of my last division, with  $1/2$  of my lott called Rowley lott, to him and his heirs forever.

ITEM. I give unto my two daughters Sarah and Mary £40 to each of them, and that to be paid by my four sons at marriage, or at the age of 18 years (through forgetfulness for not entering this before the last paragraph)

ITEM. I give unto my son John the house and home lot and meadow, lot lying in Hop Meadow, to him and his heirs forever.

I constitute my wife Sarah, with my brother Benjamin Holcomb, sole Executors.

On Feb. 23-1738-9, John Barber, minor, 19 years of age, son of Samuel Barber of Simsbury, chose Benjamin Hooker to be his guardian.

The record of marriage of Samuel Barber and Martha Ponder, given above, is taken from Dr. Stiles' "Ancient Windsor." It will be noted that according to the dates given, Samuel Barber was 40 years old and his wife about 35 at the time of their marriage, an unusual occurrence in those days.



The authority above quoted gives Aug. 4, 1732 as the date of Samuel Barber's death, and 1722-3 as the date of the death of his son Samuel. But the following entries in the Hartford Probate Records, shows that Administrators of the estate of Samuel Barber, the father, were appointed Mch. 5, 1722-3, and that Samuel Barber, the son, was a minor 15 years of age in 1732.

"Oct. 6-1735, Martha Barber, widow, desired that her brother Joseph Barber in Windsor, should be guardian to her son Ezekiel Barber, a minor under 14 years of age. He was appointed guardian."

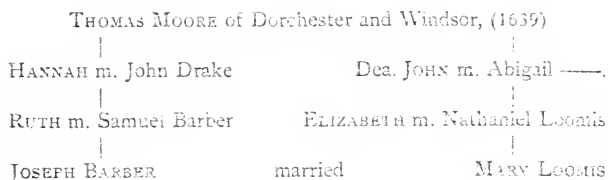

David Barber's will, dated Oct. 2, 1729; proven Jan. 6, 1730, makes bequest to each of the above named children, excepting the two who died in infancy. The date of Hannah's birth has not been ascertained, and it is not certain that she was the 3rd child. She was, however, undoubtedly the daughter of Benjamin and Hannah (Lewis) Barber,





and as her husband, Simon Moore, was born in 1732, she must have been much younger than her brother Eldad, and there were probably children between them.

Mr. Fred Carlisle's little book entitled "Genealogy of George H. Barbour" contains the following:

"Rev. Stiles' History of Windsor contains the following reference to the victory over the Pequot Indians, in the fight in which Sgt. Alvord participated:

"A day of special thanksgiving was proclaimed throughout the Colonies, and everywhere the song of exultant victory was blended with prayer and praise to Him that ruleth on High.

In all these rejoicings we may well believe that the good people of Windsor had their full share. Capt. Mason, the very foremost man among them a' was their townsman. *So was brave Sergeant Alvord.* So were Thomas Barber and Edward Pattison, whose valiant right arm caused seven Indians 'to bite the dust.'"

The above reference to the encounter with the seven Indians, may be construed as giving the greater portion of the credit to



Edward Pattison, but in Capt. Mason's own account of it he gives fully equal credit to Thomas Barber. (See sketch under Thomas Barber, No. 1).

Dr. Samuel Barber had the reputation of a good citizen, although somewhat eccentric in his habits, and not unfrequently impulsive in his actions. He doted much on his skill in roots and herbs; was famous as a hunter, the woods at that time affording an abundance of game. In one of his hunting excursions in Norfolk, accompanied by some of his sons, they chased a large panther into his den, and how to dislodge him from his hiding place was the first question to be solved. The old gentleman, nothing daunted, Putnam like, descended into the cavern; after groping his way some distance, the panther, not relishing this intrusion upon his retreat, suddenly turned and made for the entrance of his den, which he accomplished by closely squeezing by his bold intruder. The panther on his arrival at the mouth of the den, seeing the party without, prepared to give him battle, stood motionless, when one of the sons discharged a ball through his body and intestines, which produced no emotion, the animal sullenly retaining his position. This act of the son called forth a sharp reprimand from the father for his not taking a more effective aim, and calling for his gun, the old gentleman discharged a ball through the head of the animal, which put an end to his existence. This exploit may justly be put on a parallel with the famous story of "Putnam and the Wolf."

The family of Barbers were among the earliest and most conspicuous of West Simsbury. They were noted for their habits of immigration, and are to be found in various states of the Union; few of the descendants (although numerous) are to be met with in the town of Canton.—Brown's "General Hist. of Simsbury, etc."

Daniel Eggleston was a lineal descendant of Begat Eggleston, b. probably in 1590, and who came presumably from Exeter, England, to Dorchester, Mass., in 1630, and was the first of the name in this country. In 1636 he removed to Windsor, where he d. in 1674.

"across the Rivulet at the Ferry," an improvement which the town council declined to undertake at public expense, but granted permission, as above, to the citizens individually, on condition that it was made a free bridge forever. We are told that a sufficient number of the citizens accepted the terms, and "in 1749, a good cart bridge was accordingly erected across the Tunixis."

Reuben Barber was one of the organizers of Litchfield County in 1751, and commanded a military company in the town just before the breaking out of the Revolutionary War. He was one of first to volunteer for the relief of Boston in 1775, and was in the Lexington Alarm. Subsequently served in line regiments, from July to December, 1780.

He carried on a shoemaking and tanning business and was for 13 years a selectman of the town.

Capt. Aaron was b. in England in 1610; came to Dorchester in 1630, and was granted land in Windsor in 1636, and was a prominent figure in the history of that place. In 1653 he was made Commander-in-chief of the 65 soldiers drafted from ten Connecticut towns for a war against the Dutch.

"In 1687, Capt. Cook was given the rank of Major (then the highest military office in Mass.) and, after Andros' fall he was again Captain. In 1683 he was one of the County Court which sat in Springfield, upon the case of Mary Webster, 'under strong suspicion of having familiarity with the devil,'—a case afterwards referred to the Court of Assistants at Boston, which resulted in her acquittal."—Stiles "Ancient Windsor."

Loannah's grandmother, Edie Drake, was of the Drake family of Windsor, so many of whose members married into the Barber family. Her line of descent from the Emigrant being as follows: Edie,<sup>4</sup> Simon,<sup>3</sup> John,<sup>2</sup> John.<sup>1</sup>

Jerijah Barber was probably a Revolutionary soldier, though the Revolutionary rolls of the State of Conn. do not contain the name.

The records of Simsbury show that a David Barber married Deborah Adams, and it has been assumed by some historians that this was David, the son of Dr. Samuel, mentioned above. No public record of this marriage has yet been found, and it is more than likely that it was burned at Canton. But that the wife of David Barber was Sarah Lawrence, is abundantly proven by the records and events in the family history of his descendants.

Miss Julia Barber (No. 2264) of Charleston, W. Va., who with her brother, Levi Allen Barber, has made a careful study of this branch of the family, writes on this point as follows :—

"I remember hearing my father and his old Uncle David H. (No. 671) who married Clarissa Whippley, talking of her (Sarah Lawrence) when I was a young girl. He told my father of her second marriage to William Dyer, which my father had not known of before that time (1857). She had two sons by her second husband, one named Lawrence Dyer."

As this old Uncle David H. was the eldest son of David and Sarah (Lawrence) Barber, he would be unquestionable authority as to his mother's name.

Miss Barber states that her grandfather, Daniel,<sup>6</sup> after the death of his father, lived with his cousin Joab Lawrence, who was a son of Sarah Lawrence's brother Bigelow, and that the Lawrence relatives have visited at her father's house, one of them, Edmund Lawrence, being present at his golden wedding.

She further writes.—"Bigelow Lawrence's picture is in Clarks, Onandaga, and father has shown it to me with almost veneration."

It is probable that the David Barber who married Deborah Adams is David (No. 193) son of Isaac and Martha (Adams) Barber.





Sarah Lawrence's sister, Prentice Lawrence, married Jacob Barber No. (239) a cousin of David. Sarah and Prentice Lawrence were descended from John Lawrence of Watertown, Mass., a summary of the lineage being as follows:

The Rev. Isaiah Butler, the father of the above family, was a patriot, and there is abundant evidence in the family history in support of the tradition that he was in service in the cause of the colonists, although his name does not appear on any of the Revolutionary Rolls. During a part of the period of his service, he was living in Green Bush, N. Y., and during his absence in the army, his Tory neighbors destroyed and confiscated a great deal of his property.

After returning from the army, Mr. Butler removed to Zoar, Mass., where his wife, Elizabeth Barber, died. He married 2nd, a Miss Hill, by whom he had six children. They removed to Schroom Lake, N. Y., where both he and his second wife died and were buried.





Mr. Butler studied for the ministry in the Presbyterian Church, but before completing his preparation, he joined the Baptist Church, of which his wife was already a member, and became a minister in that denomination.

In the possession of a descendant of Isaiah and Elizabeth (Barber) Butler, is an old letter written by a clergyman who visited in Mr. and Mrs. Butler's home. He described Mrs. Butler as being an unusually bright, vivacious, and gifted woman, and stated that she had red hair, a fair complexion and blue eyes.

The name Isaiah was a favorite one in the Butler family, the Rev. Isaiah being the third in his direct line, bearing the name. Perhaps on this account he adopted as a middle name, "Zada" and he is known to his descendants as Isaiah Zada Butler, but in all official papers his name appears as Isaiah Butler, Jr., the name "Zada" in no case being used.

According to the records, it seems that he was undoubtedly a descendant of John Butler, who was a member of the "Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company" in Boston in 1644, the line of descent being as follows:

John Bruen, father of Mary, second wife of John Baldwin, was born probably about 1560. Soon after his death, the Rev. William Hinde, Rector of the Parish, wrote and published his biography, entitled "The Very Singular Life of John Bruen, Esq., of Stapleford, Cheshire, England. About 100 years later this book was republished in England and again in 1857 in New York.

The story thus preserved from generation to generation, is that of a devoutly religious life, a life whose faith was shown by

its works. John Bruen is, perhaps, the one example of a plain English country gentleman whose biography has been written, printed and re-printed, read and re-read, and whose name has been remembered for three centuries, simply because of the goodness and purity of his life.

"Phelps Genealogy" (Andrew T. Servin) from which this, as well as many other records of the Phelps family, was obtained, contains the following: "Capt. Phelps was a farmer. He first





settled in Norfolk, Conn., about 1768. He was a great traveler for his time. His own conservatism, however, was a hindrance to spend some time in a warmer climate. Accordingly, in the fall of 1774, he took passage for New Orleans, and after arriving there, went up the Mississippi, and located a plantation on Big Black River, and returned in the fall of 1775. The following spring, he started with his family for the plantation, but conditions were much changed, owing to the breaking out of the Revolutionary War. He found his plantation occupied by other parties, from whom he could get neither possession or redress. His wife sickened and died, and his two children were drowned in crossing the Mississippi. A child had been born on their journey to New Orleans, which was named Atlantic, but it lived only a short time.

After losing his family, Capt. Phelps entered the Revolutionary Army, and was in service two years, and at the expiration of that time (1779) returned to his old home in Harwinton, Conn.

After his second marriage he settled in Norfolk and in 1788 removed from there to New Haven, Vt., where he died. He published a book of his travels, which was printed in Bennington, Vt. in 1788, entitled "Capt. Matthew Phelps, from Connecticut to the Mississippi River, 1778-80."

David Barber, of Hebron, Conn., father of Elihu, was a merchant in Hebron, Conn., and a wealthy man for those times. During the Revolutionary War, however, his fortune was swept away and Elihu, who had been reared in luxury, was left to face a life of toil and hardship. In his wife he had a strong, capable helper.

Early in 1801 they sold their little, barren Connecticut farm, and with \$700.00 in cash, set out with an ox team and sled for Pompey, N. Y., where they arrived the latter part of February. Here they bought 100 acres of land, the deed bearing the date of March 7, 1801. They moved into a log house and while the husband worked to clear and improve the farm, the wife was busy with her loom, weaving, not only the linen and woolen for her own household, but for the neighbors as well.

In 1810, a frame house "of the pattern so common in dear old Connecticut" was built and furnished, the busy loom having paid for the brick in the chimney, the sawing of all of the lumber and for the labor of shingling the house.

The dairy business proved profitable, and Mr. Barber was known among the old settlers as "Butter Barber." Additions were made to the farm until they owned over 500 acres.

Mr. and Mrs. Barber were among the organizers of the First Baptist Church of Pompey, and Mrs. Barber, until her death, was one of its most active members.

"Plain, unassuming people were they, in the front ranks of pioneers whose onward march has carried civilization from ocean to ocean."

Thomas Barber, father of the above family was born in Canton, Hartford County, Conn. He was well educated, particularly as a musician; was a good vocalist and played nearly every instrument then in vogue, the violin being his favorite. For years he wrote and taught music. He was engaged in farming in his early life, but later carried on a boot and shoe business.

During the War of 1812, he raised a company of volunteers, but on the morning of starting for the front, he was thrown from



his horse and his shoulder broken, which prevented him from entering the service. Indeed, he never afterward recovered from the injury. In 1820 he removed with his family to Nelson, Portage County, Ohio.

Besides the usual hardships of a pioneer life, Mr. Barber had, the first year, an additional misfortune. Just as the long severe winter was setting in, his barn, containing practically all of his first year's crop, a good deal of his stock and all of his farming implements, was burned. But with the energy and courage of his race, he determined to regain his losses and provide a comfortable home, and in the years that followed, he met with abundant success.

In 1828, he and his wife were called upon to bear other troubles than those of a financial nature. Sickness entered their home and within fifteen months, five of their children were laid in their graves.

Thomas Barber, like the emigrant ancestor whose name he bore, was a man of sterling qualities, honored and respected by all; his word was as good as his bond; he was sound in judgment, public spirited and a man of dauntless courage.

Percy Merrill, wife of Thomas Barber, was born in Hartford County, Conn., and died at their home in Nelson, Portage County, Ohio, May 19, 1849.

"My father's children, beginning with the eldest are as follows: Huldah, Matilda, Anna, Sheldon, David L. and William. I was 24 the 15th of April last. Uncle Roswell is our nearest neighbor. He has children,- Betsey, Elihu, Belinda, Polly, James N. and David O.

Elihu (see No. 1494) has been teaching school the winter seasons and studying the languages in the summer, such as Greek, Latin, Hebrew, etc. I also followed the occupation of school teaching one winter, and expect to follow it the ensuing winter, beginning the 25th of Nov. next.

"Uncle Friend lives 57 miles west of us. The family remaining at home are in good health. He has 8 children by his first wife, and 3 by his second. If you have any knowledge where Samuel Barber is, or what he is doing, please inform me when you answer this letter."

In a letter written by Friend Barber from Troopsville, N.Y., he mentions his son Samuel, but none of the other children.

In 1811, Roswell, the father, removed from Schoharie Co., to Oneida Co., N. Y., making the journey with ox teams. He built his log cabin on the banks of the Oneida River between the present towns of Oneida and Durhamville. Later he built a large frame farm house on the same site.

In those early days the only road to the settlement where Roswell Barber lived was an Indian trail and the settlers found their way to the homes of their neighbors by means of blazed trees.

Soon after arriving at their new home, Roswell Barber, with a few others arranged for religious services which were maintained steadily until 1815, when a church of 12 members was organized. Their pulpit was supplied by the "Circuit Riders" and to these hardy, self-sacrificing pioneer preachers who formed such an important factor in the pioneer life of a century ago, the home of Roswell Barber was always open.

He was a devoted member of the Baptist Church and the bell belonging to the church in Durhamville, which still rings out on Sunday morning, was his gift.

The land for the old cemetery in Durhamville was purchased from him. This cemetery in which he and his wife were laid to rest, is directly opposite his home. The original deed is in possession of a collector of relics in Durhamville, and is considered an especially unique and curious document. Through the kindness of Mrs. F. H. Farwell of Orange, Texas, a descendant of Roswell Barber, a copy was obtained and is as follows :

THIS INDENTURE, Made the fourteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Two Between Roswell Barber of the Town of Verona in the County of Oneida and State of New York, and Betsey, his wife, of the first part, for and in Consideration of the sum of fifty-three dollars and fifty cents, Do bargain, sell and confirm unto Benjamin Newcomb, James Hurlbut, Lemuel Pease, Recompence Soule, Eliphlet Frezee, Charles G. The farm house built by Roswell Barber is shown in the accompanying picture. A few changes have been made in it since it was first built. Originally a covered driveway led from the kitchen to the cheese house and the loom room, where for years his wife and daughters spun and wove the woolen sheets, kersey blankets and household linen.

During the War of 1812, Roswell Barber was stationed at Sacketts Harbor to guard the supplies.

There is a discrepancy between the Bible records of Amasa Barber's family and the dates shown on the gravestones in the Old Sheepfold Cemetery. According to the inscription on Amasa Barber's gravestone, he "died May 7, 1831; aged 61 years" but according to the Bible record he was b. Oct. 29, 1773, so that he would have been a little past 57 years of age at the time of his death, if the date of death on the gravestone is correct.

According to the Bible record Betsey Barber, wife of Amasa, was b. Nov. 15, 1776, while the inscription on her gravestone states that she d. June 22, 1849 aged 74 years.

The cemetery inscription gives the date of death of the son Selah as Sept. 26, 1831; this record does not appear on the Bible record, nor is there any positive evidence that he and Ase-nath were twins, but there is a family tradition to that effect.

Virgil H. Barber was educated for the ministry, took orders in the Episcopal church, and was a clergyman of considerable prominence.

The little volume entitled "Catholic Memoirs of Vermont and New Hampshire," by Bishop De Coesbriand, contains a biographical sketch of each member of this family, extracts from the diary of the mother, Jerusha (Booth) Barber, and also reminiscences by the youngest daughter, Josephine.



It is related, that about the year 1814, Mr. Barber read, for the first time, the life of St. Francis Xavier, and became deeply interested in the Roman Catholic Church, and after much hesitation and discussion, both he and his wife resolved to enter that communion.

It was the desire of both Mr. and Mrs. Barber to enter religious orders, and finally, after numerous interviews with the church officials, their marriage was annulled in order to permit them to follow what they believed to be the dictates of conscience. Mr. Barber was sent to Rome and subsequently became a Jesuit priest.

Mrs. Barber entered the convent of the Sisters of the Visitation at Georgetown, taking the name of Sister Mary Augustine and became one of the teachers in the convent school. At this time she was 27 years of age, her husband 33. Their children were placed in charge of the Sisters of the Visitation.

This order was a very poor one and for this reason more than the usual privation of religious orders was entailed upon its members. In her diary Mrs. Barber tells how, with difficulty, her children were made barely comfortable by using the cast off clothing of the girls of the convent school and how, on cold winter nights, she would creep to their bedside and add to their scanty coverings the cloaks and wraps of some of the other girls. The story of those years is a pathetic one, but told uncomplainingly.

Throughout their lives she and her husband corresponded, but always addressed and referred to each other as brother and sister.

As stated in the family record given above, the children all entered religious orders.

Mrs. Barber died Jan. 1, 1860. Mr. Barber died at St. Thomas Manor, Charles County, Maryland, Feb. 23, 1864.

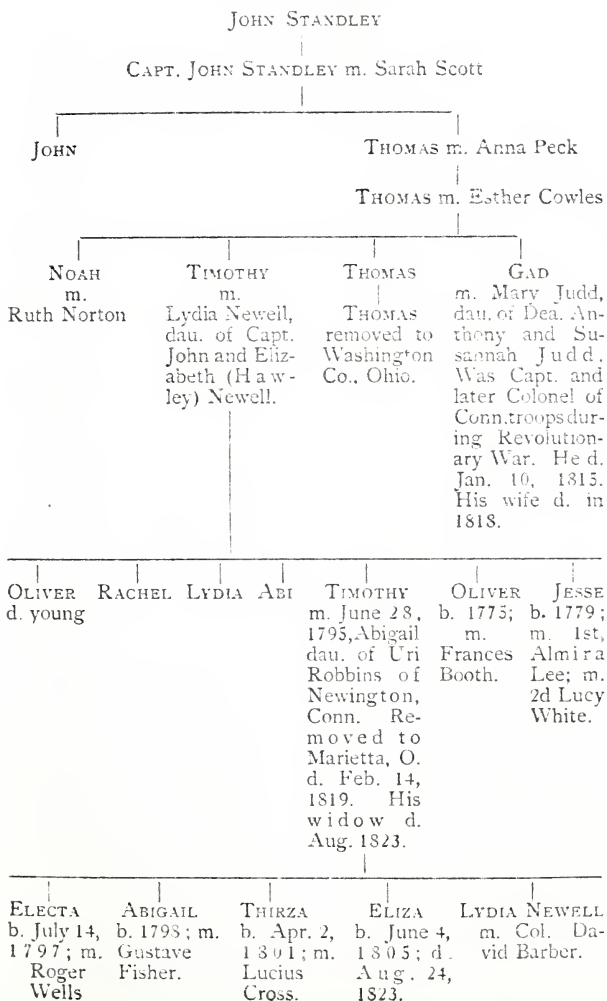

Lydia Newell Stanley, wife of David Barber and mother of the above family, was a descendant of Capt. John Standley of Farmington, Conn., the "d" having been dropped in the spelling of the name by Lydia's father Timothy.

Capt. John Standley was b. in England in 1624. In 1634 at the age of 10 years, he embarked with his father and two uncles for America. His father d. while on the voyage and the son lived with his uncles Thomas and Timothy in Hartford, Conn. He m. Dec. 5, 1645 Sarah Scott; he was admitted to the church in Farmington, Jan. 30, his wife July 12, 1653. He d. Dec. 19, 1706. In 1813 Timothy Stanley, father of Lydia N. (Stanley) Barber removed with his family from Newington, Conn., to Marietta, Ohio where he d. Feb. 14, 1819 and his wife in Aug. 1823. They were m. June 28, 1795.

A synopsis of the Stanley (Standley) lineage is as follows :









A sketch written some years ago by Levi Allen Barber, fifth child of the above family, contains the following regarding David Barber, the father.

"In 1819 my father had come to the Allegheny River on foot from Bogardus Corners, where his father's farm was (now the present site of the city of Syracuse, in the State of New York) carrying his worldly goods and possessions on his shoulder. He and a few others joined together, buying a small flat bottomed boat, in which they floated down the Allegheny and Ohio Rivers until they came to the mouth of the Muskingum. Here my father had an uncle then living, who was at that time member of Congress, (Levi Barber No. 1422).

"His uncle was a merchant, and he placed my father in his store, where he remained three or four years. His uncle then advanced him a few thousand dollars and he went to Chester, Meigs Co., Ohio, where he was commissioned postmaster, his commission bearing the signature of Return Jonathan Meigs and dated 1823. He retained the office until let out by the democratic administration just before the inauguration of Harrison in 1841.

"He also held the office of county treasurer for sixteen consecutive years, and I well remember when he used to start off on horseback to Columbus with his money in his saddle bags, to make his settlements.

"Shortly after the political campaign of 1840, my father removed to Harmar, now a part of Marietta, Ohio, where he remained until the end of his life, Nov. 1st, 1887."

The same sketch contains a beautiful tribute to the deep, religious character of the mother Lydia Newell (Stanley) Barber, a part of which is as follows :

"I well remember when she used to ride off on Sunday mornings to some poor neighborhood where she had organized a Sunday School, always carrying with her something for the material welfare of her proteges, thus laying up for herself treasures where moth and rust would not corrupt."

"A Methodist Church had been built about 1843-4. My father had given the land and had contributed liberally to the building. I remember that he gave a barrel of whiskey for use at the time of the raising of the building. It was very gratefully accepted and was considered the proper thing then, which shows how times have changed.



"On the occasion of the dedication of the church, my father had been given a rather conspicuous seat well forward with his family, when old Abe Pickens, one of my mother's numerous proteges strutted forward, dressed in my father's regimentals with the epaulets and brass buttons. This angered my father very much. He said to my mother, 'You might at least have told me before giving those things to him.' She replied, 'You would never have used them again and Pickens promised to take off the epaulets and all the brass buttons, but I suppose the poor man had no other buttons to put on, but I will see that they are taken off.'"

"I never remember seeing my father at the head of his regiment but once, which was, I think, about 1842, when he was retired by reason of his age."

Peter J. Barber was born near Nelson, Portage County, Ohio. He was educated in the district schools and at Windham Academy. After leaving school he learned the carpenter's and cabinet maker's trade, and also made some study of architecture.

In 1852 he went to California with a party of gold seekers. The journey was made by crossing the Isthmus of Panama, and the voyage from there to San Francisco required 65 days' time and was one of great hardships, seventeen of the party dying on shipboard and all suffering greatly from hunger and thirst.

They arrived in San Francisco May 22, 1852. The greater number of the party went to the mines, but Mr. Barber decided to remain in the city and work at his trade. While in San Francisco he continued the study of architecture under the celebrated French Architect Heurn, and later assisted in draughting the plans for the State Capitol of California. He worked for several years in San Francisco as a builder and architect, and during his residence in that city he was Secretary of the Builders' Association, Treasurer of the Elysian club, a social organization, and an active member of the First Light Dragoons of San Francisco.

In 1869 he removed to Santa Barbara and took an active part in the development and progress of that city. He was elected Mayor in 1880 and served as postmaster from 1882 to 1886, and in 1890, at the urgent request of a large number of citizens, he was again candidate for the mayoralty, and was elected by a large majority,

During his administration, he planned the boulevard, fountain and other work of the Plaza del Mar, which is conceded to be the finest work of its kind along the coast. Another act to be credited to this administration is the building of the large out-fall and other sewers, sufficient in capacity for a city of 100,000 inhabitants, at a cost of \$18,000. By persistent effort he saved the city over \$200,000, in thwarting a scheme for putting in a 4 1/2 x 6 1/2 foot sewer a mile and six hundred feet long that could not be reached by one-fourth of the sewerage of the city. The city fire cisterns and flushing tanks were planned and superintended by him, as well as most of the bridges. At the time of President Harrison's visit to Santa Barbara, April 3, 1891, Mayor Barber arranged for his reception, and was himself the bearer of the city's welcome to the distinguished guest.

In addition to the various offices mentioned, Mr. Barber was





a member of the board of health for one term. He was President of the County Mid-Winter Fair Association, exhibiting in San Francisco in 1893, and made the plan for the building and had charge of gathering the exhibits from different parts of the county and shipping them to the Fair Grounds. His idea for the design of the building was unique, being a fac simile of an old Egyptian pyramid. It attracted constant attention and drew forth many flattering comments from visitors.

Mr. Barber was Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce Committee on coast defense, and spent much time and money in getting the proposition of fortifying Santa Barbara before Congress. This proposition would have met with success, excepting for the ill-timed effort on the part of some members of the Chamber, to secure, at that particular time, a Federal Building for Santa Barbara.

Mr. Barber was the first President of the Ohio Society of Santa Barbara, and on the occasion of President McKinley's visit to that city in May 1901, he received a cordial invitation to visit the President in his private car.

Mr. Barber was an active member of the I. O. O. F., the Ancient Order of United Workmen and the American Legion of Honor. A lengthy biographical sketch, which was published a short while before Mr. Barber's death, and from which the foregoing was quoted and condensed, closes with the following tribute to his character:

"In his association with fraternal organizations, he has done all possible for their upbuilding, and for the promotion of fraternal brotherhood, beneficence and social enjoyment; he has ever had the courage of his convictions, and dared to do right, regardless of consequences of a personal nature. His life race is nearly run and he will go hence with gratitude for honors conferred, and with malice toward none."

Mary Jane Meehan Wheaton, wife of Peter J. Barber, was born in New Orleans, La., Oct. 26, 1841, and came to California in 1854. She is the daughter of James and Araminta (Little) Meehan. Her parents were both born in Athlone, Ireland, but came to America in early childhood.

Her father, James Meehan, died during the cholera epidemic of 1847, leaving his wife with two little children, (Mrs. Barber



and her brother.) In 1849 Mrs. Meehan married, second, Benjamin Wheaton, who was born in England, and her two children by her first husband took the name of Wheaton.

The early years of the Rev. Elihu Barber's life were spent in hard work, and some idea of the manner in which the foundations were laid for his long and useful career as an educator may

be gained from a letter written in 1859 by his cousin Sheldon Wright, and quoted elsewhere in this volume. This letter states that Elihu was teaching school in the winter and in the summer working on the farm and occupying his spare time in the study of Greek, Latin and Hebrew. The following in regard to his life is contributed by his granddaughter, Mrs. Fanny Barber Farwell of Orange, Texas :

"In an old scrap-book in which he kept all the items of interest during his long life, I find his license to preach given at Vernon Village by the Presbytery of Oneida Co. the 9th day of Feb., 1837. While preaching at Vernon he edited a pamphlet called, "The Youth's Sermons." The writer has a collection of his sermons and lectures most carefully written by hand, extending over a period of forty years of his active ministry and educational work. On the back of each sermon is date written, place delivered and hymns sung. The following are a few of the places where he was located as pastor: Vernon, N. Y., Durhamville, N. Y., Springport, N. Y., Union Springs, N. Y., Oneida and Norwich, N. Y., Napierville, Ill., 1856, Geneva, Ill., 1860-62, Lake Forest, Ill., 1866. He established a boys' school in Napierville and about 1866 he founded Oakwood Hall, a school for boys at Lake Forest, Ill.

In 1872 he went to Kansas and organized a Presbyterian church at Beattie, Kansas, and preached there until 1875. After being pastor of the Presbyterian church of Union Springs eight years, he built and established Oakwood Female Seminary in the village, raising the money mainly by subscriptions. The "Cauga Telegraph" of Oct. 23, 1850 gave an account of the laying of the corner stone as follows:

"Rev. Barber followed with a few appropriate remarks. His reference to the institution being "founded upon a rock" was beautiful and caused a thrilling response in every heart, as on the site selected a ledge of rock approaches near the surface of the earth and upon this the foundation of the edifice rests. The site for the Seminary is on a rise of ground about 30 rods east of Main street, and just south of Oak Grove. The lot consists of one acre, commanding a most delightful view of the village, the lake and surrounding scenery. The building now being erected is four stories, the basement story of stone and the three upper stories of brick.



"Rev. Barber, who is to preside over the institution, having conceived a noble enterprise, has moved steadily forward in its execution. To him we are mainly indebted for the location of the Seminary in our midst and to his energy and perseverance, with the Divine blessing, we look to see the project carried into successful operation. Mr. Barber is particularly qualified for the duties incumbent on an instructor of the young. He is mild, gentle, firm, unwavering and persevering—of a liberal and conciliatory spirit and is possessed in a high degree of that equanimity of temper essential to the successful government of the school room."

He had associated with him Miss Elizabeth Brewster Hinckley and Sarah J. Hinckley, sisters-in-law.

This Seminary is now a part of the building where W. H. Wood is principal (1907.)

The following is a notice of his lectures taken from a paper of date 1855.

#### EVENING SCIENTIFIC LECTURE.

"The Rev. E. Barber will give a lecture on geology at the Academy on Monday eve the 13th inst., commencing at half-past seven. We insert the above notice with a great deal of pleasure. The lecturer is well known to the community and none will question his ability to treat the subject of geology in an interesting manner."

Extract from another clipping telling how the lecture was received:

"It was throughout very instructive and interesting, being replete with beautiful and original ideas, and we believe gave full satisfaction to all in attendance. Rev. Barber will deliver a lecture on Astronomy at the Academy on Monday evening next."

He was also proprietor and principal of Oakwood, a boarding school for boys, located in Union Springs. It was limited to 40 pupils.

He wrote both prose and poetry for publication, and was also a great advocate of temperance, lecturing on the subject and writing an "Ode to Temperance," which was published from Springport, N. Y., in 1842. The following is one of his poems in lighter vein published in the "Religious Recorder:"



## SUNNY SIDE.

There's many a sunny spot,  
 Amid the wood and dell and grot;  
 Where life is only love;  
 There's many a pleasant gale  
 Filling the wide expanded sail,  
 Descending from above.

There's many a pebbly rill,  
 Soft gliding from the grassy hill,  
 To cool the fevered brow;  
 There's many a leafy bower,  
 Kindly to shield the sun's dread power  
 And freshness to bestow.

There's many a gladsome way  
 Through which life's travelers stray,  
 Nor pain nor ill betides;  
 There's many a fragrant flower  
 Sweetly to cheer the irksome hour,  
 As on its course it glides.

Most of his poems were of a deeply religious tone. The following is a hymn written by him:

"Another Sabbath day has gone

 Are traced upon the page Divine;  
 Not ere will time's corroding power  
 Blot out the words recorded there.

How blest to humble souls the day,  
 That's now forever fled away;  
 Its holy hours have borne on high  
 The secret prayer, the heartfelt sigh.

Sweet Sabbath of our heavenly home,  
 Whose evening hour will never come  
 We wait to greet thy sacred rest  
 And chant the anthems of the blest."





He also wrote a morning hymn, one on Christian resignation, an article on the simplicity of Christian organization.

In 1875 he gave up active work and spent his remaining days with his only son, Charles Augustus Barber of Marysville, Kansas, where he died May 19, 1883. He was buried in Marysville.

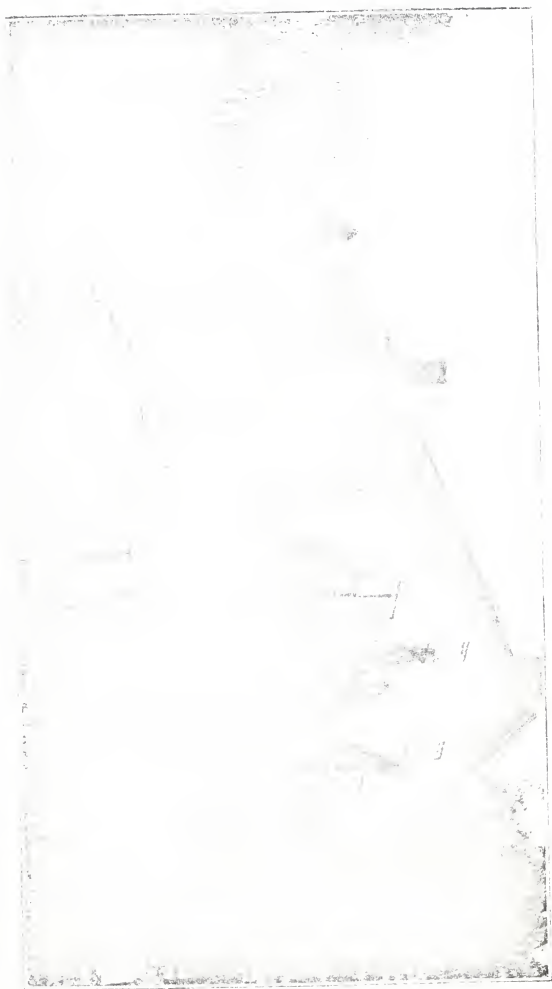

The Ward family is descended from the Northamptonshire family of that name. Thomas Ward, the emigrant, was b. in Kettering, Jan. 13, 1776. He m. in New York City, Mch. 7, 1798, Mary Leishman, dau. of James and Anna (Hayes) Leishman, who belonged to a Highland Scotch family. Thomas Ward came to the town of LeRay, N. Y. with a surveying party under Benjamin Brown, and in 1802 settled and built his log cabin on the banks of Pleasant Creek.

He was the first Town Clerk and Justice of the Peace; was a soldier in the War of 1812, and participated in the battle of Sackett's Harbor. He d. in 1821. Both he and his wife Polly, who d. 50 years later, are buried in the Old Sheepsfold Cemetery in LeRaysville.

James Selah Ward, fourth child of the above family, was 1st Lieut. in Co. D, 10th H. A. of N. Y., and was in the service for nearly four years.

In 1852 he went with the gold seekers to California, making the trip via Cape Horn. On his return he made his home in Carthage, N. Y. until 1882, when he went to Dakota and later to San Diego, Cal., where he now resides. Mr. and Mrs. Ward have no children, but have an adopted daughter, Mary Louise, who m. Frank Wilcox of Pittsburgh, Pa.

The following is quoted and condensed from a very interesting biographical sketch written by Mr. Barber for his children:

"I was prepared for college at the age of 14, but my parents thought I was too young to enter and so kept me at school until I was 16. I therefore read an unusual amount of Latin for a boy preparing to enter college, having read the entire *Aeneid*, the first ten books of it twice, and the first six books at least four times."

"In 1852 I entered Hiram College, from which I graduated in 1856, after which my father sent me to a Commercial College in Cincinnati."

About the year 1860, Mr. Barber removed to a farm near Paxton, Ill. Here for some years he engaged in the hard struggles of a pioneer life, but following his mother's teaching and example, he was active in organizing and maintaining Sunday Schools, and assisting, so far as possible, in the advancement of the community in the better things of life.

In the winter of 1862 he taught a country school and he relates in his sketch, how an old lady, 80 years old, grandmother of one

of his pupils, learned to read, and read the New Testament through the following year. He also gives an interesting account of his work in preparing one of his pupils for college, the boy taking private lessons of Mr. Barber for two years. When he entered college, the young man ranked second in a class of over 100 students, the first place being held by a son of Bishop Thompson.

In the summer of 1866, Mr. Barber removed his family to Saginaw, Mich., and of his later experiences, he wrote as follows:

"That fall I bought a little piece of timber and began logging. The following spring I bought a quarter interest in a saw mill, which was burned the night of the Chicago fire, Oct. 9, 1871, with but little insurance, and that of little value.

"We lost about \$80,000 that night by the fire, and my share of the loss included the purchase of the mill that was burned, which purchase was made in the year 1866, at the then current rate of 10% annual interest. You will remember that in 1866, gold was worth about \$2, and before I got my interest paid up (I was the only one who was required to pay) in full, my interest in the original purchase price of \$33,000, was paid at the rate of over \$102,000 for the whole \$33,000, and it was paid to the last cent, and I am glad to say that I have never compromised any indebtedness in that way, but have always paid one hundred cents on the dollar.

"About one month after the mill burned, Mr. O. D. Chapin and myself bought the Webster mill at Bay City. We had been pretty thoroughly cleaned out by the fire, but our credit was good. George Burrows said, "buy that mill and draw on me for \$10,000 cash payment and pay me when you can." We availed ourselves of his generous offer and had the mill all paid for, including the borrowed money, before, according to the terms of the purchase, it was due.

"Mr. Chapin and I operated that mill for about eight years, when Mr. Chapin died. I continued it for two years longer, wound up the affairs of the firm, sold the mill, divided up the proceeds and came to Duluth in the year 1881."

Mr. Barber remained in Duluth until his death, which occurred in July, 1903.

Dr. Timothy L. Barber was born near Plymouth, Ind. He lived with his parents until 1871, when he went to Marietta, Ohio to live with his kinsman, David Barber. He was graduated from Marietta College in 1877 and from the Medical Dept. of the University of Penn. in 1882.

Directly after his first marriage, he settled in Charleston, W. Va., where he soon became prominent in his profession.

The following sketch of Dr. Barber, appears in the volume "Prominent Men of West Virginia:"

"Timothy Lawrence Barber is a prominent physician and surgeon of Charleston, W. Va. He is the son of Daniel and Ann (Hulverson) Barber.

"The grandfather of Dr. Barber was Timothy Barber who settled at Syracuse, N. Y., when it was but a cross roads. Later, he moved to the West with his family and settled on land where Chicago now stands, but finding it a marshy and unpromising field for farming, he went to the northern part of Indiana and settled in Marshall Co. where he remained some years and where his children continued to live. He went back to New York state, and not long after lost his life in an accident.

"Daniel Barber, the father of Dr. Barber, grew to manhood in Marshall Co., Ind., and owned a moderate estate. He married a daughter of one of the sturdy Norwegian families that settled in that county, and reared a family of six children, of whom Levi





died young. Business misfortunes deprived him of all his belongings in Indiana and he removed to Dodge Co., Wis., living at Mayville, Horieon and Beaver Dam (1864-67). Besides being a farmer in Indiana, he ran a flouring mill, which business he followed in his Wisconsin homes. From Wisconsin he went to Petroleum Center, Penn., to join his brother Levi, who was engaged in refining oil. After a couple of years stay there a disastrous oil fire destroyed the plant and killed his brother Levi. He then went back to Plymouth, Ind., where he died about 1875.

"The only schooling Dr. Barber had was that afforded in the public schools of the various localities where he lived, until through a relative in Marietta, Ohio, he was privileged to receive a college education, graduating at Marietta College in 1877. For the next two or three years he taught school and tutored boys for college, using his spare time in the study of medicine. By dint of perseverance and good fortune he gained a scholarship at the University of Pennsylvania, which gave him all the advantages of this foremost school of America, with no cost but his living expenses. He graduated there in 1882.

"He settled in Charleston, W. Va., where he has risen to be one of the foremost physicians. He has been conspicuously identified with the professional organizations of the city, county and state. He has been president of the city and county boards of health and a member of the State Board of Health. He was an organizer and president of the State Medical Association. He has established a Sanatorium for the private treatment of diseases with electricity, X-rays, massage and baths, having made a specialty of Electro-Therapeutics. He is an elder in the Kanawha Presbyterian church, a Sabbath-school worker, a member of Masonic organizations. In politics an adherent of the Republican party and yet he regards the character of the local government as above any party that may aspire to run it."

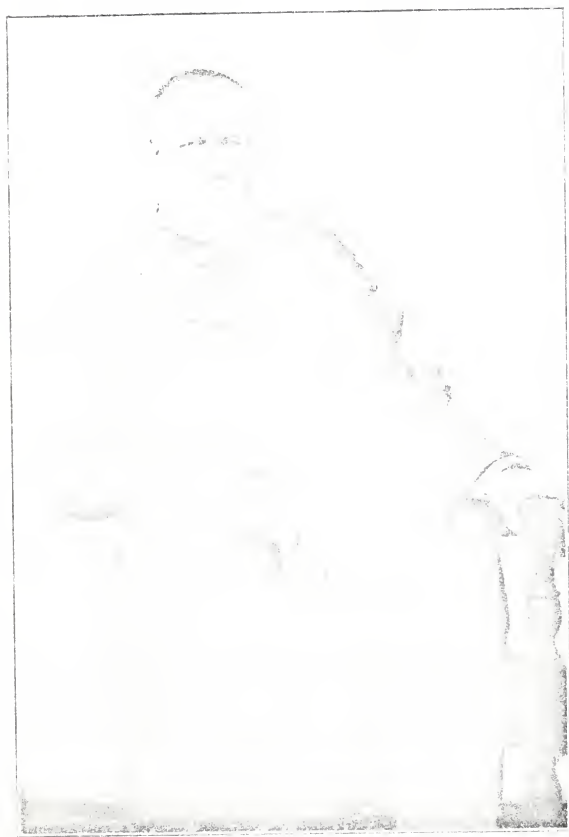

Like many of his ancestors, Mr. White is a typical self-made man. Left fatherless at the age of five years and the only child of a widowed mother, it was but natural that he should early feel life's responsibilities.

After receiving such education as the common school at his home afforded, he took a course at the Jamestown Academy, and for three years engaged in teaching school in the winter and working on the farm in the summer. But from his ancestors in the White family, he had inherited an inclination toward the lumber business, and in 1868-9, in partnership with two brothers by the name of Jenner, he purchased a tract of 200 acres of pine timber near Youngsville, Penn. The young men boarded themselves in the woods, cut the logs and had them sawed at a neighboring saw-mill. In 1870, Mr. White bought out the interest of the brothers Jenner and soon afterward, associated with R. A. Kinnear of Youngsville, he opened a lumber yard in Brady and later, one in Petrolia, both in Penn.



In 1874, they sold these lumber yards and Mr. White removed to Tidioute, Penn., where he bought the Arcade mill, and also opened a lumber yard in Scrubgrass, Penn.

While living in East Brady, Pa., he assisted in establishing the "Warren County News," in Youngsville, Pa., an independent weekly paper, which was later removed to Tidioute and of which he afterward became sole owner and proprietor, and edited the paper in addition to managing his lumber business, a great deal of his editorial work being done at night after the other business of the day was over. Later he sold the paper, and the name was changed to the "Tidioute News."

In 1873, Mr. White returned to Youngsville, and bought a stove, heading and shingle mill. In 1878 he was elected to the Legislature of Penn.

In 1880, at the expiration of his term of office, associated with Messrs. E. B. and J. L. Grandin, Capt. H. H. Cumings, and the late Jahu L. and Livingston L. Hunter, (father and son) all of Tidioute, Penn., he became one of the organizers of the Missouri Lumber and Mining Co.

This Company was one of the pioneer companies in the development of the yellow pine lumber industry. For more than 20 years, its mills and offices were located in Grandin, Mo., the town itself being the product of the lumber company's business. From the date of its organization, Mr. White was Gen. Manager of this company, and some years later, was elected President, which office he still holds.

He was the organizer and first President of the Missouri & Ark. Lumber Association, which was the first organization of Yellow Pine Lumber dealers, and which was later merged into the Southern Lumber Manufacturer's Assn., of which Mr. White was twice elected President.

In 1899, associated with Mr. Oliver W. Fisher and others, he organized the Louisiana Long Leaf Lumber Co., with mills and headquarters in Fisher, Louisiana. He has been Secretary and a Director of this Company since its organization. In 1901, he organized the Louisiana Central Lumber Company, with mills and offices in Clarks and Standard, Louisiana. Of this Company he is President. He is also President of the Forest Lumber



Company, which owns a line of retail yards. He is also General Manager of the Missouri Lumber & Land Exchange, with offices at No. 1111 Long Building, Kansas City, Mo.

In the fall of 1908, President Roosevelt appointed Mr White a member of the National Commission of the Conservation of National Resources. This Commission met in Washington, D. C., early in the year 1909.

Gov. Hadley of Missouri, also appointed him as delegate to the First National Congress for the Conservation of National Resources, which convened in Seattle, Washington, in August 1909.

The greatest factors in Mr. White's success have been a sound judgment and an untiring energy, (frequent heritages in the Barber family,) an extreme resourcefulness and last, but by no means least, a faculty for developing to the fullest extent the capabilities of his employes.

In the midst of his busy life, he has kept alive an interest in educational, philanthropic and religious matters.

For many years he has been much interested in genealogical and historical research, and has collected a valuable library along these lines, and has assisted financially and otherwise in the publishing of a very extended Genealogy of the White family, compiled by Miss Almira L. White of Haverhill, Mass.

Mr. White's lineage through the White family, is as follows :

ROBERT WHITE, Sr., who with wife Alice was living in South Petherton, Eng., in July 1574. She was buried Aug. 22, 1596. He was buried as Robt. White, Senior, Sept. 7, 1600. He was a Church Warden in 1578.

ROBERT WHITE, JR., of South Petherton; was Church Warden in 1601; buried March 8, 1641-2; his wife, Joan, was buried Sept. 13, 1631.

Mrs. White's father, Benjamin B. Siggins, was descended from the Scotch-Irish families of Siggins and Kinnear.

The earliest ancestor of the Kinnear family of whom definite record has been obtained was James Kinnear who with his wife and some of his relatives emigrated from Scotland to Ireland, settling in Londonderry.

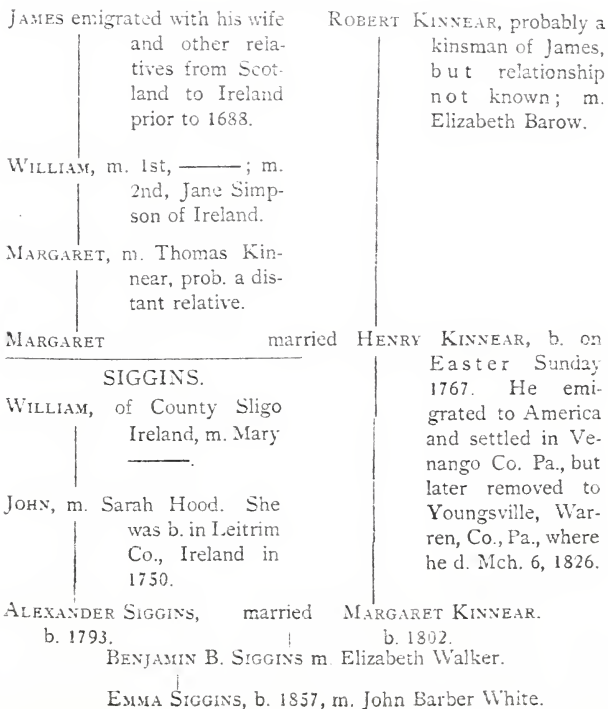




During the Revolution of 1688, the city of Londonderry was surrounded by the enemy and the imprisoned inhabitants suffered for want of provisions. James Kinnear and his wife escaped from the city by different routes and to different places. For seven years they were separated, neither knowing the whereabouts of the other. At the end of this time, it is related that "they happened to meet and were overwhelmed with joy." Many of their descendants emigrated to America.

A synopsis of Mrs. White's Kinnear-Siggins lineage is as follows:

## KINNEAR.





Mrs. White's great-grandfather, John Siggins, came to America in 1793. He d. near Centre Turner, Pa., in April, 1801. His widow subsequently removed with her family to Youngsville, Pa., where she d. in 1835 at the age of 85. She is said to have been a sister of Admiral Hood. That she was possessed of great courage and fortitude is evidenced by the manner in which she bore the struggles and privations of frontier life and cared for her fatherless family. She was a devout follower of John Wesley whom it is said "she revered as a saint."

On her mother's side, Mrs. White is descended from John Walker of Wigton, Scotland, who, in 1702, married Katherine Rutherford and later emigrated to America. Katherine Rutherford was a descendant of the Scottish families of Rutherford and Alleine, to which belonged the celebrated divines, Samuel Rutherford and Joseph Alleine.

John Walker and his wife Katherine settled in Chester Co., Pa., but their son Alexander and other members of the family removed to Rockbridge Co., Va., and among their descendants are many prominent families of Virginia and Kentucky.

Mrs. White's great-grandmother, Elizabeth (Scott) Walker, was the daughter of Samuel Scott, who was a Revolutionary soldier, enlisted at the age of 14 in the Washington Co. (Virginia) militia and participated in the Battle of King's Mountain.

Mrs. White has compiled and published (1902) an extended and very interesting genealogical history of the Walker and allied families.

Dr. John Franklin White, eldest son of the above family, was graduated from the Kansas City High School in the Class of 1894. In the fall of 1895 he entered the University Medical College of Kansas City, where he did two years of excellent work, after which he entered the Missouri Medical College at St. Louis, Mo., (now the Medical Dept. of Washington University,) from which he was graduated in 1898. The following summer he spent in Philadelphia, making a special study of the eye. In the fall of 1898 he was employed as a member of the medical staff of the Hospital Dept. connected with the Missouri Lumber & Mining Co., in Grandin, Mo.

In the fall of 1899, he assumed charge of the Dispensary and Hospital Dept., connected with the Louisiana Long Leaf Lumber Co., in Fisher, La., and was also local surgeon for the Kansas City Southern R. R. While there, on May 9, 1900, he received an accidental gunshot wound, from the effects of which he died in Kansas City on June 11, 1900. He was buried beside his mother in the family burying ground in Youngsville, Penn.

Dr. White was one of those men in whose early death the world loses much, and yet whose short life was lived so fully that the world gained much from it.

Possessed of rare judgment and a stern, unswerving loyalty to truth and right, he yet had an unflinching tenderness and sympathy for suffering and weakness. Particularly was this trait exhibited toward the little children of the laborers, among whom, for the most part, it was his duty to minister, and it won for him such measure of affection as falls to the lot of few men in his profession, even during long years of practice.

On the day of his burial this feeling was most touchingly exhibited in the communities in which "Dr. Frank" had lived and labored, and particularly in one of them which had been most closely associated with his boyhood days and with his professional career, and where the usual expressions of mourning were of more than ordinary significance. But more eloquent than the





closed places of business, the draped doorways, the silent mills or the flag at half-mast, were the closed and silent homes of the laborers, and the absolutely deserted streets, where not even a child played. No one had suggested it, perhaps no one thought of it. It was the spontaneous and voluntary tribute of love to the brave, clean, cheery young life which had gone out from among them. Like Drumtochty when Geordie Howe was stricken, there was but one heart in the little valley of the Ozarks that day, and "it was sair."

Dr. White's father has erected to his memory, a High School Building in the village of Youngsville, Penn. In this building is a beautiful memorial window, the design of which is an arch representing "Character," supported by four massive pillars, "Honesty, Purity, Courage, Love," which were the basic principles of Dr. White's own life.

Mr. George H. Barbour, the father of Edwin S. Barber, has been for more than 35 years a prominent citizen of Detroit, Mich.

The following sketch of his life was obtained too late to be inserted under his own number (2057) in the 7th generation.

"George Harrison Barbour was b. in Collinsville, Conn., June 26, 1843.

"At an early age Mr. Barbour found it necessary to lend his assistance to the business affairs of his father, and during the period when most youngsters of his age were actively engaged in the pursuit of education and pleasure, he devoted himself to procuring such education as the facilities at hand afforded, and to business.

"In 1871, when The Michigan Stove Company was organized, and the office of Secretary was tendered to him. Mr. Barbour promptly accepted the offer, disposed of his interests in the Collinsville business, and removed to Detroit, where he has since resided.



"Much of the success of The Michigan Stove Company is due to his indefatigable efforts and aggressive methods. This company has for many years been recognized as the largest and most progressive of its kind in the world.

"Mr. Barbour has become associated in the interim with many prominent commercial and banking organizations, and possesses the reputation of being most conservative and acute in all matters relating to these branches. He possesses the rare faculty of being enabled to separate the "chaff" from the "wheat," and of connecting himself only with meritorious and successful enterprises. As a banker he is widely and favorably known, and has been conspicuously successful; is the Old School so-called "Cleveland Democrat,"—believes in protection and sound money and conservatism in all matters pertaining to national government. He has not, however, been an active politician, nor a candidate for any office, except once, when during his absence from home, he was nominated, and subsequently elected, on the Democratic ticket, a member of the Board of Aldermen from the Fourth Ward, which normally carried a Republican majority of 175. He was made President of the Board the second year after his election.

"He has frequently been urged to accept the nomination of his party for the office of Mayor of Detroit, but has had so many far-reaching and exacting commercial responsibilities in charge that he did not feel that he could, in justice to himself and his associates, devote the necessary time to the office that a thorough and conscientious administration of its duties demands.

His name has also been mentioned at frequent intervals in connection with the Democratic nomination for Congress from the First District of Michigan, but for similar reasons he has steadfastly refused to authorize its employment in such a connection.

Mr. Barbour was very active in organizing the Detroit Exposition, which in its day was most successful and a great credit to the city and its promoters. He was the first President of the Detroit Board of Commerce, and has, in fact, been more or less prominent and active in the organization and upbuilding of the business and commercial interests of the city. He was the first President of the Michigan Manufacturers' Association, and has always been active in the affairs of the National Association of Manufacturers, of which he was in 1902 Chairman of the



Legislative Committee, in which latter capacity he appeared several times before various Committees of the United States Senate in connection with pending legislation pertaining to the regulation of manufacturers, and more especially in connection with the consideration of a measure then pending in reference to making eight hours a legal days work for labor.

"Mr. Barbour was a member of the National Commission of the World's Fair held in Chicago in 1893, and was President of the Michigan Commission to the Pan-American Exposition in Buffalo in 1901. In the latter capacity he enjoyed the unique distinction of returning to the State Treasury, after the Exposition was over and all expenses of the Commission paid, a sum something in excess of ten thousand dollars of the original appropriation of fifty thousand dollars. It was admitted at the time to be a procedure entirely without precedent.

"Mr. Barbour is at present 1st Vice President and General Manager of The Michigan Stove Company, President of the Ireland & Matthews Mfg. Co., of Detroit, Director of the Peoples State Bank, Vice President and Director of the Dime Savings Bank, and Director of the Michigan Fire & Marine Insurance Company.

"In 1906, Mr. Barbour with others, organized The Michigan Copper & Brass Company, of which corporation he is the President. This new enterprise was successful from the first, and is to-day one of the foremost of the newer manufacturing enterprises of Detroit."

## INTRODUCTION

The Compiler of this work was led by tradition and the similarity of Christian names to believe that John Barber of Worcester was a descendant of Captain George Barbour of Dedham and Medfield, and perhaps son of Deacon John Barbour and his wife Mary (Ellis) Partridge. Over a thousand letters were written to the descendants of John of Worcester, but not one of those written to confirmed or contradicted the belief, or could tell the family name of his wife Lydia. After a search of four years the Compiler found the marriage of John Barber to Lydia Stimpson in Boston, Oct. 7, 1736, and he now believes that John was born in Boston, June 30, 1714, son of Thomas and Elizabeth Barber (Barbour). The ancestry of Thomas has not been traced, but could probably be found by a diligent search of early Boston records. Thomas and Elizabeth had the following children and perhaps others:—Thomas, born July 12, 1704; Ruth, born Feb. 15, 1705; Thomas, born Oct. 7, 1709; Hannah, born Aug. 31, 1712; and John, born June 30, 1714.

There is some reason for believing that Thomas was son of Thomas and Mary Barbour of Boston, who are known to have had the following children:—Ruth, born Feb. 4, 1679; John, born Feb. 14, 1680; Mary, born Feb. 25, 1682; Joseph, born July 3, 1686; and Elizabeth, born Oct. 8, 1688.
