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PREFACE

This Manuscript gives names of three lines of ELLSWORTHS who originally came to America from England and settled in Connecticut, Massachusetts and New York. All data here given were compiled and typed under the direction of German E. Ellsworth and his wife, Mary, with no names or dates added after 1917.

The CONNECTICUT ELLSWORTHS originated with JOSIAH, who was born in 1629 in England and came to Windsor, Connecticut in 1646. The genealogy of certain lines of Josiah's descendants has been published in printed form in the book "OUR ELLSWORTH ANCESTORS" as compiled by German E. Ellsworth and his wife, Mary, and edited by John Orval Ellsworth. Lines given in the book were brought to 1956 and were carefully indexed. The book contains many, but not all, names given in the first three hundred pages of this manuscript. The book contains many names not appearing here.

The MASSACHUSETTS ELLSWORTHS originated with JERIMIAH, who was born about 1626 in England. Our record gives no date of his arrival in America. He settled at Rowley, Massachusetts. The record of this line is given on pages 300 to 360.

The NEW YORK ELLSWORTHS originated with CHRISTOPHER, who was born in England previous to 1620 and lived for a time in Holland before coming to America about 1650. The record of this line begins with page 361 and continues to page 527.

The entire manuscript as here given came to my attention in 1955. I suggested to German E. Ellsworth that I prepare an index of all names. First, about 4500 given names of Ellsworths were alphabetized with the page where the name appears. After each name is a digit designating the generation from JOSIAH. Second, all names other than <u>Ellsworth</u> were alphabetized with the given name and page listed. There are about 4650 entries in this portion of the index.

THE ELLSWORTHS OF WINDSOR, CONNECTICUT JOSIAH ELSWORTH. GEN. I.

I. #1. Josiah Elsworth was born in 1629 and if he came to Windsor in 16h6 he could have been but 17 years of age at that time. It seems very probable that he came with his father, John, but what became of the latter there is no record. The first authentic record we have of Josiah is his marriage, November 16, 1654 (o.s.) to Elizabeth Holcomb, March 19, 1654 (o.s.) he bought of Alex. Alford six acres of land including a house. He was made a freeman by the Court, May 21, 1657. He saw an opportunity to make a little money as the following record shows:

"At a particular court March 4, 1657, Josias Elsworth complained of Nicholas Palmer for giving cyder to the Indians." He was found guilty and fined 4L, one-third of which went to Josias.

Josias served on the jury at a quarterly court held March 2, 1664/5; a county court held March 4, 1668/9; a county court held March 2, 1671/0; he was on the jury at an adjourned county court held January 7, 1675, at a county court held April 21, 1675. (From records of the Secretary of State's office, Hartford.)

His first house lot was the one he bought of Alex. Alford, March 19, 1654; this was on the road which crosses the present road to Poquonock, just above the mill brook, a little west of the latter road and on the south side of the street. He lived there apparently until 1658 when he sold the place to Cornelius Gillet and bought a house lot to build on from William Phelps, Jr. His second home was a little farther north on a road running east from the Poquonock road to the rivulet. In March 1664/65 he bought of Joanna Davison what has since been known as the Ellsworth Homestead on the east side of the road leading to Windsor Locks about a mile above the present (1900) Ferry Road, but below the old original Ferry Road. This place is what is now known as the Chief Justice Ellsworth house. After Josiah's death in 1689 this property went to his son, Josiah. The land he owned was as follows:

1. Four months after his marriage, March 19, 1654 (o.s.) he bought of Alex. Alford his dwelling house and home lot. This is his first purchase of land on record. The lot contained "6 æres more or less and was in breadth 18 rods, bounded west northwest by Jonathan Gillet, and is in length 52 rods; east southeast by Thomas Barber and is there in breadth 66 rods; north northeast by Jonathan Hellier; south southwest by ye mill brook." This lot he sold to Cornelius Gillet.

2. "6 acres of swamp on ye mill brook in length by ye brook four score rods, in breadth at the south end twelve rods, in the midst 24 rod, bounded south by John Drake, every other way else by the common." This was sold to Nicholas Sention.

3. The woodland 42 acres; in length six score rod, in breadth fifty seven rod, bounded south by James Eno in part, the other part by Bray Rossiter, north by Thos. Bascombe, east by the Rivulet on the south and turn away a scan by the end of Long Meadow. This was sold to Brown.

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4. "One parcel, joyning to the five acre lotts, in quantity five acres more or less, in length one hundred rodd, bounded north by a highway in part, the otherpart by Willin Phelps Senier, south by Richard Saxton, east by a highway, west by Saml Phelps.

5. "February 17, 1658, he bought of Wm. Phelps, Jr., one acre and upward to build upon, in part of his building lot about 13 rods square; bounded south by highway, every way else by Wm. Phelps."

6. "By gift of the towne, twenty acres of woodland as it was formerly bounded out to Saml. Phelps in bredth sixty rodd, in length eighty rodd and bounded west by land of Josias, south by the land of Wm. Phelps, north by the land of Simon Mills, east by the common."

7. "By purchase of Richard Saxton, 5 acres and 3/4 of wood land; in breadth nine rodd one quarter, in length 100 rodd, bounded north by land of James Eno, west by land of Wm. Phelps Jr., east by a highway.

8. "Four acres of woodland in breadth fourteen rodd, bounded north by land that was Saml. Ponds, south by land that was John Brotons, east by the common."

9. "Josiah Elsworth hath a parcell of land granted by the committee of the Court, Mr. Mathew Allyn and Mr. Henry Clark, at Massacoa (now Simsbury) on the west side of the river at a place called the Calves tongue; northwest it bounds by the land of John Gillet five rod, and then turned northward by a brook that runs between it and the land of John Gillet down to

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the river, northerly it bounds by the river according to the run of it, then runs south southwest bounding by the common upland four score and four rods in length; southwest it bounds by the common, in breadth ten rods; a brook running through it and is in quantity sevenacres and a half or less. This granted to Josiah by the committee abouve sd. was June 24, 1662." Sold this to Saml. Wilcoxon December 3, 1669.

10, 11, 12, 13. March 18, 1665, he bought of Joanna Davison, widow of Nocholas Davison of Charlestown, Massachusetts, the following parcels. These were paid for in annual instalments and on the records in the Secretary of State's office is the acknowledgment of so many bushels of wheat at so much per bushel as the annual payment on said land. This land was formerly of Francis Stiles and was sold by him to Robert Saltonstall who in turn disposed of it to Nicholas Davison.

The house lot bounded west on the highway, north on Wm. Gaylord and south by Jno. Stiles; "also on the west side of the street in breadth as aforesaid, north as aforesaid, south in part by Thos. Hopewell and in part by the lands of Rocky Hill; also four acres of meadow more or less butting against the house lot, north by Wm. Gaylord, south by the meadow of Henry Stiles, easterly by the brook according as it runs to the river and by the river more or less" "also on the east side of the river as it is in estimation in quantity fifteen hundred acres more or less and bounds west by the Great River, in breadth sixty rods and runs easterly in length three miles and reckined to be the

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four hundred four hundred and fourty four rods more or less; bounded north by land of Abraham Randall, south by land of Thos. Koskins."

The original deed of which the above are the records was as follows: "Bee it knowne by these psnts yt. I Joanna Davison Relict & sold Excecitrix unto nicholas davison Deceased for & in consideration of Eaghty pounds to me in hande payd; hath given granted bargined & solde By these Psents do give grant bargin and sell unto Josyas Elsworth of Winsor in newingland; all yt her dwelling house in wonsor upon connectycot formerly the posesyon of Francis Stiles of Winsor & after him Robbertt Saltenstalls; together with all her out houses & purtynances & all her Lands there unto belonging vis.

He owned over 2000 acres of land. There were three forts, according to tradition, enclosed with palisades, one was the Ellsworth Fort and was inhabited by Sgt. Josiah Elsworth and for 40 or 50 years the women and children slept in them of nights, after settlement of the place, for the inhabitants were in dread of the Indians.

That he was a man of considerable means for those days appears from Town List made in 1675 for raising money to support the Rivulet Ferry; he was in the highest class; i.e., "those having a family, a horse and four oxen." He was connected with the militia, as he appears on the town records as Sergeant. He died August 20, 1689 age 60 and was buried in Old Windsor Cemetery. The inscription is as follows: Sargtent Josiah Elsworth, Aged 60 years, He dyed August 20th day, Ano: 1689.

His will was probated November 11, 1689. Judging from the inventory of his estate, he must have been a weaver, value of his property 655 ± 15 s. His will is not in his handwriting and the signature is only a scrawl. The seal is a small piece of lead about a quarter of an inch in diameter, affixed to the will just above the signature. On the back of the inventory is pasted the ages of the children.

I. JOSIAH ELSWORTH, born in England, 1629, died August 20, 1689 Age 60 years in Windsor, Connecticut. Estate 655L. His name appears first when he married November 16, 165h to Elizabeth Holcomb, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth Holcombe of Windsor. They lived in what is now Poquonock. The date of her birth was 163h, probably in Dorchester, Massachusetts. Her parents lived there until 1635 when they removed to Windsor, Connecticut, where all their children except her sister Mary and herself were born. She became a member of the Windsor Church September 2h, 1666. She died September 18, 1712. Their children, all born in Windsor, Connecticut, were:

#1 II. JOŠIAH (son of Josiah I) born December 5, 1655, baptised March 7, 1657, married 30 October 1679 Martha Gaylord "Josias 24 yrs. old, Martha in her 20th yr." At his father's death he came into possession of the homestead and land on the east side of the street in Old Windsor, where they dwelt. He was chosen constable of the town, December 15, 1696. In 1704 he was chosen fence viewer for the south side. He received a deed of land on the east side of the river from his father-in-law Samuel Gaylord about 16 rods w. which he left to his three sons; the rest of the Gaylord land and part of Josias land came into the possession of Thomas Elsworth and was left to his children. Wm. Elsworth bought the rest of Josiah's land and sold it to Dan Pratt and others. The homestead on the west side of the

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river Josiah also left to his three sons. He died May L, 1706.

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The inventory of his estate was taken June 27, 1706, appraised at 377 L. His will was made April 19, 1706.

His wife was Martha Gaylord, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth Hull Gaylord of Windsor. Martha was born and baptized June 24, 1660. Her father was second son of Wm. of Dorchester, Mass. She died 1721 prior to April 22 (Saml.) Was a Congregationalist, born about 1620 in England and came first to Massachusetts, afterwards to Windsor, Conn. Married Elizabeth Hull, December 4, 1646 and died 1689. (Sometimes Gaillard)

II. ELIZABETH (daughter of Josiah I), born November 11, 1657, baptized March 7, 1658. She married December 23, 1680 Lieut. Nathaniel Loomis of Windsor, son of Nathaniel and Elizabeth (Moore) Loomis. He was born March 20, 1657 and died September 29, 1733. She died 1743. He bought land on the east side of the river in 1689 and lived in what is now South Windsor. He was commissioned Lieut. in 1707. No children.

II. MARY (daughter of Josiah I), born May 7, baptized May 9, 1660. She married December 23, 1680 Sgt. Daniel Loomis, son of Dea. John and Elizabeth (Scott) Loomis. He was born June 16, 1657. She died before 1713 and he married second, widow Hannah Drake. He died June 25, 1740. They lived in Old Windsor. Children of Daniel and Mary Elsworth Loomis:

II. MARTHA (daughter of Josiah I), born December 7, baptized December 13, 1662; married in 1690/1 Sgt. John Osborn as second wife. She joined the church in Windsor in 1689. She died May 1751. John Osborn was born January 10, 1645, married October 14, 1669 Abigail Eggleston by whom he had ten children. She died July 30, 1689. He owned land s. of Job Ellsworth and owned a large tract of land above Namerick, (prior Brook) where he dwelt.

The "Burges lot" and the "Priot lot" he left to his wife Martha, also the new house above Namerick, to go to her two sons Jacob and Isaac after her death. His place was the last house on the N. which belonged to Mr. Edwards parish, and marked the Windsor settlement at the time. He died between March 9 and April 10, 1706, the dates of his will and settlement.

II. THOMAS (son of Josiah I) born September 2, 1665, baptized September 9, 1666, married about 1695-6 to Sara Mills, daughter of Simon and Mary (Buell) Mills. Sara born September 16, 1670, married after July 24, 1691. (See Simon Mills Family p. 121-122 of Goodwin & Morgan Gen. Sarah Mills Ells. was deceased at time of March 25, 1719 when Thos. Ells worth signed the agreement for settlement of Simon Mills estate.) 12

Thomas owned a house and lot in Old Windsor where he dwelt until 1707, when he bought from John Bissell a tract of land at Scantic, bound south on Watson, e. on the Commons, n. on John Gaylord and Birge, with house and orchard. This was his homestead and he kept it till his death. The year before, 1706 he bought land from Samuel Gaylord's and Josia Elsworth Jr.'s heirs, extending from the Great River to the Commons. He bought land also of David Bissell, his brother John and John Pricr. He was chosen collector for Windsor Jan. 31, 1698 and lister in 1705. He was a Sgt. as early as 1722 in the train band. In 1709 he was associated with his brother John in the difficulty concerning the Massachusetts and Connecticut boundary line, at the instigation probably of Gov. Saltonstall which was settled at last by the State. He was a carpenter by trade. He died September 26, 1750. The inventory of his property mentions the children:

II. JONATHAN (LIEUT.) (son of Josiah I) born June 28, 1669. June 22 according to Bible record in David's family. Baptized July 4, 1669. He married October 26, 1693 to Sarah Grant. He became one of the prominent men in affairs of Windsor, and held

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many public offices; fence viewer, surveyor, constable, lister, townsman. In 1713 one of a committee on Indian claims, chosen one of a committee in 1719/20 to consider disputes about highways, and also on a comm. on Western lands. In 1722 one of a comm. to inquire about powder, and also to let the ferry at Scantic.

He was connected actively with the militia being appointed ensign in May 1713, and Lieut. in May 1726. He was also at one time Capt. of a troop of horse. He seems to have been interested in milling, as in 1702 in March 10, he with Joseph Owen and Samuel Osborn, were given liberty of setting up a saw mill on e. side of the Great River on a brook known as "Great Brook" on the E side of Scantic K. with privilege of cutting logs for 20 years, provided the mill was built within one and a half years.

In December 1709 the town granted liberty to Jonathan Elsworth, Thomas Marshal and Thos. Moore to erect a grist mill on the brook known as Mill Brook provided the mill be built within two years. He was one of the proprietors of Barkhampstead in 1732. He, at one time, kept a tavern and the ferry at Scantic. In his traditions of Windsor in 1802, Oliver Ellsworth, Jr. writes that "Lieut. Jno. E. lived across the street in an old house that has been torn down, upon the spot where his grandson Lieut. David now lives. Jno. there kept a tavern for many years, had a small store of West India goods, rum, etc. and besides concerned in different branches of business. I have heard my father (Gliver) say that he was a man of as good sense as any in the neighborhood,

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and besides the greatest, or one of the greatest wits the country afforded; celled Hector Ellsworth.

His death was caused by being thrown from a horse, when riding in Windsor Street, after which he lived only a few days, although about 80 years he was possessed of a strong constitution and was a very tall and large man."

He is buried in Windsor Cemetery and the inscription on his monument is: "Here Lyes the Body of Lieut. Jonathan Elsworth who died Sep. the 13th, 1749. In ye 81st year of his age."

His wife was Sarah Grant, daughter of Tahan and Hannah (Palmer) Grant, and a granddaughter of Mathew Grant. She was born in Windsor and baptized September 19, 1675. She died November 9, 1755 and is buried in Windsor. Children of Sarah and Jonathan:

#7 II. JOHN (son of Josiah I), born October 7, baptized October 15, 1671. Married December 9, 1696 Esther White of Hatfield, daughter of Daniel, who d. Hartford, Conn. and Sarah Crow, of Hatfield, Mass. Esther White d. Sept. 7, 1766 age 95 years. He died October 26, 1720.

He inherited with his brothers Job and Benj. all the land owned on the E. side of the river except what he gave to Jno. and Thos. a farm on Scantic 60 rods w. and 160 rods 1. on which side of his lot they should choose. They selected the north side and divided the 60 acres between them equally. He bought land of his brothers. He must have lived there before 1694 as he owned a pair of oxen and a pair of horses with gear as appears

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from court record, action for replevin of the same impounded by Thos. Abby damage of 10 pounds.

According to tradition handed down through the family. he built the Ellsworth homestead on the west side of/Main Street, just before his marriage to Esther White and that they commenced housekeeping there in December 1696. Originally it consisted of four rooms and perhaps a hall. At the time of John's death there was a parlor used as a bedroom the great room at the south end which was the living room, dining room and kitchen, all in one; the parlor chamber the east chamber, the east garret, the west garret and cellar. The lean-to in rear was built 1726-28 as the 2nd John Elsworth's acct. book shows entries of considerable building material, such as shingles, clapboards, etc., also for hauling a hearthstone. The ell on the southside was built before Capt. John's death in 1784. The house went to Frederick at the death of his father in practically the same condition, except a small ell in the rear of the kitchen. Papers and sermons of Rev. Timothy Edwards were found in a storeroom over the kitchen in this house. Milton Bancroft tore down this house to build his new one in 1860.

John seems to have been a very prominent man in the town, and at his death was the wealthiest man on the E. side of the river. His services to the town began with the office of hay warden, to which he was chosen January 31, 1696. In 1700 he was appointed one of a committee "to dispose of turpentine trees already bored in our town bounds." In 1701 chosen "Haward and brander at the common pound on the east side of the river."

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His first child was baptized by Mr. Edward, pastor of the church on the E. side of the river, 1699. He was chosen one of the first committee of the society to order their affairs. In 1701 he was one of the building committee of the new church. In 1702 he was inspector of the County List. December 8, 1709 he was chosen Constable in those days the most important office in the town. In 1712 he, with Col. Mathew Allyn, Capt. Timothy Thrall, Maj. Roger Walcott, and Sgt. John Elsworth were appointed Comm. to lay out that part of the land that was purchased of the natives, in the year 1636, besides on everal other committees. His most noted service was one perhaps more to the state than to the town, and came out of the dispute between Massachusetts and Connecticut about the boundary line then running between Enfield and Windsor. This line was run too far down the river by the surveyors of Massachusetts known as the "Woodward and Saffrey" line. This led to numerous disputes between the Colonies, and several ineffectual attempts were made to adjust it. It finally led to an appeal to the "Crown" but with no success. The disputed strip was about 2 miles wide, /on the E. side of the river being claimed by both Enfield and Windsor. There seems to have been a private understanding between him and the Gov. (Saltonstall) to commit some act on the land claimed by Enfield, that would bring the matter to a close. His brother Thomas appears to have been with him in this enterprise and seem to have set fires in the wilderness or commons of Enfield. The trial was held inNorthampton Co. of Hampshire, Mass. for tresspass 3d. of March 60 21, 1709-10, damages were awarded to

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Obadiah Abby and others to the amount of 50 L h0 s for cost of Court. On May 14, 1712 Gov. Saltonstall called the attention of the General Assembly "to indemnify the Elsworth's of Windsor by the colony, from the damage they may have received by the judgment granted against them by the Inferior Court in Hamp. relating to the line. He was taken and imprisoned at Springfield, Mass., for the sum of 50 1. 2 s. which amount was sent by the Gov. from the Treas. and sent to Elsworth, whereby he was released from prison. Copy of the execution, and said Elsworths receipt were put into the custody of the Secy. and ordered to be carefully preserved." The next year 1713 the boundary matter was settled by compromise, Massachusetts retaining Enfield and Suffield, but conveying to Connecticut 105,793 A. of land as equivalent for encroachment S. of the agreed boundary. He was appointed one of a committee in March 1715 to know the bounds between Windsor and Enfield. He was one of the largest land-holders in Windsor. He received of his father's estate, according to the will, the N. part of what was left of the 1500 A lot on the E. side of the R. He bought of Nathan Porter a wood swampt near Podunck, bounded s. on Edward Elmor, N. on Thos. Long etc. He bought land from Joseph Bull 1709 of Hartford, 100 A. etc. This was probably in Union. He also bought of Hezekia Oomis a piece 3 mi. long and 30 rds. w. bounded w. on the conn. R. etc. also another piece 3 mi. long and 10 rds.w. bounded E. on the commonds and W. on the R. and N. on Walter Gaylord and Richard Oldage. A strip 3 m. long and 16 rd. w. of Jacob Drake b n. on land of Henry Stiles. Of Asahel Strong his share of 75 a.

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bounded W on the R. N. by Mr. Hewitt and S. by Danl. Wells. Also a strip of land 3 mi. 1 by $38\frac{1}{2}$ rds. w from Thomas Strong bounded S. by Eliahim Marshall, N. by Asahel Strong, W. by R. all in 1713. These last 2 pieces he sold to John Devotion. The Gen. Court at May session 1715 gave a quit claim deed to Col. Mathew Allyn, Roger Wolcott, Esq. Timothy Thrall and Jno. Elsworth in trust for themselves and such others as they saw fit, a tract of land 6 mi.sq. to be called Tolland.

Tradition states that John and his sons Daniel and John used to come out to Ellington on Monday morning with their oxen and cart, and remain during the week to improve their place, returning to Windsor on Saturday. One Saturday p.m. the father told the boys to pull some turnips and put into the cart, while he would go down to the marsh and fell a tree. Having done so, and their father failing to return as expected, they went to look for him. They found the tree had fallen upon him and killed him. Taking the oxen and stone boat they drew their father's body to the shanty they had built on the east side of the Great Marsh, where one remained on guard during the long night and the other returned to the settlement on the river for assistance. A stone on the farm marks the spot with the inscription: "Lieut. John Ellsworth was killed here by the fall of a tree, Oct. 26, 1720, aged 49 years and 15 days." As far as can be learned from the records, there was no family living within the limits of Ellington, prior to this date. His wife Esther died September 7, 1766, aged 95 years. His children (all mentioned in the distribution of his Est. Feb. 5, 1722, Inv. amounted to 11778-04-06,

Hannah Smith, her mother, was a stepdaughter of Jeremiah Elsworth of Rowley (see his rec.) who was an uncle of Job, and Mary was an aunt of Gov. Jonathan Trumbull, "Bro. John." (See Trumbull family.) Mary Trumbull was born March 28, 1675 in Suffield, Conn. and died in W indsor September 15, 1710. Job and John Elsworth each received from their father's estate 700 acres, or over, of land east of the Conn. river as their portion. On this, Job in 1722 assessed 3 A. for a house lot, 22 A. in meadow (his portion west of the road) and 49 A. upland, which was probably the amount of cleared land E. of the highway. (See John Elsworth's record for disc. of the land.)

In Gov. Talcott's notes taken from the Minutes of the Council, it says "July 12, 1724, an alarl at Turkey Hills went forth from Windsor under command of Capt. Wolcott and Lieut. Elsworth, 5 centinels one day" which was probably Job. He married second October 25, 1710, Sarah Clark, widow of John Clark of Farmington; and daughter of Elizabeth Grant and Robt. Warner of Middleton,

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Conn. Sarah was born March 6, 1670; died November 9, 1755. (Anc. Windsor Rec.) According to the Inventory of Job's estate he was a weaver. He resided in E. Windsor, and died September 29, 1751; his will, dated September 5, 1750 and Prov'd November 5, 1751, which says: "I, Job Elsworth of Windsor - to my wife Sarah Elsworth I give 100 L in money, and the use and improvements of all land on the E. side of the Scantic, running E. 1. mi. during her widowhood; to my son Benjamin all my land between the Ct. River and the westermost branch of the Scantic River, he paying 6 L money yearly, of ye old tenor, unto 'his honored mother in law! during her widowhood: to my dau. Hannah Strong 50 L; to my dau. Elizabeth off the N. side of my home lot 35 acres, to be at Scantic river 15 rods wide running E. 1. mil; to my 5 grand children, viz: Job, John, William, Hugh Jr. and Benoni Thompson all the remainder of the land in the farm not divided after my widows decease. After the decease of my widow the buildings to be appraised and value to be divided in equal shares to the 5 above grandchildren. Job having the upper house, and John the lower house and barn, paying to the other three brothers their proportion according to the appraisal in cash to be paid in 1 year after their possession thereof. I give to David Skinner 10 L in money. To my three children, viz .: Benjamin, Hannah and Elizabeth Elsworth, all ye remainder of my right unto common lands yet undivided to be an equal share according to quality and quantity. My son Benjamin Elsworth,

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and my son in law Jonathan Strong are to be my executors to this my last will and testament.

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(signed) Job Elsworth In presence of: Samuel Grant Alexander Gaylord Ebenezer Grant

Adm. acct. was rendered March 9, 1753 and approved. The court gave orders to Moses and Eben Grant, David Bishop and John Elsworth to distribute the Est. of Capt. Job Elsworth late of Windsor according to the will, March 9, 1753 (Hartford Pro. Rec.) Land E. and W. of the Scantic 9016 L 10s-0d. and 119 a. extra and 136 L money, was distributed to the 3 heirs to said Est. each recd. 77 L Ols-08d. and Benjamin recd. a pair of looms of 11 sley and harness, a guilling wheel and swifts, and guill box, a watch, loose coat and woolen breeches valued at 77 L-04s.; to Hannah alias Strong 77 L Ol 10 d; to Elizabeth Thompson 77 L 2s 06 d. A lot of Job's lands after above distribution was made to Benjamin 40 A 2 & 15 rods.on the N. bounded by Capt. John Elsworth: to Elizabeth Thompson 40 2 A. 10 rds., on Hannah Strong on the S. who recd. 37-3/4 A. 8 rds. bounded on land dist. to Elizabeth and S. on Bissell's land. In E. Windsor land transferred is a deed signed, in 1769, by all the Thompson grandchildren, except Wm. All of Job's children were by his first wife:

The heirs of Josiah Jr. sold a tract of land 20 rods and 13 ft. wide, extending from the Ct. river to the Commons to Thomas Elsworth in 1700 and they probably went to Stamford. Conn. or Hemptstead. L. Is. where they seem to have become connected with the Woods and Stricklands. John Strickland and Jonas Wood were on the charter of Hempstead in 1644, and the Dutch authorities of New Amsterdam in 1653 appointed John Strickland to administer the law of Hempstead in 1653, which was settled by English colonists who had previously settled at Wethersfield or Stamford, Conn., and they became freeholders and shared in the division of the land. Later, many of these colonists' names are found in records in Uls. & Dutchess Cos. and Josias Elsworth (called by Ruttenber "James") was the first purchaser in the "Harrison Patent" in 1716, and is assessed on 12 L Personal and Real Est. Jan. 11, 1726, 1728-29, at the rate of 72 pence; and Moses Elsworth was taxed 3 L Est. in 1729, both in the Prec. of the Highland. (Uls. Co. Clks. Off.) In 1738 in the "List of the Foot Co. of the Precinct of the

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Highlands," under Capt. Thomas Ellison, is Josias, Moses, and James Elsworth (Colonial Series, Vol. II.) The "Francis Harrison Patent," 1713-14 is described as in Albany Co., W. of the Hudson River (was land granted to Capt. John Evans). In 1720 it was described as on the W. side of Paltz Creek in Uls. Co., according to Ruttenber and Woolsey, the Prec. of the Highlands included land now embraces along the Hudson river of Marlboro, Platekell, Newburgh, and New Windsor then called in Ulster Co., N. Y. The name of his wife is found at the baptism of their daughter and his is Josia. 25

They were members of Rev. Edwards church and he was appointed on a committee with Wm. and Job Elsworth August 11, 1741 on a petition to Rev. Edwards. His wife was of Welch descent (her

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maternal grandparents being Simeon and Rebecca Booth). She was a second cousin of Gen. Ethan Allen, and of Col. Abenezer Allen. both of Revolutionary fame and service inVermont. Her father John Allen is said to have come from Deerfield, Mass., about 1690. and located on the farm in Enfield first allotted to Tehan Grant which was forfeited by him for non-settlement. About 1696 he removed and settled on the Saltonstall farm on King St. which farm extended westward nearly or quite to the Connecticut river. The farm has remained in the Allen family to this day. (See Allen Memorial and Hist. of Enfield II, p. 1589.) "Elizabeth Allen, the dau. of John Allen and Bridgett, his wife, was born August ye 21, 1698." (See Gen. of Samuel Allen of Windsor.) Caleph Hendee relates: "My great grandfather Ellsworth was a large man, bony and extremely muscular and athletic, said to be a match for any man in the country when in his prime. He was more than six feet high and well made. He engaged, with no other weapon than an axe, a bear in the woods and killed it alone; and brought it home. It weighed 18 score. His Christian name I never knew. His wife was a small woman, and short of stature; her maiden name I have forgotten but believe it was Allen. They had several sons and at least one daughter, Elizabeth." "Sheldon's Hist. of Suffield" says: At the first meeting of Suffield under Ct. jurisdiction, on Dec. 4, 1749, "It was voted to allow rates (rebate of taxes) to James Smith and Samuel Elsworth." He named his wife Hannah and his four children and says: I give unto my three daughters, "Abigail Ellsworth", Mary Allin and Hannah Allin all the remainder of my moveable estate. Alex.

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Allyn was Scotch, his father Alex. Sr., was an extensive merchant in Windsor connected in trade with the Berlands of Boston, and married Mary Grant of Windsor, who died "aged" 29 August 1703. He married second Elizabeth Allyn (daughter of Hon. John of Windsor) in 1704, December 21. She survived him and married second John Gardner of Gardners' Is., in 1710. Children:

#26 III. BENJAMIN (son of Job II) was born in Windsor, Conn. October 1, 1696, married Fanny (also written "Fennetje"). According to Job Ellsworth's will made in 1750 she was the daughter of his second wife Sarah and John Clark (her first

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husband, who died October 6, 1709) for his will says that "Benjamin shall pay unto his 'honored mother in law' 6L yearly in ye old tenpr", besides the 100 L he already leaves to her. Benjamin was a weaver by trade like his father for he took the weavers outfit on his share in the distribution of his father's estate. 36

We learn from MMS. records of the Luth. Ch. of N. Y. in the Gen. Soc. Library (called Burhans Collec.) that Benjamin's wife was "Fanije" (Dutch records) and they lived in Ulster County in 1715 where their son Samuel was born at a place called "Juffrous Hock," which is located according to a description given in a deed to Hugh Wentworth 1750 as being "in the long reach on the great river (Hudson), called in Indian "Magat Ramis." A map of Claude J. Lanthier in 1779 depicted it as being a little south. and opposite of Poughkeepsie, near the mouth of a small creek. Edward Beer's map, 1891, gives it as at "Blue Point" (now), which was in the Platz district. In 172h to 1729 he was taxed as a freeman and freeholder in "the Highland Prec." with his cousinJosias. Nothing further in N.Y. is found of him as yet, between this date and the Revolutionary time. It is possible that he may have returned to his Conn. Home, as the Windsor records indicate: he was to be the executor of his father's will which would indicate his presence at that time, 1750-53; after which he probably disposed of the land "east of the Ct. river and between it and the Scantic" and returned to Ulster Co., N.Y. where Samuel and others of his children were living. He signed

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the "Articles of Association" in New Paltz with other relatives, May 10, 1775, as freemen and freeholders (Uls. Co. Hist.) He served in the militia of Uls. Co. and served in State troops as Sgt. under Capt. Peleg Ransom of New Faltz/under Col. Cantine (Roberts N.Y. in Rev. p. 196 and 367, Ed. 1887) Fernows Arch., Vol. 0, p. 316. It is reasonable to suppose that Fanny was the mother of his family of children given in the Windsor Recs. and the records of N.Y. give her in each instance as being the mother of Samuel, Rebecca and Elinor - thus "Benjamin Elesworth and Fanije z.h.v." (his wife, in Dutch) also were wit. June 6, 1727 for Rebecca, daughter of Josia 3 and Margaret Elsworth in the Highlands. This leads to the supposition that his children may have all been born in New York. No record of their death is found, but he was living in New Paltz in 1790 with a family, some of whom were undoubtedly grand children. We find as his children:

He married February 8, 1733 in North Kingstown, Rhode Island, Mary Wood who was probably born in Massachusetts. (Aylsworth supposes her to be of Wm. and Eliz. of E. Greenwich. They had one child, b. in E. Greenwich, in 1734, but they soon removed to the Highlands Frecinct near his father, and were there prior to 1737. He served in 1738 in Capt. Thomas Ellison's Co. with his father and brother Moses, under Col. Abram Gasbeck Chambers in the first Foot Co. of the Precinct of the Highlands (Colonial Rec. Series).

On March 27, 1752 James "bought land of Obed Harvey of Oblong, Duch. Co. located in the Oblong, in consideration of

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the full and just sum of 100Ls current money. This land was lately surrendered by the Colony of Ct. to the province of N.Y." (Deeds Duchess Co. Lib. 4, p. 127.) This land was equivalent land and part of lot #68 in amount of 100 A. with half privilege of building mills and water right for the milles. This deed was recorded in 1760, and was in Amenia. Luth Ch. records give the names as "James Elswoord and wf. Marrie." This line of the family seems to have spoken the name very flat, or the Clerks wrote it so that it was Alsworth, Olowoth, and Allsworth, but many of the older Conn. Elsworths did the same. For example, in my father's memory the name Pierce was spoken as Parse by the Conn. people of Penna.) His home was near the Conn. line in northeast town and near Indian Pond where he is buried on the old Hiram Clark place. (There were many Moravians removed from this locality to Bucks Co. Pa.) James died in Amenia in 1786, aged 73 yrs. (Cem. rec.) and Mary his wife died February 24, 1794 in her 80th year. (Cem. Rec. in Moravian Cem. near Sichem). His will was made May 12, 1785; Prov'd August 23, 1786. Fernows Cal. of Wills, p. 9.) He wills land in nine partners (Amenia) and in New Marlboro, Mass. He mentions all the children except the first two, and gives to his grandchildren (named) of his daughter Allice Connor. Children:

History of his Ancesters and early settlers of Pittsford" he relates: "Samuel was of light complexion, blue eyes, middle stature, thick set, firm constitution, sedate countenance and much given to study. When young he worked at the weaver's trade and acquired by his own exertions considerable information; calculated almanacs for several years in Conn. and for one year in Vermont. At the age of 30 years or more he married Aimee Matson, a widow with two children. Isaac and Lucy." He was an early settler of Pittsford, Vt. coming there in 1773, and was appt. to see when Samuel Crippens Mill will be ready for business." He was proprietor's clerk in 1775-6; and Justice of the Peace. In addition to his agricultural pursuits, he practiced land surveying and assessing. "During the war he lost most of his property. "He was pious, and of the Congregational order of Christians." (Caleb Hendee's mms.) He was on the pay roll of Capt. Benjamin Cooley's Co. in Col. Ebenezer Allen's Regt. of militia, called an alarm March 23-28 inclusive, 1780, as Sgt. Samuel Elsworth. (Col. Ebenezer Allen was of Tinmouth, Vt., and was in command in 1780 of Ft. Vengeance,

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a picket fort on Caleb Hendee's farm in the northern part of Pittsford. (He discharged the militia in October 1780, total pay 38L 52s 8d). Soon after this he removed to Arlington where he spent the remainder of his life with his son Samuel. He died 1803 at the age of about 85 years: and his wife Amy died in Pittsford aged about 70 years. Amy's first husband Joshua Matson died November 6, 1745. Inv. of Est. 881L . His will made October 2, 1745 at Simsbury, Conn. gives to "wife Amy, to sons Jushua and Isaac; to daus. Amy and Lucy. Executors his wife Amy and his Bro. Edward Matson, and Judah Holcomb. (Hartford Pro. Rec.) June 6, 1749, court appointed Edw. Matson guardian of Lucy aged 9 minor daughter of Jushua Matson. On 3 April 1750, Juda Holcomb moved Dist. of Real Estate be made and Court appt. Edw. Matson guardian of Jushua, aged 4 (a minor of Joshua Matson) and 500L and Isaac Holiday of Suffield was apptd. guardian of thr s. Isaac Matson, aged 6 and 500L children of Joshua Matson. Rec. at Simsbury. Conn. of children a re: #63 1. Caroline, b. March 13, 1748; m. April 27, 1767 Caleb Hendee.

Gid. Warren's Regt. in defense of Northern frontiers and served from May 5 to June 18, 1781.

In 1799 after four years service in the Senate, he was appointed as chairman and envoy extraordinary and minister pleniplotentiary, who made the convention of 1800, between the United States and the French Republic. The decline of his health disqualified him for the duties of his office as judge and he resigned toward the end of the year 1800. After his return to Connecticut he was elected again into the council of that state and appointed Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. He declined the latter office, and soon after died. November 26, 1807. In 1784 he was appointed Judge of the Superior Court of Connecticut. He was the first U. S. Senator from Connecticut, Ambassador to France, 1799-1800. He died at Windsor. His home with one acre of land of the original Elsworth homestead is now owned by the State Daughters of the American Revolution, where many Revolutionary relics were found. The house was built before the revolution and is in excellent state of preservation. A record of Christ's Church of Poughkeepsie, N. Y ... under Rev. This was probably in the earliest church at Newburgh whose pastor (or Dominee) was at this date Justus Dalconier; while Andreas Volck and Jacob Webber were trustees of it and the glebe of 500 A.

Samuel Elsworth, like his ancestors, was a cloth weaver and he probably plied his trade for the Palitinate settlers, for his Colonial War Record says he was "a weaver and of Newboro town," which was then in Ulster Co. Both Newburgh and New Windsor were then in "the Prec. of the Highlands," until

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1763, when they became towns; but were not added to Orange Co. until after the Revolution. The Lutherans lost their church here about 1748 and it was given to the Church of England control in 1752. (French's Hist. Gaz. of N.Y. - Woolsey's Hist. Marlboro - andRuttenber) Ruttenber says: "The Elsworths's were not Falitinates." After years of patient and persistent research, with the family knowledge of "our ancester was of the Ct. line, and that one married a Dutch woman", we find through the Luth. Ch. records that her name was Jannetje; and from traditions, which seem to be confirmed by records, that she was Jannetje Brouwer, baptized July 29, 1718. (Witnesses Wolfett Webber and Pietronella Montaigne Brouwer) Daughter of Sarah Webber and Sybrant Brouwer of Flatbush, N. Y. and therefore great, great grand daughter of the Dominee Everardus Bogardus and his wife Annetje Jana of New Amsterdam. Jannetje was witness with Joseph Elsworth as "wife of Samuel Elsworth October 1, 1746 for Rebecca and Wm. Palmatier's son Joseph; and in baptism of her own children as "Samuel Elsword and his wf. Jannetje", also name as "Elswort."

From State Hist. report and Mss. Rec. at Albany, we found that "on April 14, 1758 Samuel Elsworth enlisted as one of the 99 volunteers of Uls. Co. in Capt. Ebenezer Seely Jr's. Co. of the 2nd Regt. N. Y. troops under Col. James DeLancy, and was in Bradstreet's Exp. against Ft. Frontenac under Lt. Col. Isaac Corse; he was a weaver, 5 ft. $7\frac{1}{4}$ in., fair hair and complexion,

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aged 43 years out of Capt. Hasbrouck's militia Co. of Newboro town." (Colonial Series, Vol. I.); also in "April 2, 1760 he volunteered in Capt. Hasbrouck's Co. of Militia; was aged 45 years, born in Uls. Co., was a weaver, blue eyes and fair hair and complexion, 5 ft. 7-3/4 in." This was under Col. Clinton in the Exp. to Montreal and Quebec, and the French surrender. (Mss. Rec's. at Albany.) The Luth Ch. records give the baptism of three sons, and in 1790 Samuel was living inKinderhook, N.Y. with one female and his family; from records found we conclude that he had the following family, order of births not known, except of the sons:

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signed as a resident of Palts, N. Y. James Elsworth Jr. signed "Art. of Assoc." in Amenia in June 1775. (Cals of N.Y. Hist. mss. Vol. I, p. 75) In the Rev. he was a Quartermaster in Duchess Co. He died November 29, 1814, aged 72 years and his wife Hannah died June 9, 1823, aged 84 years. 66

They lived in Amenia where his deed was made and says: "For love and affection that I bear my two sons, Henry Alworth and Samuel Wigton Alworth of the same place, as well as in consideration of the sum of \$3000 which they have paid to my son James Alworth, jr., in full compensation for so much of my estate as I had intended to give my said son James Alworth, jr. W. by S'd farm of aforesaid Daniel Webster; supposed to contain about 300 acres more or less. I, the s'd. James Alworths et my hand and seal this 8th day of Feb. 1814. Subscribed as witnesses and appeard before Enos Hopkins to acknowledge the deed were Alex. Neeley and Elijah Smith 14, Jan. 1819. Jacob Van Ness, Clk. Lib. 27, p. 119, Duch. Co. Deeds. By another deed it was found that Henry's wife was Sally. In 1818 Sam'l Wigton deeded to Henry Alworth who with his wife Sally 1823 deeded to John Eggleston and his wife Henrietta, (Lib 30, p. 84.) from which we find that they had at least these children:

Olive wife of Minard Schutt: one part to Elizabeth, single woman, one part to grandson James Allworth, son of my son Noah, deceased; one part to my daughter Chloe, wife or Hendrick Schutt jr. the rem. I trust to my son David to be disposed of as follows: He is to pay interest annually to Mary wife of Gree Hall until the oldest child of my daughter Mary shall be of age, 18, or married then David shall pay Mary such proportion of sd. share as to leave an equal portion for Almira Hall 2nd daughter of Mary; also 1/3 share to child she is pregnant with an equal portion. Semuel Jr. gives power of attorney to Seth Cole December 31, 1832, to convey lands in Arlington left to him by last will of his father, late of Arlington, and gives his residence as Parmelia, Jefferson Co. New York. On January 1, 1834, Samuel Jr. of Pamelia gives deed through his attorney, Seth Cole, to Benajah Cook. Evidently Elizabeth died prior to December 31, 1832. Caleb Hendee in his Mss. says: "Uncle Samuel lived to be about 66 yrs. old; was a large man, extremely well made, about 6 ft. high, straight and athletic when in his prime; was of light complexion, had blue eyes; he told me that "his family wasnear of kin to the Hon.

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(Ellsworth) was born in 1750 or 51 in Simsbury Township, Hart Co.. Conn. and while a resident of Pittsford. Rut. Co.. Vt. in May. 1775. volunteered as Sergt. in Feleg Sunderland's Co. of the Vermont line and marched under Colonels Ethan Allen and Benedict Arnold, and was at the capture of Ticonderoga: assisted in building Fort Independence; afterward was taken prisoner by Major Fraser and carried to Gen. Burgoyne's camp at Crown Point. was held a short time and exchanged in Sept. 1775: he was in this service for about a year. He then joined Capt. Samuel Blodgett's Co. and was in the engagement at Hubbardston July 6. 1777. In 1777 he was appointed Captain in the Vermont line. joined Col. Seth Warmer and was in the engagement at Wallcomsecick (Bat. of Bennington 1777 in Hens. Co.) and served to the end of the war." He applied for pension October 15, 1832 from Fairfax Co., Virginia and his claim was allowed as "Israel Elsworth Holliday."

In 1786 he bought land in Pittsford, Vt. of his father and sold it in 1790 to John Eggleston. He removed with his family to northern Pennsylvania, near Troy, (on Sugar Creek in Brad. Co., from where he disappeared. Caleb Hendee remembered him as a very good natured man. "After Israel left his wife in Pennsylvania she returned to Pittsford and her people, and reported that in a fit of insanity, her husband went into the Woods and never was seen afterwards. His wife married again to a Mr. Patterson with whom she lived some years and then he left her. After this she married Willard Seaton, with whom she lived some years; they were pretty well matched - both bad enough he at length left her; she afterwards went into Upper Canada and/ there married

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a fourth time." (Pittsford Hist.) Her father, (Benjamin Stevens) was of Welch descent and a brother of Roger Stevens who married Mary Doolittle the sister of Col. Ephraim Doolittle of Mass. Militia and a resident of Worcester, Mass. and to whom for his services in the French and Indian War had a grant with 63 others for Pittsford, Vt. Roger Stevens became a Tory and fled to Canada, but Benjamin Stevens, his brother was a patriot and in same company under Col. Ebenezer Allen at Ft. Vengeance with Samuel Ellsworth, Sr. Benjamin was a member of the Baptist church at Pittsford, born 1734 at Quaker Hill, "Nine Partners," Duchess Co., New York, and died aged 70 years. They removed to Manchester, Vermont, 1773, then to Pittsford, in 1774.

Many years afterward Samuel Elsworth Jr. heard from his brother Israel, and ascertained that he was living in Fairfax Co., Virginia, had married a second time to Ann Bennett of Winchester, Virginia, and had four children and changed his name to Israel Elsworth Holliday. He is known to have been married twice and his second wife was Hannah Curtis born April 23, 1739, d aughter of Jonas, and his wife Eunice (Burroughs) of Stratford, Conn. (Hist. of Stratford, p. 1178; and Gen. of Curtiss Family, by F. H. Curtiss.) They resided in Uls. Co. in Mamakatine Precinct until the early 1800's. April 10,1760, at the age of 18 years he volunteered out of Capt. Hardenburg's Co. of militia under Capt. Clinton, with his father Samuel, and was in the Exp. to Montreal and Quebec and at the French surrender. May 7, 1761 he served in Capt. Richard Rea's Co. was aged 19 years, born in Uls. Co., a farmer, 5 ft. 6 ins. with brown hair and eyes. He had probably contracted that dread disease of the army - small-pox - in his previous service, for he was

then "pock broken." Goose Van Schaick was the Lt. Col. commanding both years. (Col. Series, Vol. II. State Hist. Report. pgs. 511 and 618.) He was one of the "Minute Men" for the defence of the Highlands under Col. Clinton, Lt. Col. James McClaughry (p. 86 Hist. of Newburgh & Or. Co.). As a freeholder of Mamakating Precinct, he signed the "Remonstrance against the reconciliation of the Colonies with England," June 26, 1775, when John Young, Ch. of the Com. made his report that the "signing was unanimous." (Or. Co., Sull. Co., and Uls. Co. Hist. and Eagers Hist.) Being on the western rontier, he was in the midst of Indian hostilities in the Minisink country, in that part of Mamakating Prec. now called Deerpart, Or. Co. (Sull. Co. was part of Uls. Co. until 1809. Deerpark was formed from Uls. Co. March 16, 1798 and annexed to Or. Co.) He was in the Battle of the Minisink October 1778, and helped as one of the Exempt Co.'s. to take the British prisoners to Easton, Pennsylvania, in July 1779; according to tradition in the family he served during the entire seven years of war. He was one of the 68 volunteers of the 6th Co. of the 2nd Regiment under Captain Jacob DeWitt (Abr. Cuddeback Jr. 1st Lt.) according to report made by his Lt. Col. James McClaughry, made March 16, 1776, and this was then called the "Paenpact Co." During 1777 and 1778 Ft. Gumaer was commanded by Capt. Abr. Cuddeback, Jr. As a private in this Co. under Col. Levi Pawling, Henry was chosen and sent on April 6 to 13, 1777 to "apprehend disaffected persons at Cochecton" and was on the Pay Roll for this service, certified

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by the "Ch. of the Com. of Mamacotting, Philip Swartwood." (Mas. of Col. and State, Vol.XII, Folio 51, Albany, N.Y.) He removed his family to a more populated district as others did: for during the years of 1778-9 the Indians had been very active on these frontiers. so that "the Legislature passed a law October 17. 1779 directing the Governor to cause the destruction of such grain and crops on the western frontiers of Or. and Uls. Cos. as could not be removed to a place of safety." This was done to deprive the enemy of sustenance, and further means of annovance. The distress occasioned, on the verge of an inclement winter, was very great from the havoc and desolation, and people who had been accounted rich became very poor. (French's Gaz. of N.Y., p. 643.) At this time we find Henry Elsworth serving with his relations in the 9th Co. 3d Regt. under Capt. Releg Ransom, Nath'l. Potter 1st. Lt. (N.Y. in Mev. p. 196) then again as a Priv. in the 3d Rgt. of Levies under Capt. Abram Westfall, Lt. Col. Albert Pawling (Certif. of Service #6146, dated December 18, 1781), this service was from April to December. Quinlan's Hist. of Sull. Co. speaks of two small lakes, "the Yankee" and "Mastin." The "Yankee" abounds in pickrel and other fish. It gained its name from the circumstance that an old man named "Ellsworth" previous to 1800, made a canoe, or "dugout" from a log, which he put on this lake and used it there while hunting. He was called a Yankee, and the Dutch hunters named the lake "the Yankees pont" in consequence. It is 30 ft. deep,

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21 miles in length, by 2 miles wide and covers 900 acres. Henry Elsworth and his sons were all great hunters and guides. but it is not known just who this refers to, but it was probably Henry Elsworth. History of Susq. Co., Pennsylvania, says "Henry Elsworth came to Middletown prior to 1807." He obtained land in Rush in 1810, deed recorded at Wilkes Barre. He applied with others, August 17, 1790, for a grant of land in Mamakating Frecinct by right of occupancy; and on September 10, 1791, two hundred acres were surveyed to him by the state of New York. (Indorsed Land Papers) and "Cal. of N.Y. Colonial Mss). Exact date of his death is not known, but he is on the tax list in Susq. Co., Pennsylvania in 1815, about the date of his death, it is declared by his children; and that he and his wife are buried side by side in the old Middletown Ce. where the following inscription is found on an old fashioned sandstone slab cut with a curved top, and on it is carved a weeping willow tree, with the following inscription - "In memory of Hannah, wife of Henry Elsworth, died April 4, 1830 in her 91st year. Here lies our mother underground, We hope her soul in heaven is found." Close by are the graves of their sons Joseph and Jonathan, both marked, the latter with a marble slab. He had the following

Whether this land is Henry Sr's or his son's is not clear; but in 1790 he was res. in Mamakating town in Uls. Co., N.Y. Henry Sr. was through his first marriage a relation of Captain Richard Rea, their wives being own cousins.

(Fernow's Cal. of Wills, p. 161) Adam and Samuel were his brothers and all three were sons of Nicholas Gardiner who owned "property near Ft. Hunter on the S. side of the Mohawk river, and on the Schotak," according to Nicholas will in 1756. (Fernow's Wills, p. 175) He enlisted November 25, 1763 in James Clinton's Co. in Uls. Co. at the age of 19 years, born Uls. Co. (Col. War Series) He served in the Revolution in Capt. John Hasbrouck's Co. 3d Rgt. Uls. Co., under Col. Cantine: received Cert. for Pay June h. 1780 of 15s. 1/2d: and in the Levies under Pawling, as a private, Treas. Cert. for 20 L 8s. 10d., dated December 20, 1781. (Robts. N. Y. in Rev. p. 83.) He is said to have rendered service through the entire war. (See Frenow's Arch. and Roberts N. Y. In Rev.) In 1790 he is probably the John Elsworth esiding in New Paltz with a son under 16 years of age, and 3 females in his family. "On March 19,1791 John Elsworth had a survey of land made in Pownal, Vermont." (I Rec.) in 1763, Nov. 26, he was one of the signers of a petition "for more taverns in Newburgh, as they were much needed." He died prior to July 4, 1796 in Pownal, Vermont when Henry Elsworth was appointed as Adm. of his Estate. He made a report of the Inventory July 19, 1796 to Jno. Robinson and signed as "Henry Elsworth" (Vol. II, p. 176). There were 69 A. of land

(Vol. II, p. 183) gives Div. of Est. by Benjamin Gardner, August 15, 1796, of 1/3 of the farm of 69 acres to Rebecca the widow bounded N. by Benj. Gardner. surveyed by Richard Brown. andPers. Est. of 31 L 10s. 4 d. Approv'd by Abram Gardner and Blackmer Brownell in Pro. Court. At this date there was an appeal made to the Court by the guardians (appointed July 16) of the two sons (minors) of John Elsworth, who were William (Le) Roy guardian for John Elsworth, and Benjamin Gardner for Silas Elsworth, asking for distribution of the Est. "to the legal heirs, as there are no debts, but it is necessary for their support." The Estate was divided December 22, 1796 to Waitie Mallory and Martha Van Ornums, each a 1/2 share: to Henry, William, John and Silas each a whole share. (Vol. II, p. 196-7) whether these were all his children, or not, does not appear. (Bennington Pro. Dist.) It is believed that Waitie and Martha were sisters of John and had lived with him, and it is said that "John Jr. and Silas were his only children". (Pro. Clk.) There were 24 acres of woodland adjoining on the side of a mountain, also distributed to John and Silas each 6 A. while the rest only received 3 A. apiece. MASSACHUSETTS RECORD OF ELLSWORTHS

I. JERIMIAH ELLSWORTH was allotted seven acres of land in Bradford Streets Plain in 1643. He was a freeholder in 1677. January 28th at Rowley, Mass., Constable in 1676. He was born about 1626 (est.) in England, and buried May 6, 170h at Rowley. (Town Rec.) He married first Mary, widow of Hugh Smith December 2, 1057. Hugh Smith died 1655. (See Adm. of his Est. in Salem 1655.) His will mentioned his wife and children. Inv. of Est. 2hh pounds. On June 26, 1657, Jeremich Ellsworth gives bonds in sum of 200 pounds "upon his mareg with Mary Smith - to pay the portion due Hugh Smith's children, Samuel, Edward, and Hannah." On the 2nd of December, following they were married. She was buried May 21, 1687.

NOTE: (Her daughter Hannah Smith married Joseph Trumbull, married 2nd. John Strong of Windsor, Ct. Edward Smith married Sarah Allen 1685, daughter of Edward of Suffield. Both Hannah and Edward Smith lived in Suffield, Ct.) He married 2nd. Sarah Jewett, daughter of Maxmillan, May 13, 1689. Sarah Ellsworth made a deposition in 1739 (age about 77 years) and said "about 50 years ago she lived with Rev. Edward Payson of Rowley, 1 year, 8 months and to the best of her remembrance Rev. 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NEW YORK LINE OF ELSWORTH

New York was first settled by the Dutch, and its churches and ministers were also Dutch, their faith being that of the Lutheran and Reformed. The English and other nationalities who lived among them joined them in their worship and customs, and intermarried with them. In many communities there were not enough of any one nationality to support a minister of their own: so there were itinerant ministers who were assistants to those in New York and other large communities, who traveled to and from Philadelphia through New Jersey to New Amsterdam and up the Hudson River as far as Albany, ministering to the people en route. Whenever the Dutch Dominie came along was the appointed time for a general assembling of the people of the neighborhood, when all the marriages and baptisms were performed, and certain persons were privileged to furnish the liquid refreshments for these affairs. Baptisms were family reunions and required witnesses equal to a marriage ceremony of today, and in every case it was a near relative who virtually agreed to be responsible for that child's welfare and training should necessity require it - therefore called sponsors. The rule of naming a Dutch child made it possible to ascertain its ancestry for three or more generations; while a female never lost her identity by marriage, for she was known through life by her maiden name, and recorded as wife or widow of whomever it might be, with but two exceptions. Surnames were hard to establish,

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and given names became the family name in many cases. There is no set rule for spelling names, and it requires much experience and close study to account for such names as Theophilus and Christopher: Jacobus and James: Adriantie and Ariantie, being the same - but it seems to be the case. In most of the early records a name is spelled according to the way the clerk would pronounce it. If he were Welch, Scotch, Irish, French, or Dutch, it received the accent and spelling of his nationality, even though it may have been an English person's name; hence the name Elsworth is found in the records given in every conceivable way of spelling it, as: Yde Waert, Elsewaart, Elshuert, Elswaert, Elswardt, Elswert, Elsword, Elsewoord, Eleswort, Elsewaert, Elseworth, Elsenwaert, Eduarts, Olsworth, Alsworth, Alesworth, Elsewaerdt, Elo'worth, Eleswoort, Elswarts, Elswoord, Ailsworth, Elzewarth, Elswaart, Eleswoord, and many other ways, as well as Ellsworth and Aylsworth.

In the following records, for the sake of brevity, will give: m. - marriage; j.m. - young man; j.d. - young daughter; z.h.v. - his wife; wf. - wife; b. - birth or born; d. - died; wit. - witness or sponsor; bp. - baptized.

Witness to many of the early New York baptisms will be given as they may prove of interest and help in tracing back ancestry and other family relationships.

Having engaged in these family researches since early in 1908, the author concluded that Arthur Aylsworth must be a son by the first wife of Jeremiah Elsworth, who settled in Rowley,

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Massachusetts. Josiah Elsworth of Windsor, Connecticut -Theophilus of New York, and Jeremiah Elsworth of Rowley, Massachusetts were either brothers or cousins. The New York and Long Island records lend assurance to this belief when they are studied closely and consideration given to the customs of those days, and how important a part religion took in deciding their destination.

I.CHRISTOPHER ELSWORTH was born in England and resided for #1 a time in Holland before coming to America. Tradition has it that he was server knighted in 1640 or 1/2 by King Charles I. He was probably what was then termed an Anglish Quaker, their faith being somewhat like the Baptists of today, who, like the Catholics, were not tolerated by Cromwell and his followers who came into power scon afterwards; so that he with many others fled to Holland, then to New Amsterdam, where the Dutch offered religious freedom. He came to New York asearly as 1650, and was in business as a ship carpenter in 1655. He is mentioned in 1653 as "having an affray with Adam Roelantsen," who had been the first school teacher sent over in 1633 by the West India Co. to the colony, but having lost his wife, had gradually sunk to the position of a servant for them, and was very troublesome among his neighbors. Christopher was on the tax list as a freeholder, with Est. of 100L, on November 10, 1676, assessed to help pay for the new dock and other expenses of the dity. (Co. Rec's.) His name is recorded as Stoffel, Toffel, Steoffel, and "Christoffel Yde Waert" and Elswaert, at the baptism of his children, which are equivalent in Dutch to Theophilus and

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Christopher. His will is given as that of "Theophilus Elsworth of N. Y." in Liber 8, p. 446 of N. Y. wills in which he mentions the children given in the baptism records of the "Dutch church of N. Y." His wife was ANNETJE JANS whom he married probably in Holland, for the eldest daughter "Bretchje" was born in Amsterdam according to her marriage record. Annetje Jans is also given as "Anneken Stoffels" and her name appears thus in the records, first as a witness on December 25, 1650 (for Jocem, son of Joachem Beekman) with Martin Creigers (a Captain in the Dutch service whose wife was Elizabeth Jans) and Albert Coning. She is given also as Annetje Jans and Anneken Stoffels, at the baptism of some of her grandchildren. She was living as late as June 12, 1695, when both she and her husband were witness to the baptism of their granddaughter Annetje Van de Grift, this being the last record found of her.

He may have had a sister Eleanor who was residing in the East Ward of New York City in 1703, with a male and female Negro servants. A will of Dirk Van de Burgh was witnessed by "Christophel Elswaert" on August 8, 1709. "Wills of N. Y." Liber VIII, p. 446, gives that of "Theophilus Elsworth of N.Y." made April 9, 1706, and Probated February 21, 1715, in which he says: "My debts are to be paid, and the funeral of my body such as shall become a Christian to be likewise paid. I leave to my eldest son, Clement, as bar to all claim as heir at law, a certain lot or parcel of land lying and being on the N.E.

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of this City of N. Y. containing 30 ft. in breadth to the hiway, and in the rear next to the Swamp, belonging to said City, 19 ft. 9 in. and is bounded on the N. E. side by land of the widow Clopper; on the S. W. by other lands of mine. I leave the rest of the land there to my three sons, Clement, George, and William, an equal share in breadth, front and rear. My sonGeorge is to have the one third part next to the land of William Beekman, being the S. W. part. The next 1/3 is to William, and the other 1/3 being the N. E. part to Clement. And they are to pay my grandson TheophilusElsworth, son of my son Johannes deceased, and the children of my daughters Elizabeth, Judith, and Christina. My executors are to sell all estate except what is above specified within twelve months. For the time I have lived with any of my children, they shall receive for each years board the sum of 15L. I make my sons Clement and George, and Samuel Staats, and Capt. Johannes De Puyster executors. Witnesses: Giles Shelley, Burger Mynderse, Wm. Huddlestone. Note: This tract is on the N. side of Peerl St., and extends from Ferry St. to Brooklyn Bridge."

II. BRETCHJE (REBECCA) (daughter of Christopher I) accord-#2 ing to her marriage record was born in Amsterdam (about 1618-9) and as a young daughter (j.d.) married August 13, 1670 to Evert Pels a young man (j.m.) of Niess Albanien (Albany) in Dref. Ch. of New York. He was son of Evert Pels and Ariantic Aeriens early members of the D. Ref. Ch. of New York and was chosen by Gov. Stuyvesant May 16, 1661 as one of the first Schepens (Com'r) of Wyltwyck (now Kingston). On January 24, 1663 Evert Pels and other Commissioners of Wyltwyck and Roelof, Swartwood, "Schout of Esopus", made report to Gov. Stuyvesant "upon the evils of selling liquor to the Indians," and said: "We found at the house of Lowys Du Bo (Louis Du Bois) a Walloon, living in the new village (Hurley), half an anker of distilled water which had not been reported at this place, and was made by his father (in-law) Matthew Blanchart." The court confiscated it. Evert Pels came to Albany in 16h2 and took the oath

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of allegience May 21, 1653 to the Patroon of Pennsaelerwyck. Evert Pels had land granted at Wiltwyck April 17, 1668, and also November 2, 1668, at the Strand (below Kingston) for the rent of one bushel of wheat yearly. Evert and Bretchje had three children and he died prior to May 30, 1678, when she joined the Dutch Ref. Ch. in New York as his widow. She married second November 6, 1678 to Mellen Claeszen j.m. from Schermer, N. Holland. They had only one child, a daughter the following year, after which he soon died. She married third time as his widow July 3, 1682 to Herman Jansen from Meppelen, by whom she had three children, and died prior to October 19, 1688, when he received a license as her widower to marry Geesje Schurman (Cornelia Sherman) widow of Bruyn Hagen. Among the inhabitants and property owners of Hempstead, Long Island is given the name of Herman Johnson Oct. 11, 1683. She had the following children baptized in the Dutch Church of New York.

(wit. Jan. Mastinan, English soldier in the service of the Dutch, and was one of the patentees of "Flushing" in 1645 and married October 27, 1750, Divertje (Debora) Jans from Nordt, Holland. (Vol. V, p. 34, Gen. and Bio. Hec. of N. Y. and Vol. VI, p. 39.)

The name Slote is often omitted, as was usual in the Dutch records, and he is given as "Jan Jansen" and "Jan Pieterszen" and was a brother of Heiltje Pieters who married October 28, 1657 Cornelis Jansen Clopper, and after his death married September 26, 1697 Sjourt Olophertszen widower of Judith Roeloffs

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(Volck) and son of Olof Stephens Van Cortland, Commissary of West India Co. and Deacon of the D. Church. and wife Anna Annakan, sister of Govert Loockerman: all prominent members of the Dutch Colony. The latter, Govert Loockermans, merchant, with Capnelins Leendertsen Van De Grift, were owners of the trading ship "Good Hope" plying between New York and New Haven to Virginia, Rhode Island and/along the Coast and were associated as early as 1642 with Isaac Allerton, Lt. Gov. of Plymouth Colony, and resided later in New Haven, and also with his son Isaac who had an estate and warehouse in New Amsterdam. Jan Jansen Slote was on the New York City tax list November 10, 1676 (valuation of his estate 100L.) to help defray expenses of the new dock. In 1678 the eastern part of a plot of land in the "Smits Vly" on Manhattan Island belonging to Augustine Heerman, surveyor there of "Bohemia Manor." Md. was bought by Jan Janszen Slote prior to 16hl this was owned by Hendrick Jansen, the teilor, who was drowned with ex-Gov. Kieft and the Rev. Everardus Bogardus on the PRINCESS. On November 2, 1684 Judith was witness at baptism of Brechtie, daughter of Wm. Holmes and wif? Elizabeth Claes in the Dutch Church of New York. No record was found of the death of either Judith or Jan Slote. Their children baptized in the Dutch Ohurch of New York were:

Faulus Van de Grift from Amsterdam, who was in the service of the West India Co. as early as 1644 in which year at the Isle of Curocoa he was appointed to the command of the ship "Neptune" and was in high favor with Director Gen. Stuyvesant and had a warehouse on Water St., New York in 1647 was appointed Supt. of Naval Equipments at New Amsterdam and one of the City Surveyors. 372

Rebecca, mother of Leendert, was the daughter of Fredk Lubbertsen who was born about 1603 and came from Amsterdam with his wife Styntie and daughter Rebecca and resided in the "Smiths Vly" on Manhattan Island, where his wife died prior to 1657, when he married Tryntje Hendricks widow of Corn. Pietersen and had two more daughters and sold his house in Smiths Vly to Jan Peek in 1656.

When Rebecca Fredericks Lubbertse married Jacon Leendertsen Van De Grift they took up their residence in a house upon the East side of Broadway which her father had conveyed to her. "Steentie Elswaert" joined the Dutch deformed Church of New York May 28, 1679 soon after her marriage, where records of four children are found, and her name was spelled "Styntie Edwarts" at baptism of her first child. In the Dutch Reform Church of Bensalem (Bethlahem), Bucks Co., Pennsylvania, is found a record

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that "Leendert Vandegrift and Styntie Elshuert joined by certificate in 1710." They had in New York 373

Some records drop the "brecht" and give her name simply Engles, but this was characteristic of the Dutch to shorten the feminine names by dropping the last syllable and simply add s.

It is evident that the name Engels, Engelbert, brecht and brock are all one and the same and not three different wives as has been claimed by some. The mother of Elizabeth was given as Engels; in 1697 as Engelbert, and Engelbrock, and she was living and a witness in 1704; death not found. He was a shipwright by trade and was appointed by Gov. Donegan in July 1685 ad a Committee to appraise and make report on the pinck "Charles." Gov. Andross also appointed him in April, 1690 to examine and make report on two vessels in the King's service. "Klement

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Elseworth" witnessed a release of mortgage April 26, 1707, on 104 A. of upland and 2 A. in meadow in Newtown, by Gertrude (Schuyler) Van Cortland, sole executor, and relict of Stephen Van Cortland late of New York City. On February 15, 1711, Clement married second Mary Van Gunst. Letters of Adm. were granted to him on the Est. of his son Theophilus, June 12, 1712, but no further account of it was found.

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"Fernows' Calendar of Wills," p. 98 gives his will, as follows: "I, Clement Elsworth, of N. Y. shipwright, being sick; All debts and duties I owe in right or conscience, are to be paid. I leave to my grandson Clement, eldest son of my son Theophilus Elsworth deceased, late of N. Y. 6 shillings in full of all claim as heir at law. I leave my wife Mary 15 pounds. Of all the rest of my Est. I leave one fifth to the children of my son Theophilus, 1/5 to my dau. Elizabeth; and 1/5 to the child of John, and he is to allow out of the same to the rest of my children for the lot of ground lying near the Cripple Bush (Krenpelbosch) already received by my son John. I make by brother Wm. Elsworth, shipwright, and my sons-in-law Cornelius Kierstede, silversmith, and Johannes Brested, cooper, executors." She is sometimes given in the records as "Ariantje Jans" and "Ariantie Rommen" while George is also given as "Joris Stoffelszen" in 1685 when witness for Barbara, daughter of Reyner Aertszen and Janneken Aukens. He witnessed the will of Chas. Randolph of Hempstead, Long Island, on January 3, 1706; his name is given as "Joris Alsworth" in April 1727 when he witnessed the will of John Van Brugh of New York. He resided two miles N. of Corlear Hock, on the East River. at Turtle Bay, New York City, and owned slaves as early as 1703. One of his slaves

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named "Will" brought suit against him for wages, claiming to be a free man. (This was the only plea a slave was allowed to bring suit for at that time.) The case was tried before a jury at a session of Supreme Court and a verdict was given for the defendant. He made a petition to Gov. Hunter, June 25, 1710 relating to this suit of his slave "praying rendition of said negro." His wife was living in 17/12 when she deeded property to her sons Theop. and Ahasuerus; and in 1745, according to the will of Theop. The will of "George Elsworth Sr. of Turtle Bay, N. Y." was made August 8, 1727; and prob'd Feb. 11, 1733-4 in which he says: "being well stricken in years, I leave to my wf. Ariantie interest in my estate during her life; and to my son Theophilus my great Dutch bible; to my dau. Ariantie a bedstead and bed, and enough to buy a new wedding suit; and gives to Theophilus, John, George, Ahasuerus, and Ariantie, my children."/ New York records give his children: 1. Annetje bp. JOHANNES (JOHN) (son of Chris. I) was baptized December 10, 1664 (wit. Hillegond Joris wf. of Jan Corn. Van Horn) He was a ship carpenter, and married August 22, 1685 Aeltje Hoose, daughter of Gerrit Janszen Roose, and his second wife Tryntje Ariens of New York City. Aeltje was baptized February 27, 1667. (Wit. Jan. Vigne and Tryntje Roelofs). Tryntje Ariens was a sister of Lysbeth wife of Sybrant Jansen whose daughter Wyntie Sybrants married Wm. son of Dom. Everandus Bogardus and the widow Anneke Jans of Trinity Church fame, Gerrit Janszen Roose, in his will, September 3, 1697 leaves 1/5 part of his estate to "Annatie Ellswaert", daughter of my daughter Aeltje, procured

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by John Elswaert (Abstract of Wills by N. Y. Hist. Soc. p. 297-8) Aeltje died prior to 1696 for he obtained a license on June 4, 1696 to marry a young daughter (j.d.) Anna Pieters whose surname was Van Norden Van Nornum (or Aernham), both of New York. John Vigne of New York sold a lot to John Elsworth now #63-65 on Pine St. (Abs. of Wills, p. 154) He may have been interested with Capt. Lancaster Symes in the grants of land in Westchester or Uls Co. as his wife requests that Lancaster Symes and others make a report of his estate. She was a widow residing in New York City in 1703 (Doc. Hist. of N. Y.) On September 7, 1702 Johannes Elsworth, a ship carpenter, "being sick and weak, but of perfect remembrance :- I leave to my wife Antie all my estate during her life or widowhood. If she marry again then she is to have 1/2 of the Est. for life and the rest for my children. I make my wife executor, and request my brothers Clement and Geo. Elsworth to be overseers of my children," Provid before Lord Cornbury January 10, 1704-5. Inventory of his Est. amounts to 79 pounds, made at the request of his wife as executor, by Lancaster Symes and Wm. Anderson February 8, 1705. She married second March 1, 1705 to David Van Slyke and died in 1763 a widow - "being greatly advanced in years wills to her grand children, Hester widow of Nicholas Roose, and Annatie wf. of Peter Marcellus of New York a carpenter, - the children of Theophilus Elsworth, mason, deceased, 10 pounds each; to my two daughters Josentie wf. of Richard Bidder, and Elizabeth wf. of Thomas Wendover, all of my household goods and wearing apparel. My two daughters

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are to be executors." Made 1762 and Provid March 9, 1763.

Everardus Bogardus and his second wife Walburg De Sille (widow of Frans Kreigers). The name Christoffel and Theophilus is used interchangeably in his records. He was a shoe maker residing in New York and may have invested in land in the "Precinct of the Highlands" as the "widow Elsworth" is on the Assessor's list there as a free holder and taxed 71d 3 s on Personal and real estate to the value of 5 pounds January 20, 1714, and was still on the tax list 1718-24 and 25. (Mss Rec. Uls. Co. Clk. Off.) Muttenber's Hist. of Newburgh says: "the widow held his lands after his death; when she died, her son Wm. sold the land to Samuel Stratton in 1753, who sold it subsequently to Jehiel Clark fromWest Chester Co., who had previously bought in 1751 other adjoining lands of James Alexander, a lawyer in New York City, and of John Provost. This was in what is now Middlehope Or. Co. New York." (P. 132 "Or. Co. and Newburgh Hist.) He died intestate in 1712 or 1713 for Letters of Adm. were granted by Gov. Robt. Hunter, to his father Clement

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Elsworth January 13, 1713. (Abs. of Wills of N. Y. Lib. 8, p. 103.) No returns were found. His father, November 20, 1723 "devised 1/5 of his Est. to the children of his son Christopher deceased; and gives 6 shillings in bar of all claim as heir at law, to the oldest son Clement." Bap. Hartford, Conn., and dau. of Gerrit Roose), and John, real estate in Europe and America. Personal property - 1 silver cup, old fashioned and gilded. Executors Thomas Noell, Jacob Van Cortland, and Jacob Maybe." (From "Hist. Soc. Coll. of Wills", Vol. p. 206) is found one of "John DeMorrisque of New York City,

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but now in the Barbadoes, leaves to his nephew Nicholas Elsworth of New York real estate in New York, Parbadoes, England, and elsewhere, and personal property consisting of bonds of Lancaster Symes, John Hunt, Odell Turner, and other merchants of New York City; but if he die under age, then to Jacob VanCortland, John Van Horn Jr., Geo. Goss. Geo. Hunter, and the Dutch Church in New York and they are to be Executors. This will was made March 9, 1721. Prov'd. April 15, 1723. (Fernows Cal. of Wills of N. Y.) Upon petition of Theopjilus Elsworth stating that "said John Dumaresque was the brother of his first wife, and that he is guardian of his son Nicholas Elsworth; that the said Jacob Van Cortland had renounced being executor, and John Van Horn jr. was beyond seas." Letters of Adm. were granted July 9, 1722 by Gov. Wm. Burnett to Theophilus Elsworth, on the Est. of his wife Sarah who had died intestate. He married second September 24, 1709 to Sarah Ver Duyn (or Verdon) who died March 1, 1741. He left a wife Ariantie at his death, November 15, 1745. (D. Ref. Ch. nec.) (Pro. Rec. Vol. IV p. 64-65) gives his will made April 24, 1745, and Provid Nov. 22, 1745. "I, Theophilus Elsworth, of New York gentleman, being in perfect health, leave to my son Nicholas 5 pounds in bar of all claim as heir at law through me, or my father George Elsworth, deceased. I leave to my wife Ariantie a negro named Sabina and her child. I give to my four grand children Peter Newbury, Sarah, Mary, and Elizabeth Leacraft, a negro man. To my dau. Elizabeth a negro man, or 45 pounds in money; and

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to my son Cornelius the same, also all household furniture (except wrought plate), six large silver spoons, and six teaspoons. I leave to my son Theophilus a negro man, or 45 pounds money. To my son Verduyn, a negro man or 45 pounds, also 70 pounds when he is of age. My executors are to pay for the maintenence and schooling of my sons Theophilus and Verduyn 30 pounds yearly. All the rest of my estate, real and personal, I leave to my children Ariantie, Elizabeth, Cornelius, Theophilus, and Verduyn; and one sixth to my four grand children. I make my son in law John Beekman, mcht. and my daughter Cornelia, executors. Wit. John Earle, John Roosevelt, jr., E. Blagg." N. Y.

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Judge Van Camp said their men were paid 4 shillings per day for apprehending New York men." Co. and earlier, an Abram Post of Saybrook, Conn., married Mary (born prior to 1650, date of her father's death) daughter of Ann and John Jordan of Guildford, Conn. Her mother Ann said to be relative of Gov. Fenwick and married second Thos. Clark. The Artillery Co. received grants of land in Westfield (not Ft. Anntown, Wash. Co.) He served in 2nd Regt. of Duchess Co. during the Revolutionary War and received grants of land for his service. He was Ens. in 1786, and promoted to Vice Ens. in 1787 inDuchess Co.; resigned 1790. His will was made September 2, 1796 and Provid May 30, 1805, in which "he wills to his wife Sarah, and to Ahasuerus #lsworth Peters son of Hewlett 100 pounds; and to my sisters son Dr. Geo. Gillespay." On January 3, 1788 an Indenture was made between the Executors of the last will of George Peters, deceased, of Charlotte Co., New York, and Ahas. Elsworth and Hewlett Peters. both of Clinton Prec. Duchess Co., New York, which says: "Geo. Peters dec'd of 1st part was seized of power to dispose of land situated in Clinton Prec. Duch. Co., N. Y. in a patent known and distinguished by the name of "Great and lower Nine Partners," it being a part of lot # ____ in the 2nd original division of sd. Pat. and bounded by land of Lemuel Conkling Esq. and Zacheus Newcomb (bounds given) to Ahasuerus Elsworth and Hewlett Peters, their heirs and assigns, forever to be held equal between them as tenants in common, and not joint tenants." In the account of the burning of Kingston, October 16, 1777, by the English, Robt. Livingston (of Clermont, Columbia Co., New York now) contributed 5000 A. for the relief of the sufferers; when Lot 1, class 8 was given to Wm. Elsworth. (Hist. of Kingston. On June 1, 1790 a claim was made by him. as Adm. of the Est. of Peter Elsworth, late Capt. in the U.S. Army, for bounty lands (Ind. Land Papers). On August 4. 1804. a deed of land was issued by the Commonwealth of New York to Wm.

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Elsworth, whose wife wasElizabeth, who had died prior to July, 1804. He died prior to 1794 according to the will of Penelope Kissick, who speaks of him then as "Uncle "m. deceased," and mentions "Cousin Theophilus and "m. Elsworth of Bergen, N. J." 1. Col. Elmer Ephraim born at Malta, New York April 11, 1837. He clerked in the village store for a year, then in Troy and New York, each a year; then went West, determined to study law. He did copy for support, and denied himself in every way to fit himself for the future. He seemed to have an intuition

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that the country would soon need especially drilled men and he studied all the military methods that he could obtain, and therefrom, with his own ideas, evolved a perfected system of instruction which he demonstrated with the U.S. Zouave Cadets of Chicago - the organization that first gave his name to the world. The U. S. Agricultural Society offered a set of magnificent colors to the best drilled company in the nation. His command received them, and they began a triumphal march through the principal cities, where all conceded to his company the palm of superiority. New York had been, heretofore, the acknowledged champion of half a centure, in her citizen soldiery, who were forced to confess that out of the West had come soldiers before whom her pride - the 7th - was a raw recruit. Every member of the Zouave Regiment was sworn to total abstinence from spirituous liquors, tobacco, gambling, and from visiting any place of immorality. Profanity was made a ground of prompt dismissal from the company. Politeness of address and a chivalrous courtesy of demeanor in private as well as public relations, were rigidly exacted.

After his return to Chicago he formed the acquaintance of Abraham Lincoln, who took him into his law office as a student, and in the campaign of 1860 which resulted in the election of President Lincoln, he took an active part. He went to Washington with him as one of his body guards and where Pres. Lincoln intended to assign him to a high position in the War Department. When the first call came April 15, 1861 for 75,000 volunteers,

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Col. Elmer obtained permission to recruit a regiment. He went to New York and organized, in five days, a Zouave Regiment of 1200 men composed entirely of members of the Fire Department. This was the first volunteer regiment sworn for the war. On the 23rd of May the order came to march into Virginia and take possession of Alexandria, 7 miles below Washington. As his regiment came into the town he saw a rebel flag flying over the Marshall House, which he proceeded to haul down, and while descending the stairs, the proprietor shot him, and the assassin was killed at the next instant by Brownell, an old friend of the Colonel's.

Col. Elmer's body lay in state in the E. room of the White House by the wish of Pres. Lincoln, who had learned to love him as a son. He was buried in the Ellsworth Cem. at Mechanicsville, New York, where a beautiful monument was erected to his memory by the nation. He died May 24, 1801 and was the first officer killed in the Civil War. The State of New York raised a company of men immediately, of the most exemplary and perfect in physique - one from each town - and this regiment was called the "Ellsworth Avengers."

He was always ready to sacrifice his own interests to the cause he loved, and to the country he was sworn to defend.

It is significant that after he had fallen and his clothing removed, a patriotic medal was found hanging upon his breast, stained with his heart's blood, a golden medal bearing this

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inscription: "Non solum nobis, sed pro Patria." He was a man of tender affections, and ever thought for his parents as evidenced in his last letter to them, which follows: "Headquarters. First 4ouaves, Camp

Lincoln, Washington, May 23, 1861

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"My dear Father and Mother:

"The regiment is ordered to move across the river tonight. I have no means of knowing what reception we are to meet with. I am inclined to the opinion that our entrance into Alexandria will be hotly contested, as I am just informed a large force have arrived there today. Should that happen, my dear parents, it may be my lot to be injured in some manner. Whatever happens, cherish the consolation that I was engaged in the performance of a sacred duty; and tonight thinking over the probabilities of the morrow and the occurrences of the past, I am perfectly content to accept whatever my fortune may be, confident that He who noteth the fall of a sparrow will have some purpose, even in the fate of one like me.

"My darling and ever loved parents, goodbye. God bless, protect, and care for you.

"Elmer."

The Chicago Historical library has an interesting collection of relics and pictures of Col. E. E. Ellsworth. He was unmarried, but was engaged to a Miss Spafford of Illinois.

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ADDITIONAL RECORDS TO AYLSWORTH GEN.

Among the early settlers of Easthampton, Southold, and other Long Island towns, as well as in Connecticut and the Marragansett country, Mode Island, are found many of the family names allied with the Ellsworths andAylsworths and who migrated there from near Lynn andSaler, Massachusetts. Although no birth or baptism record has been found of Arthur Aylsworth, it appears very plausable that he was the son of Jeremiah Pllsworth and his first wife Mary, widow of Hugh Smith of Howley andSalem, Massachusetts.
