Monroe County ss: - Timothy B. Corning being duly sworn on the part of the petitioners says that he knew William Hinde in his Lifetime and has had the Custody of the paper purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of William Hinde bearing date the 25th Day of March 1852 The Witness received the will from Mrs. Wryer the widow of Dr. Cyrus Wryer Late of Webster - The Witness received it from her on the 12 day of April 1852, and on the same day filed it in the Surrogate's Office - The paper here produced is the same paper - Dr. Cyrus Wryer died a week or two after the Testator William Hinde's death - The Witness retained the Custody of the will until he delivered it to the Surrogate -
