Dear Sir:

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, 8.13349, it appears that Caleb Hendee, while residing in Ashford, Windham County, Connecticut, enlisted in December, 1776, in General Washington's Life Guard, was attached to Captain George Lewis' Company and served in Colonels Baylor's and Elisha Sheldon's Regiment of Continental Dragoons. He was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Monmouth and served three years.

In the spring of 1781, he enlisted in Captain James Dana's Company in Major Shipman's Connecticut Regiment, and on August 19, 1781, was appointed Ensign and served until the spring of 1782, when he was discharged at Stanford.

He was allowed pension on an application executed April 7, 1818, while a resident of Ashford, Connecticut, aged sixty-one years. He died November 17, 1839.

In 1820, his wife was fifty-nine years and a son, nineteen years pld, their names are not stated and there are no other data as to his family.



No. 13,349 that Caleb Hendee a resident of Ashford, Windham County, Connecticut, enlisted in December 1776 into General Washington's Life Guard, was attached to Captain George Lewis' Company and served under Colonels Baylor and Elisha Sheldon in the Continental Dragoons. He was in the battles of Brandswine, Germantown, and Monmouth and served 3 years.

In the sprang of 1781 he enlisted in Captain James Dana's Company in Major Shipman's Connecticut Regiment, and on August 19, 1781, was appointed Ensign and served until the spring of 1782, when he was discharged at Stamford.
