-- ADDITION and CORRECTION --

From a former Humboldt resident and historian, Harriet Tracy DeLong, comes a comment on the Cuddeback family article, "An Early Pioneer", in Vol IV, No. 3. "It was Joseph Tracy who rode out to bring Mrs. Cuddeback and Jessie into Hydesville after the Indian attack. And it was at the Tracy house that they lived for the next year....Mrs. Teasley had no way of knowing that both Coy and Elliott have perpetuated the error of the first stage line in southern Humboldt. In 1867 it was Seth Chism & Co. that operated the stage between Hydesville and Eureka, not Bullard and Williams. Seth Chism and Joseph Tracy began a partnership in the stage business sometime in the fall of 1857 and continued the business until sometime in the middle 70's. We have never been able to pinpoint the date of its transfer to Bullard." Our thanks to Mrs. DeLong.

THE HOWARD - AXE FAMILY

From the union of two prominent pioneer families of Humboldt County, came the Frederick Axe--Zaidee Howard family. Frederick was born January 27, 1840 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the son of Joseph Axe, a wholesale manufacturer of combs. His mother died when Frederick was only nine years old. From nine until fourteen years of age he attended the local schools. He then worked on a farm, later becoming an apprentice in the silver plating business. On the fourth of February 1862, he enlisted in the army, Company C, second regiment of Infantry, Pennsylvania Reserves. This was known as Governor Curtin's pet division. He served in this division for ten months, being in several battles, including the Battle of Second Bull Run. He received a discharge on December 10, 1862, in order to enlist in Horse Battery M, Second Regiment, U.S. Artillery. He served in this regiment for three years - until the close of the war. He engaged in at least twenty-two officially listed battles. In August 1865, he was ordered to California where at the end of the war he was mustered out at the Presidio on September 11, 1865.

After his discharge, he served twenty-eight months as a guard at San Quentin Prison, near San Francisco. He then came to Humboldt County where he engaged in teaming, was station master at the railroad in Eureka, bought property and speculated in land. On February 10, 1873, he was appointed postmaster of Eureka under President Grant. He was reappointed by President Rutherford B. Hayes on November 8, 1877 and by President C. A. Arthur on January 7, 1881 until February 5, 1885. During President Cleveland's administration he was replaced. However, in February of 1890, he was reappointed by President Harrison. Later, he moved to a McKinleyville ranch and was time-keeper at the Carson Woods at Crannell. He was a member of the G.A.R. Whipple Post, I.O.O.F., and the Masonic Fraternity. Frederick Axe died in Eureka on the twenty first of May 1915.

Zaidee Howard was one of six children born to Elias Harold Howard and Elvira Ann Wilburn. Elias Howard was born July 10, 1818 on a farm near Poughkeepsie, Dutchess County, New York. He was a graduate of the University of the City of New York. He entered the office of Attorney General Sidney S. Baxter at Richmond, Virginia as a law student and was admitted to the bar in Virginia in 1840. He also served as editor of the Richmond Herald there. In 1840, he married Elvira Wilburn, the daughter of Colonel R. Wilburn of Parisburg, Virginia, who was of French-Hugenot extraction. In 1844 he moved to Sheboygan, Wisconsin where he practiced law, and under President Polk he was postmaster until 1849. In that year he resigned and started to California. In December he entered into law practice with Stephen J. Field. On March 19, 1850 he joined Lt. Douglas Ottinger of the U.S. Revenue Service in an expedition up the coast under the auspices of the "Laura Virginia Association". As a result the entrance to Humboldt Bay was discovered and a settlement started. At a meeting on April 17, 1850, the bay was named and Mr. Howard was elected Alcalde of Humboldt County (including Trinity and Del Norte, at that time). He had military power to enforce the law, was in charge of a blockade during the Indian uprisings, was public administrator, appointed district attorney for a short time and later elected district attorney (1856-57), was superintendent of schools in 1858-59. In 1873 he moved from his ranch at Humboldt Point to Eureka. His children were: Gila (born at Ft. Yuma, Arizona on the trip west), Susan (Mrs. James H. Davis, wife of General Grant's army surgeon), Zaidee, Bertha (Mrs. Thomas Tomlinson), Thomas, Norman and Helen (Mrs. James Hart).

Zaidee Howard was born April 30, 1854 in Humboldt City (now extinct). She married Frederick Axe in Eureka on October 29, 1873. She died at the age of eighty-five in April 1940 at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J.E. Johnston of Arcata. She had a remarkable memory and recalled the Indian Wars in the region. She spent many nights at Ft. Humboldt when she and other members of the family were taken there for protection from Indian raids. She remembered General Grant when he was stationed at the fort. She was a member of Eastern Star, Ladies of the G.A.R., Methodist Church in Eureka and was active in these organizations for many years. Frederick and Zaidee were the parents of eight children.

I.

George Harold Axe was born in Eureka on August 29, 1874 by the family Bible, 29 September 1874 in the county records. He died on July 7, 1877.

II.

Frederick William Axe was born in Eureka June 9, 1876. He was married July 5, 1898 to Ella Warren. Ella was born November 1, 1872 at Boulder, Colorado and died July 19, 1961. Frederick was a mechanical engineer. For a short time he was a minister in Rohnerville. He died September 14, 1928. The family lived mostly in the Los Angeles area. They were parents of six children:

1. Fred Warren born November 6, 1899. In 1922 he married Charlotte Rastall who was born September 27, 1900. He is a retired Los Angeles school administrator and now lives in Orange, California. They were parents of six children:
 - a. Fred Warren, Jr. born July 24, 1929 who married Ruth Fraser. They were divorced and both remarried. He is a teacher and lives in Fresno. Their children are: Elizabeth Ruth born April 23, 1950 who married Daniel Yates in 1969; Fred Warren III born May 24, 1951, married Irene Lee in 1971; Cynthia Eileen born December 10, 1954; and Kenneth Walter born December 4, 1955. Fred's second marriage was to Rita, a teacher.
 - b. Charlotte Eleanor born May 9, 1924. She married Lt. David Perry Sherrell. They were divorced and he remarried. She is a high school counselor in San Diego. They had three children: David Neal born September 15, 1948 who married Barbara Underhill in 1970; Dana Christine born June 29, 1950; and Deborah Lynn born October 13, 1953.
 - c. Auralie Jean was born April 20, 1926 in San Diego. She married Walter Finch and they have three children: Caralie Jean born May 22, 1950; Glenn Michael born February 26, 1954 who married Melinda Solberg in 1971; and Mark Davin born March 11, 1955.
2. Harold Warren Axe was born April 29, 1902 and married Ruth Elizabeth Frey who was born September 22, 1903. He is a retired Los Angeles high school teacher and she is a teacher, historian and author. They live in Los Angeles. They have one son, Lincoln Sigmund born November 19, 1932.
3. Paul Warren Axe, born January 13, 1905, married Rosalie Middleton, born April 15, 1906. Paul is a retired Los Angeles City appraiser and realtor now living in the San Bernardino Mountains. Their two children are:
 - a. Lauralie Ann born February 27, 1931. She married Robert Lowell Burroughs who was born October 2, 1927. They had two children who died in infancy and the following four: Belinda Ann born February 25, 1956; Rebecca Jean born August 5, 1959; Catherine Ann born October 26, 1962; and Paul Arthur born June 28, 1966.
 - b. Paul Warren Jr. was born February 23, 1933. He is a M.D.-Ophthalmologist-surgeon in San Bernardino. He married first Elaine Barnes. They were divorced after having three children: Tracy Ellen born May 4, 1957; Troy Elaine born July 27, 1959; and Terri Ann born July 30, 1961. He married second Mary Snider, a registered nurse, born November 29, 1941. They have Beth Ann born August 3, 1967; and Brian Paul born January 15, 1969.
4. Lincoln Simpson Axe was born June 21, 1907 and died July 3, 1933. He was a teacher.
5. Dora Zaidee Axe was born October 12, 1909 in San Diego. She married Paul (Pablo) Gutierrez Gonzalez, a native of Mexico and now a citizen of the U.S., who is an X-Ray Technologist. She is a retired physician. They have no issue.
6. Philip Theodore (Warren Phillip, per birth certificate) Axe was born January 22, 1916 in Los Angeles. He was a student and died December 18, 1935.

III.

Erna Elvira Axe was born November 9, 1878 in Eureka. She attended high school in Eureka and also attended secretarial school. During President Wilson's administration she was private secretary to Senator Humphrey in Washington. She later worked in San Francisco where she died in August of 1951. She was unmarried.

IV.

Arthur Hadley Axe was born in Eureka January 15, 1880. On December 31, 1908 he married Hattie Helena "Lena" Welch who was born March 23, 1880. After their marriage they moved to Korbelt where he was a machinist with Northern Redwood Lumber Company for twenty-four years. Upon returning to Eureka Mr. Axe operated a service station for a number of years. He died November 17, 1954 at the age of seventy-four years. Mrs. Axe still resides in Eureka. They were parents of four children.

1. Ariel, born in 1909, married Ralph Balleaux of El Paso, Texas. They live in Washington where Mr. Balleaux is a successful radio man.
2. Kenneth, who is unmarried, was associated with his father in business and is now a garage maintenance man.
3. Barbara, a twin, was born in 1913. She married first Mr. Cooper and had a son, Robert Cooper. Her second marriage was to Ed. Holdner of San Francisco.
4. Blain, Barbara's twin, and his wife, Marie, live in Santa Clara where he is a telephone man.

V.

Bertha Ann Axe was born February 15, 1883 in Eureka. On September 24, 1905 she was married by Rev. C.P. Hessel in McKinleyville to John Edward Johnston. Mr. Johnston was born December 10, 1865. His parents were Richard Johnston, born April 18, 1822 in Enniskillen, County Fermanagh, Ireland, and Mary Lancaster of Lancashire, England. These two met on a ship sailing from Sydney, Australia, where Richard and his family had migrated in 1841. They married in San Francisco on July 3, 1850. Richard was next to the youngest of their seven children. The elder Johnston ran a store in San Francisco, a trading post and bar in Weaverville, and a ranch on Bear River. John Edward followed creamery work most of his life and worked in cheese factories in Orick and McKinleyville. After marriage John and Bertha lived in Eureka and later at Arlynda Corners, Loleta and Arcata. Mr. Johnston died in Arcata July 12, 1937. Bertha died September 29, 1958. Their four children are:

The exercises consisted of a prayer by Rev. A. Gould, a short address by Rev. J. W. Hines, well known in the county, and inaugural address by the Principal Mr. J. H. Goodale. We dare not attempt a synopsis of Mr. Goodale's remarks, believing that the force and beauty of the address would be marred by adding to or taking from it. The music consisted of a choice selection of pieces by Miss Jenny L. Tracy, who presided at the piano.

The Academy was built entirely by subscription, and is an ornament to our town, and reflects credit upon the Trustees, through whose exertions it has been put in operation.

Miss Tracy will assist Mr. Goodale in the management of the school--her department being that of teacher of vocal and instrumental music. Other teachers, we learn, will be added when occasion requires.

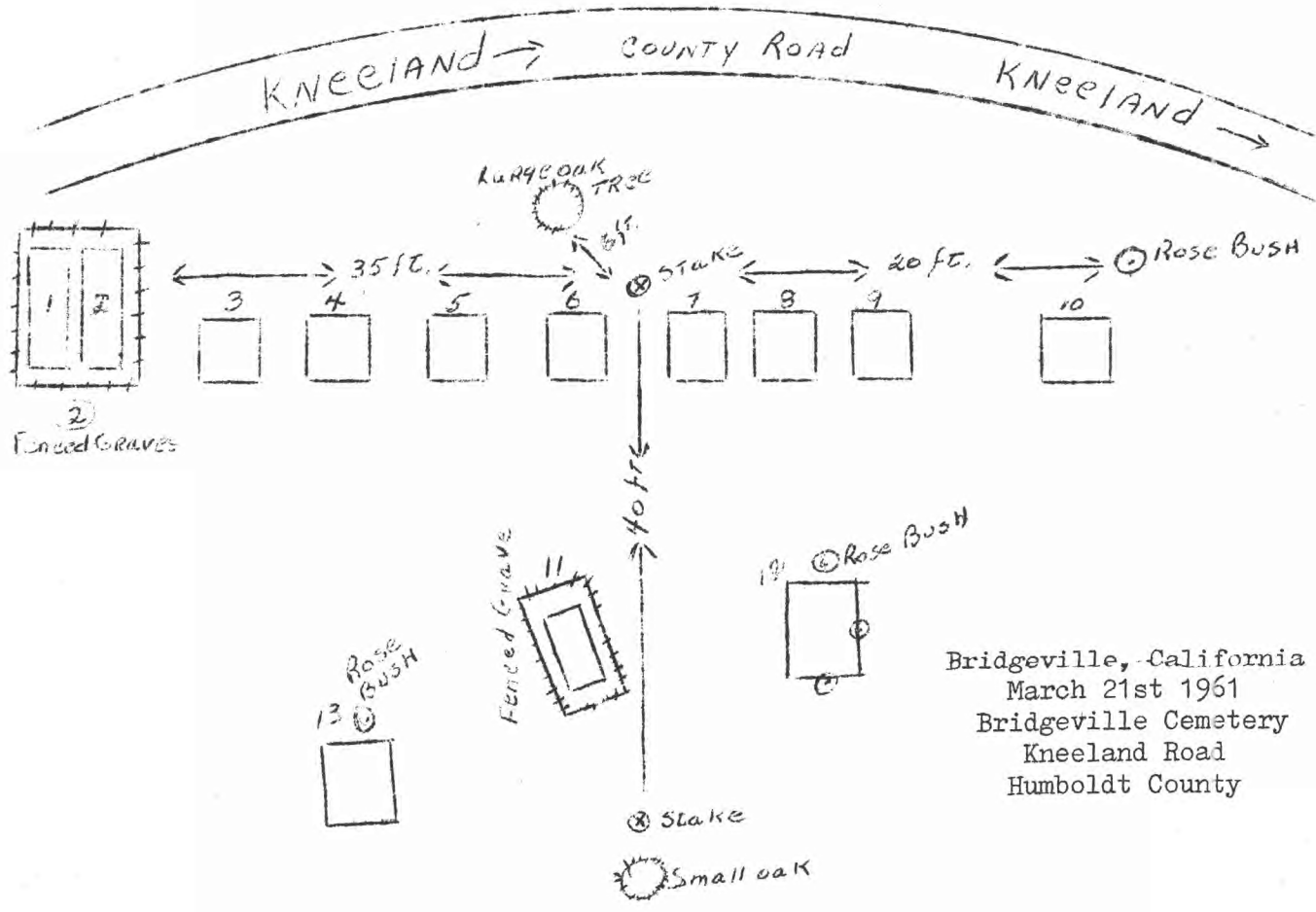
