22. Josiah<sup>3</sup> (Exercise, Roger), bapt. 4 July, 1680, at Beverly; removed to Connecticut with his father; lived in Windham, afterwards Mansfield. He was admitted an inhabitant of Windham, 12 Dec., 1701; bought land in Memeaguague, a tract south-east of Windham, but afterwards included in it, 27 Jan., 1702. In 1710 he purchased 96 acres of land of his brother, Caleb, in Windham.

In 1720 he united with the church of Mansfield, and in 1730 was chosen deacon.

In 1722 he was one of a committee appointed by the legislature "to view the proper lines for Voluntown." The committee met Sep. 17, 1722, at the house of John Amos, in Preston.
